2024 WIMBLEDON

This is the 137th Wimbledon Championships. The event was first held in 1877, with the first women's singles championship being staged in 1884. This is the 130th staging of the Wimbledon women's singles championship and the 56th of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Due to the pandemic, the tournament was not held in 2020.

WTA WORLD NO.1

For the tenth major in a row, **Iga Swiatek** enters as WTA World No.1. Swiatek attained the ranking on April 4, 2022, following the retirement of Ashleigh Barty and held the top spot for 75 consecutive weeks. Swiatek's first stay atop the rankings came to an end after the 2023 US Open when Aryna Sabalenka took over the No.1 spot after reaching the final. Swiatek regained the World No.1 ranking on the final day of the 2023 season by winning the title match at the WTA Finals. This fortnight at Wimbledon will mark Swiatek's 111th (week of July 1) and 112th (week of July 8) weeks at No.1 and she will extend her stay at No.1 after Wimbledon, regardless of any results:

GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS (ACTIVE PLAYERS)

The 2023 season welcomed three new Grand Slam champions: **Aryna Sabalenka** won her maiden Grand Slam singles title at the Australian Open, **Marketa Vondrousova** triumphed here at Wimbledon and **Coco Gauff** lifted the US Open crown. This year though we are still waiting, with **Sabalenka** and **Iga Swiatek** defending their titles at the Australian Open and Roland-Garros respectively.

There are 19 active Grand Slam champions. Among those in this year's draw at Wimbledon, three players have lifted the trophy previously at SW19: **Angelique Kerber** (2018), **Elena Rybakina** (2022) and **Marketa Vondrousova** (2023)

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with 6 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Wimbledon draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (20-1 in 1r, 95.24%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 21 Grand Slam main-draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). Swiatek is 4-0 in first round matches at Wimbledon
- **Qinwen Zheng (9-1 in 1r, 90%):** Zheng's only first round loss came at 2023 Wimbledon (I. Siniakova)
- **Madison Keys (38-5 in 1r, 88.37%):** Has won eight-straight opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). Keys owns a 9-0 record in opening round matches at Wimbledon
- **Emma Raducanu (7-1 in 1r, 87.5%):** Raducanu is 2-0 in Wimbledon first round match-ups and 7-1 overall. Her only loss came at 2022 US Open (I. Cornet)
- **Caroline Wozniacki (46-7 in 1r, 86.8%):** The former World No.1 is 11-2 in first round matches at Wimbledon with her losses coming in 2016 and 2012. She has won her last five R128 matches across all Slams with her last loss coming at 2019 Roland Garros
- **Elise Mertens (25-4 in 1r, 86.2%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu)
- **Elena Svitolina (35-6 in 1r, 85.4%):** Svitolina has won 31 of her last 32 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria)
- **Coco Gauff (16-3 in 1r, 84.2%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova), 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Kenin)
- **Elena Rybakina (16-3 in 1r, 84.2%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel)
- **Victoria Azarenka (53-11 in 1r, 82.8%):** Four of her 11 first-round exits came in her opening six major appearances. Azarenka is 14-1 in opening round at Wimbledon, sole loss coming on Wimbledon main draw debut in 2006
- **Worth Noting:** Naomi Osaka 20-5 (80.0%), Aryna Sabalenka 20-5 (80.0%), Bianca Andreescu 12-3 (80.0%)

The All England Club has awarded 8 singles wildcards this year: **Francesca Jones** (GBR), **Angelique Kerber** (GER), **Yuriko Miyazaki** (GBR), **Naomi Osaka** (JPN), **Emma Raducanu** (GBR), **Ajla Tomljanovic** (AUS), **Heather Watson** (GBR) and **Caroline Wozniacki** (DEN). The best result by a wildcard at a Grand Slam was achieved by Kim Clijsters, who won 2009 US Open title.

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & WIMBLEDON

In 2010, Estonian Kaia Kanepi became the sixth qualifier in the Open Era to reach Wimbledon QF. The best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon came in 1999 when Alexandra Stevenson advanced to SF. At the 2021 US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

