Kamilla Rakhimova (#89) vs. [2] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

First meeting

Rakhimova:

- Making 2nd main-draw appearance at Beijing; she reached 2r in 2024 as lucky loser (l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Earned her first career Top 10 win at 2025 Wimbledon by defeating No.5 Jasmine Paolini; Rakhimova had been 0-7 vs. Top 10 players before that result
- Best career tour-level results on hard court are QF runs at Jiujiang and Guadalajara 500 in 2024; Melbourne 250 #2 in 2022
- Winner of this match will face either No.25 seed Leylah Fernandez or Maria Sakkari in 3r

Gauff:

- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where she is defending champion (d. Muchova in last year's final)
- Also made Beijing SF in 2023 (l. eventual champion Swiatek); holds a 10-1 record in Beijing overall
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning the title at 2023 Cincinnati as well as here last year (d. Muchova in both finals)
- Best WTA 1000 results this season are reaching the finals at Madrid (l. Sabalenka) and Rome (l. Paolini)
- 8 of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard-court title is the 2024 WTA Finals
- Currently leads tour in percentage of return games won (45.9%) and return points won (48.8%)

[31] Wang Xinyu (CHN #33) vs. [WC] Zhang Shuai (CHN #112)

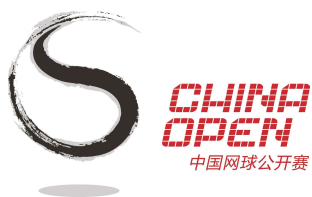
Wang leads 3-0

Wang:

- Making 4th appearance at Beijing, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2023 (l. Sakkari)
- Won all three previous encounters vs. Zhang, most recently at WTA 125 event in Parma 2025
- Best WTA 1000 result this season is reaching 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Her career-best WTA 1000 showing is reaching last year's Wuhan SF (l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Winner of this match will face either Katie Boulter or No.3 seed Amanda Anisimova in 3r

Zhang:

- Making her 14th main-draw appearance at Beijing; she has reached three QFs here in 2016, 2018 and last year (l. Badosa in 2024)
- At Beijing last year, as a wild card ranked No.595, her 1r win over Kessler ended a 24-match tour-level losing streak
- All of her 3 WTA singles titles have come on hard court: Lyon in 2022; Guangzhou in 2013 and 2017
- Her most recent Top 50 win came over No.47 McCartney Kessler at Australian Open 2025; Zhang has gone 0-5 vs. Top 50 players since then



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[8] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #10) vs. Caty McNally (USA #90)

McNally leads 1-0

Rybakina:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching SF in 2023 (l. Samsonova)
- Is 20-5 this year against players ranked outside the Top 50 at Grand Slam and WTA Tour events (most recently, lost to No.60 Vondrousova at 2025 US Open)
- She has won 2 WTA 1000 titles in her career, at 2023 Indian Wells and 2023 Rome
- Best WTA 1000 results this season are making SF runs on three occasions, falling to the eventual champion each time: Dubai (l. M. Andreeva), Montreal (l. Mboko), and Cincinnati (l. Swiatek)
- 4 of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2020 Hobart, 2023 Indian Wells, 2024 Brisbane, and 2024 Abu Dhabi)
- This year's ace leader on tour (378); also leads tour in percentage of service games won (81.7%)

McNally:

- Making her Beijing tournament debut this week; defeated Laura Siegemund in opening round
- Seeking her first Top 20 win of career (currently 0-9 vs. Top 20 players, including 0-6 vs. Top 10 players)
- Best WTA 1000 result this season is 3r run at Montreal (l. Keys)
- Career-best tour-level results on hard court are SF runs at Merida in 2023 and Washington DC in 2019
- Winner of today's match will face either Eva Lys or No.32 seed Iva Jovic in 3r

[6] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #8) vs. Anastasija Sevastova (LAT #221)

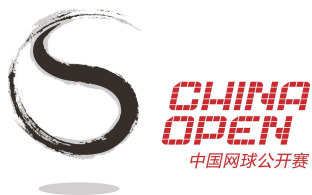
Paolini leads 3-0

Paolini:

- Appearing at Beijing for a third time, posting her best result in 2023 with R16 (l. Sabalenka)
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2024 Dubai and 2025 Rome
- Defeated Sevastova once already this year in 1r at Wimbledon; this is their first Tour-level main-draw meeting on hard court (Paolini advanced past Sevastova in Cincinnati qualifying in 2021)
- Since the start of 2024, Paolini is 15-1 vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 100 (the one loss was to Aoi Ito at 2025 Montreal)
- In the week prior to Beijing, Paolini successfully defended the Billie Jean King Cup title with Team Italy (defeated Team USA in finals)

Sevastova:

