**Sonay Kartal (GBR #48) vs. Caroline Garcia (FRA #200)**

**First meeting**

### ***Kartal:***

- Making Cincinnati tournament debut
- Playing her first event since reaching her first Grand Slam R16 at 2025 Wimbledon
- Best career Tour-level result on hard court is her title run at 2024 Monastir
- Contesting just the 4th WTA 1000 main draw of her career; her career-best WTA 1000 showing was R16 at 2025 Indian Wells as a lucky loser (l. No.1 Sabalenka)

### ***Garcia:***

- Making 10th main draw appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the 2022 title as a qualifier ranked No.35 (d. Kvitova in final)
- Contesting her 90th career WTA 1000 main draw; she has won three WTA 1000 titles (2017 Wuhan, 2017 Beijing and 2022 Cincinnati)
- Five of her 11 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently the 2022 WTA Finals (d. Sabalenka in final)
- Playing her first singles match since 2025 Roland Garros 1r in May

**Alycia Parks (USA #71) vs. Barbora Krejčíková (CZE #80)**

**Krejčíková leads 1-0**

### ***Parks:***

- Making tournament main draw debut
- Only career title came on hard court at Lyon 2023 (d. No.1 seed Garcia in F)
- Is currently ranked No.71; this time last year was ranked No.102; holds a career high ranking of No.40 (August 2023)
- Has 9-7 record in 1r WTA 1000 matches; has reached 2r in five of seven appearances in 2025

### ***Krejčíková:***

- Making 4th appearance at Cincinnati posting her best result in 2021 with QF (l. No.1 Barty)
- Yet to win a WTA 1000 match in 2025; has only played six tournaments due to returning from injury
- Has won nine of last 11 matches against players from United States of America
- Has won five hard court titles: San Diego 2023, Dubai 2023, Ostrava 2022, Tallinn 2022, Prague 2021
- Her career high ranking of No.2 was achieved in February 2022

**Danielle Collins (USA #57) vs. [WC] Taylor Townsend (USA #125)**

**Townsend leads 2-1**

***Collins:***

- Making 5th appearance at Cincinnati; has one win from five at this event (reached 2r in 2023)
- Has won 5 of last 6 matches against wild cards, losing only to Jabeur at Adelaide 2025
- Has won last nine WTA 1000 1r matches, last losing at Guadalajara 2023 to lucky loser Vickery
- Is undefeated against players ranked outside the Top 100 so far this season (8-0)
- Three of her 4 career titles have come on hard courts: Miami 2024, Charleston 2024 and San Jose 2021
- One of 22 players from United States of America to feature in the main draw

***Townsend:***

- This is her fifth Cincinnati main draw where her most recent was also her best result with 3r last season (l. eventual R-Up Pegula)
- Her career best result on hard court is QF which she has reached twice: Washington DC 2025 (l. eventual champion Fernandez) and Toronto 2024 (l. Navarro)
- Best result by a wild card at Cincinnati was by Maria Sharapova who won the title in 2011
- Recently climbed to the No.1 ranking in doubles for the first time in her career

**[Q] Kamilla Rakhimova (#67) vs. Maria Sakkari (GRE #65)**

**Sakkari leads 1-0**

***Rakhimova:***

- Making 1st main draw appearance at Cincinnati, after qualifying for main draw with wins over Jodie Burrage and Rebecca Marino
- Owns 0-1 career record against players from Greece (Rakhimova lost to Sakkari in only previous meeting, at 2020 Roland Garros)
- During this year's North American summer hard court swing, she also qualified for Washington DC (l. 1r to eventual R-Up Kalinskaya) and Montreal (l. 2r to Svitolina)
- Contesting her 8th career WTA 1000 main draw

***Sakkari:***

- Making 7th main draw appearance at this tournament; she reached consecutive QFs here in 2019 and 2020
- Contesting her 57th career WTA 1000 main draw; she has won one WTA 1000 title (2023 Guadalajara) and made three additional WTA 1000 finals
- During this year's North American summer hard court swing so far, made Washington QF (l. Raducanu) and Montreal 2r (l. Pegula)
- One of her two titles has come on hard court (2023 Guadalajara)

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakthrough year in 2024 saw her win first title at Monastir and reach 3r at Wimbledon as a qualifier. Her ranking entered the Top 100 for the first time and peaked at No.85 by year-end.

