[7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7) vs. [19] Emma Navarro (USA #17)

Navarro leads 3-0

Navarro won all three previous encounters, with all of those matches in the last nine months... Competing in her seventh Grand Slam, Navarro is into the first Grand Slam quarterfinal of her career (previously reached R16 at Roland Garros)... This is the 56th edition of Wimbledon in the Open Era; Navarro is the 38th different American to reach the Wimbledon QF in the Open Era... Navarro equaled her best grass court career result last month by reaching SF at Bad Homburg for a second consecutive year (I. eventual champion Shnaider)... Navarro achieved her first Tour level career title this season at Hobart (d. Mertens in F)... Navarro has won 33 Tour-level matches in 2024, more than twice as many as she won last year (16); she is one of six players to win more than 30 matches on tour so far this year... Navarro is 3-6 against players in the Top 10, most recently defeating No.2 Coco Gauff in previous round at Wimbledon... Navarro is looking to join Serena Williams and Venus Williams as the only Americans to reach the SF at 23 years or younger this century

Paolini is looking to become the first Italian woman to make Wimbledon SF... Paolini has now equaled the best result by an Italian woman at Wimbledon in the Open Era; she joins Camila Giorgi (2018), Francesca Schiavone (2009), Silvia Farina Elia (2003) and Laura Golarsa (1989) as Wimbledon quarterfinalists... Paolini is playing at a career-high No.7 after making maiden Grand Slam final at Roland Garros this season... Paolini had not won a Tour-level main draw match on grass before this year... Paolini made her first grass semifinal last week at Eastbourne (I. eventual champion Kasatkina)... Paolini had not made a Slam QF before this season and is through to her second straight Grand Slam QF appearance this year (Roland Garros – F)... With a win Paolini would have a chance of making her Top 5 debut (*depending on Collins result*); the last Italian ranked in the Top 5 was Sara Errani the weeks of August 23, 2013

[Q] Lulu Sun (NZL #123) vs. Donna Vekic (CRO #37)

First meeting

Sun is the first player from New Zealand in the Open Era (since 1968) to reach Wimbledon quarterfinal... Sun is the second woman from New Zealand to reach a Grand Slam quarterfinal in the Open Era, following Belinda Cordwell who made the 1989 Australian Open semifinals... Sun is into just the second tour-level quarterfinal of her career (her first came at 2022 Seoul) and is seeking her first tour-level semifinal... Sun holds a 1-3 career record against Top 50 players, with her first Top 50 win coming in this fortnight's first round over No.8 Zheng Qinwen... Sun is the seventh player in the last 40 years to reach the Wimbledon quarterfinals while ranked outside the Top 100... By reaching the quarterfinal as a qualifier, Sun will become the first player from New Zealand to be ranked in the PIF WTA Ranking Top 100 since Marina Erakovic (week of August 31, 2015), moving into at least the Top 60

Vekic is into her third Grand Slam quarterfinal (after 2019 US Open and 2023 Australian Open) and is seeking her first Grand Slam semifinal berth... Vekic is aiming to become the second woman representing Croatia to make the Wimbledon semifinals, following Mirjana Lucic in 1999... Vekic has won one grass-court title (2017 Nottingham) and reached four other grass-court finals in her career, including a runner-up showing recently at Bad Homburg... Vekic is 4-2 against players ranked outside the Top 100 so far this year... Vekic's best career result across all Grand Slams is QF at the 2019 US Open and 2023 Australian Open... Vekic has a grass court match record of 9-3 so far in 2024 including a run to the Bad Homburg final in the week prior to Wimbledon (I. Shnaider in F)... Vekic could reach her first Grand Slam semifinal in her 43rd Major main draw appearance: in the Open Era, only Barbora Zahlavova Strycova (53), Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (52), Elena Likhovtseva (46) and Roberta Vinci (44) made their first SF after more Major appearances

Sun becomes the first qualifier to advance to the QF stage at Wimbledon since 2010 (Kaia Kanepi). Sun is the seventh qualifier in the Open Era to reach Wimbledon QF. The best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon came in 1999 when Alexandra Stevenson advanced to SF.

At the 2021 US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.