- This is her sixth Beijing appearance, where her best result was reaching the final in 2018 (l. Wozniacki); that run is also her career-best WTA 1000 performance
- Also reached QF here in 2010 as a qualifier (l. Li Na); this is her first year competing at Beijing since 2019
- This is her 5th WTA 1000 appearance of 2025 so far, with her best result at Montreal with R16 (l. Osaka)
- Seeking her second Top 10 win of the season, having beaten No.4 Pegula in Montreal 3r
- Her 2018 runner-up result at Beijing is her career-best showing on hard court; it is also the best result by a player from Latvia at China Open



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Katie Boulter (GBR #54) vs. [3] Amanda Anisimova (USA #4)

First meeting

Boulter:

- Making 4th appearance at Beijing, where her previous best results were reaching R32 in 2024 (l. eventual champion Gauff) and 2023 (l. Sabalenka)
- Owns 4 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.9 Paula Badosa at Wimbledon 2025
- 1 of her 3 career WTA singles titles has come on hard court (2024 San Diego)
- Best result by a British player at Beijing was runner-up finish by Johanna Konta in 2016

Anisimova:

- Making 3rd main-draw appearance at Beijing, where her best previous result was reaching 4r last year (l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Contesting her first match since her run to the 2025 US Open final (l. World No.1 Sabalenka); she has made consecutive Grand Slam finals this year, also finishing runner-up at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Swiatek)
- Won the first WTA 1000 title of her career earlier this year at Doha (d. Ostapenko in final)
- Currently playing at a career-high ranking of World No.4; this time last year was ranked No.43
- Has won 37 tour-level matches so far in 2025, with a record on hard court of 19-8

CAREER MILESTONES

- Strong 2024 saw her lift WTA 125 title at Guadalajara and breakthrough performances at Bogota and Rabat with semifinals; also made quarterfinals at WTA 500 Guadalajara and Jiujiang reaching a career high of No.61 in October
- Best results of 2023 were SF at Bogota (l. Stearns) and 3r at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka). Achieved R-Up at WTA 125 Stanford and SF at WTA 125 Tampico in singles and champion in doubles (w/Tikhonova).
- Opened 2022 season by reaching maiden WTA QF at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (as qualifier, l. Li). On clay, reached SF at Bogota (l. eventual champion Maria), while won two ITF Circuit hard-court titles in second half of season
- Broke into Top 100 for the first time on August 22, 2022, following title run at W60 ITF Circuit event at the Bronx
- Advanced to 3r at 2021 US Open (as qualifier, l. Krejčíková). Also made 2r at St. Petersburg, Belgrade and Lausanne
- Won two doubles title in 2021 at Phillip Island Trophy (w/Raina, d. Blinkova/Potapova in F) and Linz (w/Dzalamidze, d. Wang/Zheng)
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2020 Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Sakkari); 1r win over No.55 Rogers was both the best-by-ranking of her career and also first at Tour level
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2019 Jurmala (as WC, l. Marcinkėvica)
- Owns seven singles and six doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Kazakhstan in 2016
- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women's professional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Świątek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l.

- eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2022
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018); won 2018 Roland-Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and 2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (l. Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles finalist in tournament history at 13-years-old

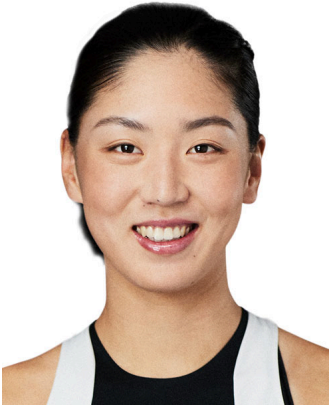

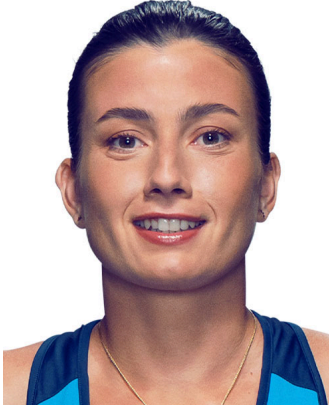

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2024 season saw Boulter rise to a career high ranking of No.23, achieved on Nov 4, 2024. Successfully defended title at Nottingham (d. Ka. Pliskova in F) and won San Diego (d. Kostyuk in F). Made SF at Tokyo (l. Kenin) and wrapped up the year with a final run at Hong Kong (l. champion Shnaider).
- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career on home soil at Nottingham; made Top 50 debut at No.50 the week of September 11; advanced to 3r at Wimbledon for second year in a row (l. Rybakina), and at US Open for first time (l. Stearns).
- Also in 2023, reached 2r as qualifier at both Montreal and Beijing; on ITF Circuit won one singles title at Canberra and reached two finals in Japan; went 2-0 in singles in November's Billie Jean King Cup play-offs against Sweden
- During the 2022 grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings

- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)
- Part of Great Britain Fed Cup Team, 2018-19
- Fell 1r on tour level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of six singles titles and four doubles titles
- In 2024 made first WTA 1000 final of career at Toronto, finishing R-Up to Pegula (defeated No.3 Sabalenka en route). Also enjoyed run to R16 at Australian Open, her third time reaching that stage in Melbourne
