Sonay Kartal (GBR #81) vs. [26] Linda Noskova (CZE #27)

Noskova leads 1-0

Kartal:

- In her China Open debut, has reached her first career WTA 1000 quarterfinal; her previous career-best WTA 1000 showing was R16 at Indian Wells earlier this season (as lucky loser, I. Sabalenka)
- Victory over No.5 Mirra Andreeva in this event's R16 was her first career Top 10 win (previously 0-2 vs. Top 10 opponents)
- A win today would put her into the second Tour-level semifinal of her career, after claiming the 2024
 Monastir title
- Holds an 8-13 career record against Top 50 players, with three of those wins coming this fortnight
- Is the third British player to reach a WTA 1000 quarterfinal after Johanna Konta and Emma Raducanu, since the format introduction in 2009
- Made her Top 50 debut in June of this year, and peaked at No.44 in July
- Could become the second-lowest ranked woman to reach the China Open SF since the tournament's inception in 2004, ranked higher only than No.154 Lindsay Davenport in 2007

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching R32 in 2023 (gave walkover vs. Ostapenko)
- Competing in her seventh WTA quarterfinal of 2025, with a 3-3 record in those matches (she lost her most recent quarterfinal at Monterrey to eventual finalist Alexandrova)
- Seeking her first career WTA 1000 SF; she is contesting the second WTA 1000 QF of her career after Dubai 2025 (I. eventual finalist Tauson)
- In WTA 1000 events, holds a career record of 10-3 against opponents ranked outside the Top 50, last defeating No.59 Potapova in 4r here
- Has earned 31 Tour-level match-wins so far in 2025, the most she has managed in a single season
- Third-most total aces on tour this year (319), trailing only Rybakina (394) and Tauson (330)
- Aiming to become the third Czech woman to reach the China Open SF since the tournament's inception in 2004, after Petra Kvitova (2013, 2014 and 2017) and Karolina Muchova (2024)

Pegula leads 2-0

Navarro:

- First time 4 players from the United States of America have reached the Beijing quarterfinals (Navarro, Pegula, Anisimova, Gauff)
- Making her 2nd appearance at Beijing; in her previous showing in 2024, she lost to Zhang Shuai in her opening match (after 1r bye)
- Is through to her third career WTA 1000 quarterfinal after Toronto 2024 (SF) and Indian Wells 2024 (QF)
- Owns 6 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently beating No.2 Iga Swiatek in the previous round
- Became the second player to claim a 6-0 third set against Swiatek at WTA level, after Sabalenka at Roland Garros (SF) this year
- If Navarro gets a second straight Top 10 win by beating Pegula, this would be the first time she posts multiple Top 10 wins at a single event
- A win today would put her into her 11th career WTA SF, and second of 2025 after her title run in Merida

Pegula:

- Owns 2-0 record against Navarro, with wins coming in the 2025 Bad Homburg QF and Miami 2024 R16
- Making 4th appearance at Beijing; she is through to the quarterfinals for the first time after R16 losses in the last two years (I. Ostapenko in 2023; I. Badosa in 2024)
- Owns 3 WTA 1000 titles: Toronto 2024 (d. Anisimova in F), Montreal 2023 (d. Samsonova in F) and Guadalajara 2022 (d. Sakkari in F)
- Is through to her 20th career QF at WTA 1000-level; has become the fourth American to reach 20+ WTA 1000 quarterfinals along with Serena Williams (30), Venus Williams (21) and Coco Gauff (20)
- A win today would put her into her 12th career WTA 1000 SF, and second of 2025 after Miami (I. Sabalenka in F)
- Has won 3 singles titles in 2025, at Austin (hard court), Charleston (clay), and Bad Homburg (grass)
- Has won 45 tour-level matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.3 on tour for match-wins this year, behind only Iga Swiatek and Aryna Sabalenka

CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakthrough year in 2024 saw her win first title at Monastir and reach 3r at Wimbledon as a qualifier. Her ranking entered the Top 100 for the first time and peaked at No.85 by year-end.
 - In 2023 reached main draw at Nottingham as a qualifier
- Played first WTA main draw matches in 2022 on grass at Nottingham and Wimbledon
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2019 and won her first ITF titles in 2021 at W15 Antalya and W15 Monastir
- In 2024, achieved first Grand Slam singles quarterfinal at the Australian Open (l. Yastremska), where she also defeated then-World No.1 Iga Swiatek in the 3r; won her first singles title at Monterrey (d. Sun in F); reached SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Linette) and Brisbane (l. eventual champion Rybakina); earned a new career-high ranking of No.25 on August 26, 2024
- Breakthrough year in 2023, achieving runner-up twice; Adelaide 1 (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Prague (l. Hibino). Also reached quarterfinals at Lyon (l. Osorio) and 3r at Indian Wells (l. Gauff) and Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Gauff). Broke into Top 40 on October 9, 2023.
- Made Top-100 debut on August 1, 2022, following SF run at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova); overtook Gauff at the youngest player in Top 100
- Also reached 2r at Tallinn (as qualifier, l. Haddad Maia) and fell 1r at both Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Raducanu) and US Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova). On ITF Circuit, lifted fifth and sixth titles at this level, winning W60 tournament in Croissy-Beaubourg, France and W100 event in Versmold, Germany
- Finished 2021 campaign with 38-9 win-loss record, winning four ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 event in Prerov, Czech Republic
- · Made WTA qualifying debut at 2020 Prague
- On ITF Circuit, owns six titles in singles and one in doubles
- As a junior, won 2021 girls' singles at Roland Garros.

CAREER MILESTONES

- Voted 2024 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year Award, finished the year ranked No.8 with a singles record of 54-24, winning her first career title at 2024 Hobart; climbed to a year-end ranking at No.8 after finishing 2023 at No.38 (and No.143 in 2022)
- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay; Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng) and one semifinal on grass; Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova).
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tour-level, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Broke into Top 200 for the first time on March 7, 2022
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA division 1 women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- In 2021, reached 2r at both Charleston [500] and Charleston [250]
- Fell 1r at 2020 Monterrey (l. Stephens)
- Only other events in 2020 came on ITF Circuit, ending year ranked No.463
- Owns three ITF Circuit titles in singles and one in doubles
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter
- Also R-Up in girls' doubles at 2019 Australian Open w/Beck

- In 2024, won two singles titles Toronto (WTA 1000) and Berlin en route to year-end ranking of No.7, her third-straight year-end Top 10 finish; two-time runner-up at Cincinnati and US Open; joined Rosie Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013) as the only women in the Open Era to make the final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in the same season
- Also qualified for the 2024 WTA Finals (withdrew during round-robin play due to left knee injury)
- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun.
 - In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open.
- Achieved career-high No. 3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Fort Worth in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
