Anisimova leads 1-0

Paolini:

- Appearing at Beijing for a third time, she has surpassed her best previous result with R16 in 2023 (I. Sabalenka)
- Looking to reach her fifth career semifinal in WTA 1000 events and fourth this year after Miami, Rome and Cincinnati
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2024 Dubai and 2025 Rome
- Is undefeated in singles quarterfinal matches in 2025 with a record of 5-0
- Can climb as high as No.5 in the PIF WTA Rankings if she wins the title
- A win today would mean Paolini advances to No.8 in the PIF Race to WTA Finals

Anisimova:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Beijing; best previous result was reaching 4r last year (I. Zheng Qinwen)
- Defeated Paolini in their only previous career meeting at 2021 Parma
- Won the first WTA 1000 title of her career earlier this year at Doha (d. Ostapenko in final)
- Looking to reach her sixth WTA semifinal of the 2025 season after Doha, Charleston, Queen's, Wimbledon and US Open
- Currently playing at a career-high ranking of No.4; this time last year was ranked No.43
- Since the start of the grass swing in June, only Swiatek (27) has claimed more match wins at WTA level than Anisimova (23)
- A win today would mean Anisimova qualifies for the WTA Finals

Eva Lys (GER #66) vs. [2] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

First meeting

Lys:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, fell in 1r in 2023 as a qualifier (l. Ostapenko)
- Her win over No.10 Rybakina in the 3r here was her first career Top 10 win
- Is through to the QF at a WTA 1000 event for the first time in her career
- A win today would be her 4th career tour-level SF and first of the 2025 season
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is SF twice: Monastir in 2024; Cluj-Napoca in 2023
- Has won 19 tour level matches in 2025, as many as she managed in all her previous seasons combined at this level

Gauff:

- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where she is defending champion (d. Muchova in last year's final)
- Has reached her 20th quarterfinal at WTA 1000 level, she is the third youngest player to achieve this feat after Hingis and Sharapova
- A win today would be her fourth singles semifinal of the season; she hasn't lost a SF match this year
- Eight of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard court title is the 2024 WTA Finals
- Since 2023, Gauff has 16 wins on Chinese soil at WTA level, only Zheng Qinwen (17) has more during that period in such events
- Her win over Bencic in the previous round secured her qualification to WTA Finals

- First German to reach the quarterfinals in WTA 1000 events since Kerber at Indian Wells 2021
- Is currently ranked No.66; this time last year was ranked No.105. Reached career-high ranking of No.55 in July this year
- During last year's Asian swing reached QF at Osaka as a lucky loser (l. Ito)

- Best WTA 1000 result this season is reaching the final at Madrid (l. Sabalenka) and Rome (l. Paolini)
- After 1r bye, has beaten Rakhimova, Fernandez and Bencic so far this week to reach her 20th career quarterfinal in WTA 1000 events, and her fourth in 2025 after Madrid, Rome and Cincinnati
- Competing in her seventh singles quarterfinal of the 2025 season, looking to reach her fourth singles semifinal of the season after Madrid, Rome and Roland Garros
- Also looking to reach her 11th semifinal in WTA 1000 events and third this year after Madrid and Rome
- Faces No.66 Eva Lys in QF today, owns 16-3 record in 2025 against players outside the Top 50
- 8 of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard court title is the 2024 WTA Finals
- United States of America has won Beijing three times, most recently by Gauff last year (also Serena Williams in 2004 and 2013)
- Gauff is the youngest player to reach three quarterfinals in Beijing since the inception of tournament in 2004
- Is currently ranked No.3; this time last year was ranked No.6. Reached career-high ranking of No.2 for the first time in June 2024
- During last year's Asian swing won titles at WTA Finals and Beijing, and reached SF at Wuhan
- Since 2023, Coco Gauff has 16 wins on Chinese soil at WTA level, only Qinwen Zheng (17) has more during that period in such events

CAREER MILESTONES

- Standout results of 2024 came in the second half of the season with semifinals at Budapest (l. eventual champion Shnaider) and Monastir (l. eventual champion Kartal); also made QF at Osaka (l. Ito) and reached a career high ranking of No.105 in September Reached first career SF at 2023 Cluj Napoca (l. Korpatsch) and QF at Hamburg (l. Rus); defeated No.1 seed Sorana Cirstea at Cluj Napoca for first Top 30 win of career
- Also in 2023, made Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open as a qualifier and reached 2r at US Open as a qualifier
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2022 Stuttgart reaching 2r as a qualifier and defeated No.38 Viktoria Golubic in 1r while ranked No.342 (l. Swiatek); also in 2022 reached 2r at Lausanne, fell 1r at Hamburg and contested qualifying at Berlin, Wimbledon, US Open and Tallinn
- Contested first WTA qualifying rounds at Hamburg and Linz in 2021
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title at W25 event in Altenkirchen, Germany in March 2020; owns three ITF singles titles
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in United States in 2016

- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women sprofessional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l.

