SETTING THE STAGE FOR WTA FINALS LEADERBOARD UPDATES

Looking ahead to Tuesday's matches:

- If Coco Gauff wins her match today, reaching the quarterfinals THEN Gauff qualifies
- If Jasmine Paolini loses her R16 match against Bouzkova THEN BOTH Gauff and Madison Keys qualify

If Andreeva wins her next match and Pegula loses her next match, then Andreeva will move ahead of Pegula in the standings. Both Andreeva and Pegula have a chance to overtake Keys on the Leadeboard, but would need to reach the semifinals to do so.

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[15] Belinda Bencic (SUI #16) vs. [2] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

Gauff leads 3-2

Bencic:

- This is 6th appearance at Beijing and she has equaled her best previous result with R16 in 2019 (I. Kvitova)
- Owns two WTA 1000 titles Dubai 2019 (d. Kvitova in F) and Toronto 2015 (d. Halep in F)
- Has 35 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently No.7 Mirra Andreeva at Wimbledon 2025
- A win today would be fourth QF of the season after Abu Dhabi (won), Indian Wells (QF) and Wimbledon (SF)

Gauff:

- With a win today, would secure qualification to WTA Finals
- 1 of 5 Americans through to R16 in Beijing, the most in tournament history, topping the mark set last year (4)
- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where she is defending champion (d. Muchova in last year's final)
- Claimed her 150th Tour level win on hard court, becoming the youngest player since Caroline Wozniacki in 2011 to achieve this feat
- A win today would be her 7th singles quarterfinal of the season; she won her three most recent QFs at Madrid,
 Rome and Roland Garros
- Is 2-1 against Bencic so far this year with all three also 4r meetings
- Eight of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard court title is the 2024 WTA Finals

[6] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #8) vs. Marie Bouzkova (CZE #52)

First meeting

Paolini:

- Currently No.9 on the PIF Race to WTA Finals Leaderboard, Paolini is trying to qualify for the year-end event in singles for the second-consecutive year; she has already qualified for WTA Finals in doubles (w/Errani)
- Would move into the Top 8 by reaching the semifinal this week with three weeks of tournaments remaining
- Appearing at Beijing for a third time, she has equaled her best previous result with R16 in 2023 (I. Sabalenka)
- This is the 15th WTA 1000 R16 of her career, with seven of those coming in 2025 Doha, Dubai, Indian Wells, Miami, Rome, Cincinnati, Beijing
- Only Swiatek (8) has reached more R16 at WTA 1000 events this season than Paolini and Gauff (7)
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2024 Dubai and 2025 Rome
- With a win today would reach her sixth singles quarterfinal of the season she is currently undefeated in QF matches in 2025 (5-0)
- Can climb as high as No.5 in the PIF WTA Rankings if she wins the title

Bouzkova:

- Achieved her first China Open match wins this year after falling in her opening round in 2023 (I. Putintseva)
- Best WTA 1000 result is semifinals at 2022 Guadalajara and 2019 Toronto
- Looking for her first Top 10 win of the season currently 0-5 in 2025
- Is 1-0 against players from Italy in 2025 (d. Stefanini at Prague en route to claiming the title)
- With a win today would reach her fifth QF of the season after Brisbane (QF), Bogota (QF), Prague (WON) and Monterrey (SF)



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[13] Karolina Muchova (CZE #15) vs. [3] Amanda Anisimova (USA #4)

Anisimova leads 1-0

Muchova:

- Making her 3rd appearance at Beijing, with a best result of runner-up last year (I. Gauff)
- She is a 2-time finalist at WTA 1000 events, having also finished runner-up at 2023 Cincinnati (I. Gauff in F)
- Is 1-4 in matches against Top 10 opponents in 2025 with her only victory over No.4 Paolini at United Cup
- One of three players from Czech Republic to reach R16 along with Noskova and Bouzkova; equals the most Czech women through to R16 in Beijing (also 3 in 2017)
- A win today will be her second consecutive quarterfinal after US Open (I. Osaka)
- Her sole career title was won on hard court: 2019 Seoul

Anisimova:

- Remains in contention to qualify for the WTA Finals; entered the week at No.4 on the PIF Race to WTA Finals Leaderboard
- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Beijing; best previous result was reaching 4r last year (I. Zheng Qinwen)
- Won the first WTA 1000 title of her career earlier this year at Doha (d. Ostapenko in final)
- A win today would be 8th Tour level QF of 2025; she is 5-1 in completed QF matches this season with her only loss at Berlin (I. Samsonova) (withdrew from Hobart QF through illness)
- This is her second meeting against an opponent from Czech Republic this year after defeating Noskova in R16 at Wimbledon
- Currently playing at a career-high ranking of No.4; this time last year was ranked No.43

Eva Lys (GER #66) vs. McCartney Kessler (USA #39)

Lys leads 2-0

Lys:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, fell in 1r in 2023 as a qualifier (I. Ostapenko)
- Her win over No.10 Rybakina in the previous round was her first career Top 10 win
- Is through to the R16 at a WTA 1000 event for the first time in her career
- A win today would be her 7th career tour-level QF and 2nd of 2025, alongside Cleveland in August (withdrew due to injury)
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is SF twice: Monastir in 2024; Cluj-Napoca in 2023