In 2023 reached main draw at Nottingham as a qualifier

- Played first WTA main draw matches in 2022 on grass at Nottingham and Wimbledon
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2019 and won her first ITF titles in 2021 at W15 Antalya and W15 Monastir

- 2024 season highlight was making SF at Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Frech). Also reached QF at Miami (l. eventual champion Collins)
- Opened 2023 well with two R-Up performances on hard court at Lyon (l. Parks) and Monterrey (l. Vekic), as well as QFs at Adelaide and Doha. Went on to reach a further seven QFs throughout the season across all three surfaces, bringing a total of nine QFs (Stuttgart, Berlin, Eastbourne, Cleveland, San Diego, Tokyo and Beijing).

Her strongest WTA 1000 result of 2023 came with SF at Guadalajara (l. eventual winner Sakkari), and qualified for year ending Zhuhai Elite Trophy for a third time (also in 2016 & 2018), defeated by eventual champion Haddad Maia in group stage.

- Served highest number of aces of all players in 2023, with a total of 462 (nearest challenger was Rybakina with 455).
- Returned to form in second half of 2022, winning four tournaments, including a run through qualifying to Cincinnati title (d. Kvitova in F) and victory at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Only player to win titles on all three surfaces in 2022, having also triumphed on grass at Bad Homburg (d. Andreescu in F) and on clay at Warsaw (d. Bogdan in F). Summer form saw her return to Top 10 on September 12, following US Open SF
- Best win of her career came over No.1 Swiatek in QF at 2022 Warsaw
- At 2022 Roland-Garros, won first doubles title in almost six years (w/Mladenovic, d. Gauff/Pegula in F)
- Highlights in 2021 came on clay, with SF at Lausanne and QF at Parma
- Best results in 2020 were at Slams, reaching R16 at Roland-Garros (l. Svitolina) and 3r at US Open (l. Brady); defeated No.3 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Flushing Meadows to record her first Top-10 win since late 2018
- Highlights of 2019 campaign include capturing her seventh career WTA singles title at Nottingham (d. Vekic in F) and finishing R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Yastremska)
- Member of French Billie Jean King Cup team that won the 2019 competition final vs. Australia, teaming up with Mladenovic to win the decisive doubles runner against

- Barty/Stosur. Also took part in the team that advanced to final vs. Czech Republic in 2016
- Fell out of the Top 20 on March 18, 2019 after holding her position there since August 14, 2017
  - In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made SF at Stuttgart and Madrid
  - Broke into the Top 5 on August 13, 2018 and reached a career-high of No.4 on September 10, 2018
  - Became first player to win Wuhan and Beijing back-to-back in 2017. As a result, qualified for WTA Finals. Was ranked No.30 on the Race to Singapore leaderboard in May 2017
  - Made Top-10 debut on October 9, 2017, following completion of Wuhan-Beijing title double
  - Won a career-best 48 main draw matches in 2017 (48-22 record, two titles), including reaching maiden major QF at Roland-Garros (l. Ka.Pliskova)
  - Qualifying for WTA Finals in 2017, became the first Frenchwoman to compete at WTA Finals in singles since Mauresmo in 2006 (l. Henin in F)
  - At 2016 Roland Garros w/Mladenovic, won first major doubles title. They were the first French pair to win in Paris since 1971, when Gail Chanfreau and Francoise Durr triumphed
  - Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles and doubles
  - Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
  - Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007
  - In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and reached SF at the other three Slams

- Coached by Julie Hobbs and Ben Reeves
- Started playing tennis at the age of six at Pavillion & Avenue Tennis Club, where she still trains to this day
- Her first memory of tennis was when she was first brought on court to meet her current coach, Julie Hobbs, falling over and being too scared to come back. But after much persuasion, Hobbs managed to convince her to come back and the two have been inseparable ever since.
- Favourite Tournament: Wimbledon

- Tennis Idols: Kim Clijsters, Roger Federer, Andy Murray

- Recently worked with Bertrand Perret
