Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #68) vs. Jacqueline Cristian (ROU #52)

First meeting

Vondrousova:

- Making 5th appearance at the tournament; her most recent and career-best showing is reaching the 2023 QF (l. then-World No.1 Swiatek)
- Contesting her 35th WTA 1000 main draw of career; her career-best WTA 1000 performance is reaching the SF at 2020 Rome
- Holds 5-1 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- One of her 3 career WTA singles titles has come on hard court (2017 Biel)

Cristian:

- Making Cincinnati tournament debut
- Contesting her 12th career WTA 1000 main draw; made 3r at the most recent WTA 1000 event in Montreal (l. Rybakina)
- Career-best tour-level performance on hard court was her runner-up finish at 2021 Linz (l. Riske)
- In June, made Top 50 debut and reached career-high ranking of No.49

[WC] Venus Williams (USA #643) vs. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #51)

First meeting

Williams:

- Making 11th appearance at Cincinnati; her career-best showing at the event is reaching the 2012 SF (l. eventual champion Li Na)
- Following a 16-month hiatus from tour, Williams is playing the 2nd event of her return; she reached the Washington 2r last month (d. Stearns, l. Frech)
- With her Washington 1r win, 45-year-old Williams became the oldest player to win a tour-level singles match since 47-year-old Martina Navratilova at 2004 Wimbledon
- Spent 11 weeks ranked World No.1 in singles during her career

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 2nd appearance at Cincinnati; she reached 2r last year as a lucky loser (l. Svitolina)
- Contesting her 9th career WTA 1000 main draw; she reached her first career WTA 1000 QF at the previous event in Montreal (l. Mboko)
- Bouzas Maneiro is 8-1 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (in tour-level matches)
- Only player from Spain in the main draw; the most recent Spanish woman to win the Cincinnati title is Garbiñe Muguruza in 2017

Peyton Stearns (USA #37) vs. Yafan Wang (CHN #145)

Stearns leads 1-0

Stearns:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Cincinnati, where she previously played 1r as a wild card in both 2023 (l. Kastakina) and 2024 (l. Badosa)
- Looking for her first win on hard court since Miami after falling at Washington DC (l. V. Williams) and Montreal (l. Raducanu)
- Owns 3-0 career record against players from China, with record in 2025 standing at 1-0 (d. Q. Zheng at Dubai for her first career Top 10 win; also defeated No.6 Keys this season at Rome)
- One of 22 players from United States of America to feature in the main draw

Wang:

- Making 3rd appearance at Cincinnati, entering the main draw through qualification on both previous occasions: in 2019 (l. Ka. Pliskova in 2r), in 2024 (l. Svitolina in 1r)
- Playing in only her third tournament of the season (through injury) after Brisbane & Australian Open
- Owns 17 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.20 Azarenka at US Open 2024
- One of three players from China in the main draw along with Lin Zhu and Xinyu Wang
- Best result by China at Cincinnati was Li Na who claimed the title in 2012

Sorana Cirstea (ROU #138) vs. Donna Vekic (CRO #53)

Cirstea leads 4-2

Cirstea:

- Making 8th appearance at Cincinnati; her best showing was 3r on four occasions (2009, 2012, 2022, 2023)
- Owns one career hard court title; 2008 Tashkent (d. Lisicki in F)
- Is currently ranked No.138; this time last year was ranked No.37; reached career-high ranking of No.21 (August 2013)
- Won the most recent meeting against Vekic in 3r at WTA 1000 Dubai last season where she went on to post her best result of 2024 with semifinal

Vekic:

- Making 7th appearance Cincinnati where her best result is 4r which she has reached twice; 2023 (l. Jabeur) and 2019 (l. V. Williams)
- Vekic is 1-6 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 with her only win against No.112 Dart at Australian Open
- Three of her 4 career titles have come on hard court: Monterrey in 2023 (d. No.1 seed Garcia in F); Courmayeur in 2021 (d. Tauson in F); Kuala Lumpur in 2014 (d. Cibulkova in F)
- Is currently ranked No.53; this time last year was ranked No.21; reached career-high ranking of No.17 in January this year
- Appearing in her first match since reaching 2r at Wimbledon (l. Bucsa)

Ngounoue:

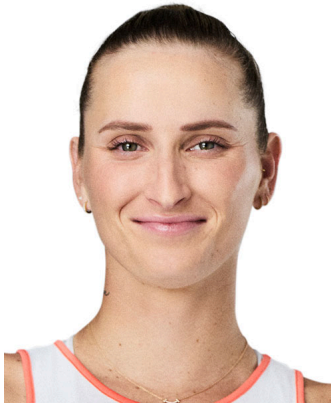
- Making debut appearance at Cincinnati, as a qualifier