- eventual champion Halep) followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2022
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018); won 2018
 Roland-Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and
 2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while
 finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (l.
 Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles
 finalist in tournament history at 13-years-old

- Based in Hamburg, father Vladimir continues to coach her and fitness trainer is David Schussmueller
- Mother, Maria, is a lawyer, while father, Vladimir, is a former professional tennis player who represented Ukraine at Davis Cup
- Has an older sister, Lisa Matviyenko (24), and younger sister, Isabella Lys (7).
- Began playing tennis when she was around five years old; father was working as a coach and while her mum studied for her law degree in Germany (had already qualified in Ukraine) they spent a lot of time at the courts
- · Her agent is Alex Boston
- Says her strengths are playing to her own rhythm, taking the ball early, and fighting spirit
- Speaks Russian/Ukrainian, German and English. Has finished top level of in high school in Germany - the 'Abitur', with favorite subject being biology

- · Coached by Jean Christophe Faurel
- Father, Corey, played basketball at Georgia State; mother, Candi, excelled in gymnastics before competing in a track and field at Florida State University
- Previously worked with Diego Moyano
- Started playing tennis at six
- Favorite surface is hard, describes her playing style as aggressive as possible with a big serve; depends on her quickness and athleticism to keep her in any point - describes herself as a "fighter"
- Tennis idols growing up were the Williams sisters whose tenacity and fearlessness made her want to become a professional tennis player
- Enjoys hanging out with her brother and family, watching superhero movies and making TikTok videos
- Does not have any pets but has been trying to convince her mom to get a dog
- Favorite city is Paris because of the history, food and architecture. Favorite celebrity is Beyonce because she is an incredible performer

CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakout 2024 season saw her win the biggest title of her career at WTA 1000 Dubai and also reach her first Grand Slam finals, finishing R-Up at Roland-Garros and Wimbledon. Qualified for her first WTA Finals in singles and doubles, broke into the Top 10 for the first time in her career and finished the season as the World No.4
- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (l. Mertens). Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (l. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (l. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (l. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (l. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)
- Also reached QF at Lyon (l. Yastremska), Portoroz (l. eventual champion Siniakova) and Parma (l. Kovinic)
- Broke into Top 50 on January 31, 2021
- Posted near-Top 50 season finish in 2021 after capturing first WTA singles title of career at Portoroz (d. Riske in F)
- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur(l. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (l. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (l. Golubic) Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg(w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and US Open, equalling best previous Slam result
- In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (l. Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15

- In 2024 made first WTA 1000 final of career at Toronto, finishing R-Up to Pegula (defeated No.3 Sabalenka en route). Also enjoyed run to R16 at Australian Open, her third time reaching that stage in Melbourne
- Played a small number of tournaments in 2023 before taking a break away from the sport after Madrid in April
- Lifted second career title at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (d. Sasnovich in F) in January 2022
- In 2022, also made SF at Charleston (l. Jabeur) and five further QFs, including at Wimbledon (l. Halep)
- Ended 2021 season with 3r run at Indian Wells to secure her fourth consecutive Top-100 finish. Best results were QF runs at Parma and Bad Homburg
- Opened 2020 with SF showing at Auckland, going on to reach 3r at US Open, Roland Garros and Doha; during Doha run, earned third career Top 10 win over No.7 Svitolina (l. Kuznetsova in 3r due to walkover)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.24 the youngest of three teenagers in the Top 50 (also Andreescu and Yastremska)
- Posted career best Grand Slam result with SF run at 2019 Roland Garros - first player (man or woman) born in 2000s to advance to this stage of a major. Scored maiden win over a Top 5 player during 2019 Roland Garros, upsetting No.3 and defending champion Halep in QF
- Result boosted her into Top 50 for first time at No.26 on June 10, 2019
- Won maiden title at 2019 Bogota (d. Sharma in F); at 17y 222d was the youngest American to win a title since S.Williams at 1999 Indian Wells (17y 169d)
- Made Top 100 debut at No.95 on September 17, 2018, after reaching first WTA final at Hiroshima (as qualifier, l. Hsieh)
- Also in 2018, upset No.9 Kvitova to become the joint-youngest player to reach R16 at Indian Wells, along with Majoli, who made SF in 1994 (both aged 16 years, 199 days)
- Played only two ITF tournaments before making WTA main draw debut at 2017 Miami (l. Townsend in 3s), with Grand Slam bow coming at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Nara in 1r)
- In juniors, won US Open girls' singles in 2017 (d. Gauff in F) and was R-Up at 2016 Roland Garros; reached No.2 in junior world rankings
- · Owns one singles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at 2016 US Open qualifying (l. Hozumi in 2r)

- Kasatkina, l. Zhang)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three times
- Part of Italy's Billie Jean King Cup team 2017-19
