[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #2) vs. [16] Emma Navarro (USA #17)

Swiatek leads 2-0

Swiatek:

- Making her 2nd Beijing appearance after claiming the title here in 2023 (d. Samsonova in F); currently holds an 8-0 career win-loss record at the China Open
- Looking to reach her 25th career quarterfinal in WTA 1000 events, and her seventh WTA 1000 quarterfinal of 2025
- Swiatek could manage 25 WTA 1000 QFs out of 40 main-draw appearances at WTA 1000 events; since the WTA 1000 format introduction in 2009, only Serena Williams (32) and Maria Sharapova (39) have reached 25 QFs in fewer appearances
- Owns 11 career WTA 1000 titles; her best WTA 1000 result this year is the Cincinnati title (d. Paolini in F)
- Has won 59 tour-level matches so far in 2025; she leads the tour in match-wins this year
- On a 6-match winning streak; she won her 25th career WTA singles title just over a week ago in Seoul
- In contention – along with Sabalenka – for PIF WTA Rankings Year-End No.1

Navarro:

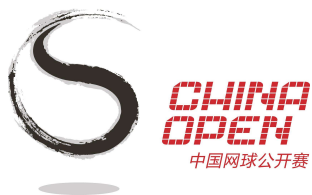
- Making her 2nd appearance at Beijing; in her previous showing in 2024, she lost to Zhang Shuai in her opening match (after 1r bye)
- Best career result at a WTA 1000 event was her SF run at Toronto 2024 (l. Anisimova); she also reached the QF at 2024 Indian Wells (l. eventual finalist Sakkari)
- Is through to her second R16 at a WTA 1000 event in 2025, after Dubai
- Owns 3-7 career record against Top 5 opponents, her most recent Top 5 win was against Coco Gauff at US Open 2024
- Both of her 2 WTA titles have come on hard court: Hobart 2024 and Merida 2025

[23] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #28) vs. [5] Jessica Pegula (USA #7)

Pegula leads 3-1

Kostyuk:

- This is her 3rd appearance at Beijing, she has equaled her previous best result of reaching R16 in 2023 (l. Samsonova)
- Looking to reach her fifth career quarterfinal in WTA 1000 events, and her fourth of 2025 after Doha, Madrid and Montreal
- Her career-best WTA 1000 showing is the 2024 Indian Wells SF (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Owns 9 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.3 Coco Gauff at Doha 2025 (Kostyuk has gone 0-6 vs. Top 10 players since then)
- Owns 1 WTA title which came on hard court at Austin 2023 (d. Gracheva in F)
- Only Sabalenka (147) has saved more break points at WTA 1000 events in 2025 than Kostyuk (143)

Pegula:

- Making 4th appearance at Beijing; she is through to the R16 for the third consecutive edition
- Owns 3 WTA 1000 titles: Toronto 2024 (d. Anisimova in F), Montreal 2023 (d. Samsonova in F) and Guadalajara 2022 (d. Sakkari in F)
- Looking to reach her 20th career quarterfinal in WTA 1000 events, and her third of 2025 after Doha (QF) and Miami (runner-up to Sabalenka)
- 6 of her 9 WTA titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard court title is Austin 2025
- Has won 3 singles titles in 2025, at Austin (hard court), Charleston (clay), and Bad Homburg (grass)
- Has won 44 tour-level matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.3 on tour for match-wins this year, behind only Iga Swiatek and Aryna Sabalenka

Anastasia Potapova (#59) vs. [26] Linda Noskova (CZE #27)

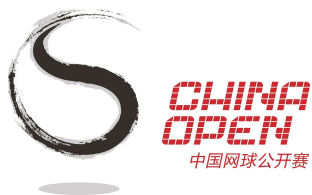
Tied 1-1

Potapova:

- Posted her first main-draw wins at China Open this year, after falling in her opening-round matches in 2023 (l. Gracheva) and 2024 (l. Minnen)
- Her career-best WTA 1000 results are QFs at 2024 Indian Wells, 2023 Miami and 2021 Dubai
- Holds a career record of 3-2 in WTA 1000 R16 matches
- Defeated Noskova in their only Tour-level main-draw match, in Roland Garros 1r this year
- Following her 2r win over No.21 seed Mboko, is looking to defeat multiple seeded opponents at a WTA 1000 event for the fourth time in her career after Dubai 2021, Miami 2023 and Madrid 2025
- 2 of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court: Cluj-Napoca in 2025; Linz in 2023