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 reached QF at Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek); further highlights included semifinal at Stuttgart and quarterfinals at Strasbourg and Dubai. Ended her season after Wimbledon through shoulder injury
- Following injury issues in second half of 2022, bounced back in 2023 for best-ever season, winning debut Slam title at Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F - becoming the first unseeded player in the open era to claim the Wimbledon title), making Top 10 debut and qualifying for first WTA Finals.
- Best result of 2022 season was SF run at Dubai (withdrew prior to match vs. w/right adductor injury). Missed most of second half of the season due to left wrist injury, returning in October to play a few ITF Circuit events and Billie Jean King Cup Finals
- Finished 2021 with SF runs at Luxembourg, Chicago [500] and Moscow
- Won silver medal in singles at Olympics in Tokyo (l. Bencic)
- Opened 2021 campaign with SF at Yarra Valley Classic before R16 showing at Australian Open
- Highlights of 2020 include defeating No.6 Svitolina to reach SFs at Rome (l. Ka.Pliskova) as well as a QF run to kick off the season at Adelaide (l. No.1 Barty)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2019, reaching three finals across the year and posting career-high ranking of No.14 on July 1, 2019
- Finished R-Up at Budapest (l. Van Uytvanck) and Istanbul (l. Martic) before reaching championship match at Roland Garros (l. Barty); did not drop a set en route to final in Paris
- Ranked No.38, was joint-third lowest-ranked woman to reach Roland Garros final, and aged 19, was first teenager to reach title match there since Ivanovic in 2007
- Posted first win of career over a Top 2 player in 2019, defeating No.2 Halep at Indian Wells and then Rome
- Forced to end 2019 season down early due to left wrist injury - did not play again following 1r exit at Wimbledon
- In doubles, has reached SF at 2019 Australian Open (w/Strycova) and QF at 2017 Wimbledon (w/Bellis)
- At 2018 US Open, became the first teenager to reach the last 16 at Flushing Meadows since 2016 (Konjuh, QF - 18) and the youngest Czech player to advance to this stage in New York since 2005 (Vaidisova, R16 - 16)
- A strong 2024 season began with semifinal at Cluj-Napoca followed by a further three quarterfinals at Charleston, Palermo and Iasi taking her ranking to a career high of No.57 in July
- In 2023 reached semifinal at Prague (l. Hibino) and also WTA 125 semifinals at Bucharest and Rouen.
- Suffered knee injury in 2r match at Doha 2022 against Kasatkina and took the next six months off.
- Ended 2021 campaign in fine form, reaching SF at Nur-Sultan (l. eventual champion Van Uytvanck), QF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Halep) before finishing R-Up at Linz (l. Riske)
- Broke into Top 100 on November 8, 2021
- Advanced to maiden WTA QF at 2021 St. Petersburg (l. Kuznetsova)
- Season highlight in 2020 was 2r run at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Kenin)
- Made debut for Romania in Billie Jean King Cup in 2020, winning singles rubber against Kudermetova during 3-2 qualifying defeat to Russia
- In 2019, posted 2r showing at Bucharest (l. Rybakina), also fell 1r at Nanchang (as qualifier, l. Golubic)
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bucharest (d. Kozlova. l. eventual champion Begu)
- In 2016, compiled a 46-18 win-loss record, lifting five titles on ITF Circuit and rising 400 places in rankings
- Contested maiden WTA qualifying at 2015 Bucharest
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Europe in 2012

- Was the biggest ranking mover on tour in 2017, moving from No.376 to No.67 (309 places)
- Made WTA breakthrough by winning International-level title at 2017 Biel/Bienne (d. Kontaveit in F), in just her second WTA main draw. At No.233, was the lowest-ranked title winner in 2017 and aged 17 years, 293 days was the youngest since Konjuh (17 years, 169 days) at 2015 Nottingham
- Advanced to 2r on tour-level debut at 2016 Prague - as wildcard
- Made professional debut at 2014 \$100k ITF/Prague-CZE (d. Suk, l. Brengle in 2r); on ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles and four doubles titles
- In juniors won doubles at Australian Open and Roland Garros in 2015 (both w/Kolodziejova). In singles, was semifinalist at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon and rose to No.1 on ITF junior rankings in 2015

- Coached by Jan Hernych
- Lives and trains in Prague; moved to the city on her own to train at 15 years old
- Began playing tennis at 4 years old with her father, David Vondrouš, and by 10-years-old she was practicing in Prague. Mother, Jindriska Anderlova played volleyball in the top Czech league
- Married partner Stepan Simek in the summer of 2022
- Favorite surface is clay because she grew up on it, but believes her game is more suited for hard courts
- Chose tennis over soccer because she prefers the individual nature of the sport
- Tennis idol is Roger Federer
- Has a Sphinx cat named Frankie
- Describes herself as "quiet" and "calm"

- Favorite surface is clay
- Started playing tennis aged five

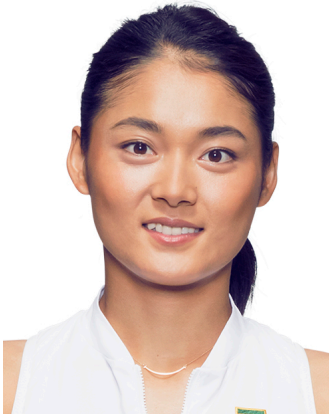