WIMBLEDON MISCELLANY

- Five players have won the singles title after **saving match point**: Blanche Hillyard (1889), Suzanne Lenglen (1919), Helen Wills-Moody (1935), Venus Williams (2005) and Serena Williams (2009)
- Only 12 **nations** are represented on the Wimbledon women's singles roll of honor. British and American women have won 91 of the 122 championships to date. The other nations are Australia, Brazil, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Russia, Spain, Switzerland, Romania and Kazakhstan.
- In 2024, there are seven moms competing in the singles main draw at Wimbledon – Viktoria Azarenka, Angelique Kerber, Tatjana Maria, Naomi Osaka, Elina Svitolina, Taylor Townsend and Caroline Wozniacki.
- In 2004, Maria Sharapova became the **first woman not seeded in the Top 8** to win the Wimbledon singles title since seeding began in 1927. She has since been joined by Venus Williams (2005—No.14 and 2007—No.23), Marion Bartoli (2013—No.15), Garbiñe Muguruza (2017—No.14), Angelique Kerber (2018 – No.11), Elena Rybakina (2022 – No. 17) and Marketa Vondrousova (2024 – No.42)
- Just five players have won the Wimbledon women's singles title **after winning the Wimbledon girls' singles title** (Haydon-Jones, Susman, Hingis, Mauresmo and Barty). Former girls' singles winners in the 2024 Wimbledon field are: Caroline Wozniacki (2006), Jelena Ostapenko (2014), Anastasia Potapova (2016), Claire Liu (2017) and Iga Swiatek (2018).
- The player with the **most women's doubles titles** is Elizabeth Ryan, who won 12 between 1914 and 1934
- Serena Williams was the last player to **win both the singles and doubles titles** in the same year, in 2016
- Ann Jones (1969), Martina Navratilova (nine times), Petra Kvitova (twice), Angelique Kerber (2018) and Marketa Vondrousova (2023) are the only four **left-handers** to win the Wimbledon women's singles title in the Open Era

- Martina Navratilova has won the most Women's Singles titles at Wimbledon in the Open Era, winning the event on nine occasions. It is the most of any female player at a single Grand Slam event over that span.
- Four players in the Open Era have won the Women's Singles at Wimbledon on five or more occasions – Martina Navratilova (nine), Steffi Graf, Serena Williams (seven each) and Venus Williams (five).
- Martina Navratilova has appeared in (134) and won (120) the most Women's Singles matches at Wimbledon of any player in the Open Era. Navratilova's 120 wins are the most of any female or male player at a single Grand Slam event in the Open Era.
- Only three players in the Open Era have appeared in 20+ Women's Singles main draws at Wimbledon – Venus Williams (24), Martina Navratilova (23) and Serena Williams (21).
- Six players in the Open Era have won the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon without dropping a set – Chris Evert (1981), Lindsay Davenport (1999), Venus Williams (2008), Marion Bartoli (2013) and the two to achieve the feat multiple times, Serena Williams (2002, 10) and Martina Navratilova (1983-84, 86, 90)
- Having achieved the feat at Wimbledon, Martina Navratilova is the only player in the Open Era to win a single Grand Slam event without dropping a set on four separate occasions.
- Reigning champion Marketa Vondrousova is the only unseeded player to win the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon in the Open Era.
- Marketa Vondrousova (2023, #42) is the lowest-ranked winner of the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon in the past four decades. Vondrousova is one of only two players ranked outside the WTA's top 25 to win the event over that span, along with Venus Williams (2007, #31).
- Ann Jones (1969) and Virginia Wade (1977) are the only two players from Great Britain to reach the Women's Singles final at Wimbledon, with both going on to win the event in respective years.
- Dropping just 25 games, Martina Navratilova (1983) has conceded the fewest games en route to winning the Women's Singles at Wimbledon in the Open Era.
- Conchita Martinez (1994) conceded the most games en route winning the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon in the Open Era, conceding 69 games in total.
- Only three players have claimed 50+ Grand Slam matches since the start of the 2020 season – Iga Swiatek (72), Aryna Sabalenka (62) and Ons Jabeur (51).
- Iga Swiatek, Elena Rybakina or Danielle Collins could become only third player since 2020 to win a WTA level title on grass, clay and hard court in a calendar year, after Ashleigh Barty (2021) and Caroline Garcia (2022).
- Since 2000, Aryna Sabalenka could become the third player to win the Australian Open and Wimbledon in the same calendar year after Serena Williams (2003, 09-10, 15) and Amelie Mauresmo (2006).
- Iga Swiatek could become the youngest player since Serena Williams (2002) to win Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same season.
- Iga Swiatek could become the first player to win consecutive Women's Singles titles at Grand Slam events since Serena Williams - Roland Garros, Wimbledon 2015.

- Swiatek continues her reign atop the WTA Rankings. The week of July 1 and July 8 (during Wimbledon) will be her 110th and 111th week atop the WTA Rankings. She is one of six players to hold the No.1 ranking for 100+ weeks.
- Six times this year the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met head-to-head in a tournament final (Auckland, Brisbane, Hobart, Linz, Madrid, Rome). The last time the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met six or more times in tournament finals in a season was 2013 (9 times).
- Q.Zheng made her Top 10 debut after the Australian Open becoming the first Chinese woman to crack the Top 10 since Li Na (February 1, 2010) while Paolini made her Top 10 debut after making her run to the Roland Garros finals, the fifth Italian to reach the Top 10.
- Five players made their Top 100 debut in 2024: Renata Zarazua (Jan 8), Maria Timofeeva (Jan 29), Brenda Fruhvirtova (Jan 29), Arina Rodionova (Feb 5), Erika Andreeva (Feb 19), Maria Lourdes Carle (Mar 4) and Hailey Baptiste (Mar 18), Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (Apr 15), Julia Riera (Apr 22), Moyuka Uchijima (May 20) and Rebeca Sramkova (May 20).
- (Not including United Cup) Swiatek and Rybakina have reached a Tour-leading five singles finals in 2024, followed by Sabalenka (4).