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2023 (gave walkover vs. Ostapenko)
- Looking to reach the second WTA 1000 QF of her career after Dubai 2025 (l. eventual finalist Tauson)
- In WTA 1000 events, holds a career record of 9-3 against opponents ranked outside the Top 50, last defeating No.152 Wang Xiyu in 2r here in Beijing
- A win today would be the 7th QF of her 2025 season, with a QF record of 3-3 this year (she lost her most recent QF at Monterrey to eventual finalist Alexandrova)
- Her sole career title came on hard court: Monterrey in 2024
- Has earned 30 Tour-level match-wins so far in 2025, the most she has managed in a single season
- Third-most total aces on tour this year (316), trailing only Rybakina (394) and Tauson (330)

[4] Mirra Andreeva (#5) vs. Sonay Kartal (GBR #81)

First meeting

Andreeva:

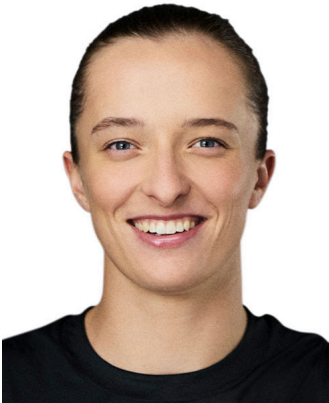
- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where her previous and tournament-best result was reaching QF in 2024 (l. Zheng Qinwen); also made 2023 R16 as a qualifier (l. Rybakina)
- With a win, she would become the youngest player to reach multiple quarterfinals at the China Open since the inception of the tournament in 2004
- First time facing a player from the United Kingdom
- A win today would be the ninth quarterfinal of her 2025 season, with a record of 3-5 in QF matches this year (she lost her 5 most recent QFs)
- Won her first two WTA 1000 titles earlier this season at Dubai and Indian Wells
- Seeking her 8th career WTA 1000 QF; she could become the youngest player to reach eight WTA 1000 quarterfinals since the format introduction in 2009
- Holds a 16-2 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 (the two losses were to Boisson in Roland Garros QF and Townsend in US Open 3r)

Kartal:

- In her China Open debut, has equaled her career-best WTA 1000 result with R16; also made R16 at Indian Wells this season (as lucky loser, l. Sabalenka)
- This is her third career meeting against a Top 10 player, and she is looking for her first Top 10 win today (l. No.2 Gauff at 2024 Wimbledon, l. No.1 Sabalenka at 2025 Indian Wells)
- Best result by United Kingdom at Beijing was runner-up finish by Johanna Konta in 2016 (l. Radwanska)
- A win today would be the second Tour quarterfinal of her career after claiming the 2024 Monastir title
- Made her Top 50 debut in June of this year, and peaked at No.44 in July

CAREER MILESTONES

- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a three-peat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals
- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - joint-longest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejčíková/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
- Voted 2024 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year Award, finished the year ranked No.8 with a singles record of 54-24, winning her first career title at 2024 Hobart; climbed to a year-end ranking at No.8 after finishing 2023 at No.38 (and No.143 in 2022)
- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay; Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng) and one semifinal on grass; Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova).
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tour-level, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Broke into Top 200 for the first time on March 7, 2022
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA division 1 women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- In 2021, reached 2r at both Charleston [500] and Charleston [250]
- Fell 1r at 2020 Monterrey (l. Stephens)
- Only other events in 2020 came on ITF Circuit, ending year ranked No.463
- Owns three ITF Circuit titles in singles and one in doubles
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter Bowl
- Also R-Up in girls' doubles at 2019 Australian Open w/Beck

- Member of Poland's Billie Jean King Cup team, 2018-20, 2021-22
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level
- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Kung in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016

- Father is former Olympic rower Tomasz Swiatek, who competed in the men's quadruple sculls event at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul
- In summer 2022 organised 'Iga Swiatek and friends for Ukraine' event in Krakow, which featured a mixed doubles match between Agnieszka Radwanska, Sergiy Stakhovsky, Polish junior Martyn Pawelski and herself, and was attended by Poland's First Lady, Agata Kornhauser-Duda, Elina Svitolina and Andriy Shevchenko. The occasion was watched by almost 15,000 people live and a further one million on television, raising more than half a million Euros for Ukrainian children and teenagers affected by the war
- Started playing tennis because her older sister was playing and wanted to beat her
- Enjoys rock music, including AC/DC and Pink Floyd
- Includes PZU, On, Tecnifibre, Rolex and Xiaomi in her endorsement portfolio
