

Siniakova is the only former Wimbledon champion to reach the final this year, winning the title in 2018 (d. Melichar-Martinez/Pesche in final) and 2022 (d. Mertens/Zhang in final). She won both titles with Barbora Krejcikova who is competing in the singles final. This is her ninth appearance in doubles at Wimbledon

Siniakova is one of six players from Czech Republic to win the doubles title at Wimbledon in the Open Era

Before this season, Townsend had never made it past the 2r in doubles at Wimbledon; her current result with Siniakova is her career-best at the tournament. Townsend has reached two Grand Slam finals, 2022 US Open (w/McNally – I. Krejcikova/Siniakova) and 2023 Roland Garros (w/Fernandez – I. Hsieh/Wang in final). This is Townsend's fifth appearance in doubles at Wimbledon

Siniakova and Townsend teamed up for the first time in 2024 and played only two tournaments together prior to Wimbledon; 2024 Rome and 2024 Bad Homburg. At Rome they reached QF (I. Gauff/Routliffe) and in their only grass court tournament at Bad Homburg, they lost in the 1r (I. Nicholls/Parry)

Entering Wimbledon, Siniakova and Townsend both feature in the PIF Race to the WTA Finals rankings, but with different partners. Siniakova won the doubles title at 2024 Dubai with Storm Hunter and 2024 Roland Garros with Coco Gauff, while Townsend won 2024 Adelaide with partner Beatriz Haddad Maia. If the either player were to make the WTA Finals, it would be Siniakova's sixth appearance (2018, 2019, 2021-2023) and Townsend's WTA Finals debut

Siniakova has also been victorious in doubles at every Grand Slam, winning Australian Open (2022, 2023), Roland Garros (2018, 2021 and 2024), and US Open (2022)

Siniakova won each of her Grand Slam titles with Krejcikova except her most recent title at Roland Garros, which she won with Coco Gauff. Siniakova also has an Olympic gold medal in doubles (2020 Tokyo – w/ Krejcikova)

Siniakova reached a career high ranking of No.27 in singles on June 24, 2024

Townsend reached a career high singles ranking of No.57 on April 8, 2024; she is currently ranked No.79



In her 11th Wimbledon, Dabrowski is through to her second Wimbledon final after achieving Runner-Up with Xu Yifan in 2019. The result was the best by a Canadian player in Ladies' Doubles at Wimbledon

In her 5th Wimbledon, this is Routliffe's first doubles final at Wimbledon and also the best result by a player from New Zealand in the Open Era

By reaching the 2024 Wimbledon final Erin Routliffe will climb to the top of the PIF WTA Rankings in doubles for the first time in her career, overtaking Elise Mertens. She will be the first woman from New Zealand to hold the top spot

Dabrowski and Routliffe first joined forces at Montreal in 2023, in the same season lifting titles at the US Open and Zhengzhou, further reaching the final at Guadalajara, and securing their spot at the WTA Finals Cancun where they made the semifinals

Opened this year at Adelaide with a fall in the 1r, followed up their season opener with a SF run at the Australian Open (I. L.Kichenok/Ostapenko)

In the lead up to Wimbledon, the pair lifted the Nottingham title, defeating Harriet Dart and Diane Parry in the final, and also made R-Up at Eastbourne, falling to L.Kichenok/Ostapenko

Entering Wimbledon, Routliffe and Dabrowski are ranked No.6 the 2024 PIF Race to the WTA Finals; having made one appearance at the finals together (2023), Dabrowski would be making her sixth appearance (2017, 2018, 2019, 2022 and 2023) and Routliffe her second, having debuted as the first player from New Zealand to compete at the finals in 2023

Overall, Dabrowski's Grand Slam doubles career highlights include winning US Open in 2023 (w/ Routliffe), a R-Up showing at Wimbledon in 2019 (w/ Xu Yifan), three SF's (Wimbledon in 2018, US Open on 2021 and Australian Open in 2024) and further seven QF runs (Australian Open in 2018, 2020; Roland Garros in 2019 and US Open in 2017, 2019, 2020 and 2022); she's making her 40th doubles Grand Slam appearance

Additionally, Dabrowski has lifted two Grand Slam titles in mixed doubles at Australian Open in 2018 and Roland Garros in 2017; in the same category she has further achieved R-Up at Roland Garros (2018 and 2019) and three SF showings (Australian Open in 2020; and Roland Garros in 2022 and 2023) and made another 10 QFs

Meanwhile, Routliffe has lifted a Grand Slam title once with Dabrowski at US Open in 2023 and made a further SF at Australian Open in 2024 (W/ Dabrowski) and QF at Wimbledon in 2022 (w/ Olmos); she is making her 15th Grand Slam doubles appearance
