[4] Mirra Andreeva (#5) vs. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP#48)

First meeting

M. Andreeva:

- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result and best was reaching QF in 2024 (I. Q.Zheng)
- Also made Beijing R16 as a qualifier in her tournament debut in 2023 (I. Rybakina)
- Is the only player to reach R32 on three occasions in women's singles at the China Open before turning 19
- Could equal (37) Venus Williams (38) for most wins before turning 19 at WTA 1000 events since the format introduction in 2009
- 2 of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, at 2025 Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in F) and 2025 Dubai (d. Tauson in F)
- With a win today and a Pegula loss, Andreeva would move ahead of Pegula and into the No.6 spot on the WTA Finals Leaderboard

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2024 (I. Stearns)
- Best WTA 1000 result this season was reaching QF stage at Montreal (I. eventual R-Up Mboko)
- Holds 2-5 record against Top 10 players, most recently No.9 Emma Navarro at Roland Garros 2025
- Could become the third Spaniard to defeat a Top 5 women's single's player at China Open after Lara Arruabarrena in 2015 and Paula Badosa in 2024
- Winner of today's match will face either Maya Joint or Sonay Kartal in 4r

[26] Linda Noskova (CZE#27) vs. [7] Qinwen Zheng (CHN#9)

Zheng leads 2-0

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2023 (I. Ostapenko)
- With a win, would reach fifth career R16 at WTA 1000 event and third of 2025 after Doha and Dubai
- Could claim 10th career WTA Top 10 win today, with her most recent coming against No.7 Mirra Andreeva at Bad Homburg 2025
- Last time 4 players from Czech Republic reached 3r at Beijing was 2011
- Owns 1 career WTA singles title at Monterrey in 2024
- Winner of today's match will face either Zeynep Sonmez or Anastasia Potapova in 4r

Zheng:

- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where her best result was making SF in 2024 (I. Muchova)
- Playing in her first tournament since Wimbledon 2025 after undergoing right elbow surgery
- Could reach a 14th R16 at a WTA 1000 and her fourth of 2025 after Indian Wells, Miami and Rome
- Has won 20 matches so far in 2025 and a hard-court record of 8-5
- Since the WTA Tour's return to China in 2023, Zheng (17) has claimed the most WTA-level match wins on Chinese soil with Gauff (14) next-best

- Made Top 20 debut on October 8, 2024 finishing the year at World No.16. Also won 2024 Paris Olympic silver medal in women s doubles with Diana Shnaider
- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13
 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF
 titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at
 Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia
 and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made