Kessler:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, fell in the 1r last year (I. Zhang Shuai)
- A win today would be her 5th career tour-level QF and 4th of 2025, alongside Hobart, Austin and Nottingham
- Owns 22 wins in 2025 vs. Top 100 players, most recently defeated No.34 Krejcikova in previous round here
- Two of her 3 WTA titles have come on hard court: Hobart 2025 (d. Mertens in F) and Cleveland 2024 (d. Haddad Maia in F)
- One of 5 players from United States of America to reach 4r alongside Navarro, Pegula, Anisimova and Gauff the most in tournament history (previously 4 in 2024

- Owns 7 hard court titles: Abu Dhabi in 2025; Abu Dhabi, Adelaide #2 in 2023; Tokyo Olympics in 2021; Moscow, Dubai in 2019; Toronto in 2015
- Is currently ranked No.16; this time last year was ranked No.1447 (career high ranking of No.4 was achieved on 17 Feb 2020)
- Has won 28 matches so far in 2025; a win today would be her fourth QF of the season after Abu Dhabi, Indian Wells and Wimbledon
- · Winner today will face Kessler or Lys in QF

- Best WTA 1000 result this season is reaching the final at Madrid (l. Sabalenka) and Rome (l. Paolini)
- After 1r bye, has beaten Kamilla Rakhimova and Leylah Fernandez so far this week to reach 4r
- Faces No.16 Belinda Bencic in 4r today; owns 50 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.1 Sabalenka in Roland Garros final this year
- Is 2-1 against players from Switzerland in 2025 with all such meetings against Bencic
- 8 of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard court title is the 2024 WTA Finals
- United States of America has won Beijing three times, most recently by Gauff last year (also Serena Williams in 2004 and 2013)
- Is currently ranked No.3; this time last year was ranked No.6. Reached career-high ranking of No.2 for the first time in June 2024
- During last year's Asian swing won titles at WTA Finals and Beijing, and reached SF at Wuhan
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2023 Cincinnati and 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in both finals)

CAREER MILESTONES

- After giving birth to daughter Bella, returned to the courts in October 2024 to play a handful of ITF matches, as well as winning her Billie Jean King Cup Playoff match for Switzerland over Serbia's Lola Radivojevic in November
- Played last tournament of 2023 at San Diego before taking maternity leave
- In 2023, won two titles at Adelaide 2 (d. Kasatkina in F) and Abu Dhabi (d. Samsonova in F); also finished R-Up at Charleston (l. Jabeur)
- Won sixth career title in 2022, triumphing at Charleston, while finishing R-Up at Berlin (l. Jabeur) and helped Switzerland lift Billie Jean King Cup Finals in Glasgow; also reached SF at Miami (l. Osaka) and Tallinn (l. Krejcikova) Captured gold medal for Switzerland at Tokyo Olympics in 2021 (d. Vondrousova in F); also claimed silver in doubles (w/Golubic)
- Other 2021 highlights included R-Up finish at Adelaide (l. Swiatek) and Berlin (l. Samsonova), and six further QFs (including US Open)
- Across a disrupted 2020 reached three QFs, at Adelaide, St. Petersburg and Doha
- Was voted WTA Comeback Player of the Year in 2019 - lifted two titles at Dubai (d. Kvitova in F) and Moscow (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and posted a career-best 49 Tour-level match wins in 2019 fourth most among all players and breaking back into Top 10 on September 9
- Earned spot at WTA Finals in Shenzhen becoming first Swiss player to compete in singles at the WTA Finals since Hingis in 2006, going on to reach SF at the season-ending showpiece (l. Svitolina)
- Also in 2019, marked 20th Grand Slam main draw by reaching her maiden major SF at US Open (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and finished R-Up at Mallorca (l. Kenin)
- Led the WTA with six victories over Top 5 players in 2019, including upsets over No.1 Naomi Osaka at Indian Wells, Madrid and US Open
- Standout result in 2018 was R-Up finish at Luxembourg (as qualifier, l. Goerges)
- In first round at 2018 Australian Open, defeated No.5 Venus Williams. Having also upset then-No.1 Serena Williams in SF at 2015 Toronto is one of seven women to defeat both Williams sisters before their 21st birthday (also Hingis, Sharapova, Clijsters, Henin, Chakvetadze and Osaka)
- Underwent left wrist surgery in spring 2017, missing five months - ranking fell outside Top 300; reached QF at Linz as WC in first WTA event back after surgery

- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women sprofessional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l.

- Run to 2016 St. Petersburg final (l. Vinci in F) saw her break into Top 10 at No.9 for the first time in her career. Also in 2016, reached SF at Sydney and

 s-Hertogenbosch.
- Won first career titles in 2015 at Eastbourne (d. Radwanska in F) and Toronto (d. Halep in F); also reached final at

 | s-Hertogenbosch (l. Giorgi) and Tokyo (l. Radwanska)
- At Toronto, beat four Top 10 players en route to the title including World No.1 Serena Williams
