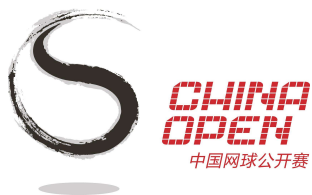
Series tied 1-1, with Noskova winning their first meeting at 2023 Indian Wells in straight sets...Anisimova won their next meeting in three sets, en route to her first Grand Slam final at Wimbledon earlier this year... This is the second WTA 1000 final between two players born during the 2000s (Mirra Andreeva d. Clara Tauson at 2025 Dubai was the first)

[26] Linda Noskova (CZE #27) vs. [3] Amanda Anisimova (USA #4)

Tied 1-1

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching R32 in 2023 (gave walkover vs. Ostapenko)
- Contesting the 20th WTA 1000 main draw of her career and is into her 1st WTA 1000 final; her previous career-best WTA 1000 result was 2025 Dubai QF (l. eventual finalist Tauson)
- Seeking her 12th career Top 10 win and third this fortnight (already defeated No.9 Zheng in 3r and No.7 Pegula in SF, saving 3 match points vs. Pegula)
- Trying to become the 4th player in the last three years to win a WTA 1000 title after saving match point during the tournament; she would join Barbora Krejčíková (Dubai 2023), Iga Świątek (Madrid 2024) and Victoria Mboko (Montreal 2025)
- Has beaten two Top 10 players in a single event for the 2nd time (d. No.8 Kasatkina and No.2 Jabeur en route to 2023 Adelaide final) – this could become the first time she beats 3 Top 10 players in one event
- Holds a 3-11 record vs. Top 5 players; her most recent Top 5 win came over No.5 Pegula at 2025 Dubai
- Into her 5th career WTA singles final overall (all on hard court); she won the title at 2024 Monterrey, and she finished runner-up at 2023 Adelaide #1, 2023 Prague and 2025 Prague
- Aiming to become the first Czech woman to win this title; Czechs who finished runner-up here are Petra Kvitová in 2014 (l. Sharapova) and Karolína Muchová last year (l. Gauff)
- Leads this year's tournament in aces (24)
- By reaching the SF this week, secured her Top 20 debut in the PIF WTA Singles Rankings after the tournament; projected to climb to No.17 with final or No.13 with title
- Projected to rise to No.15 in the PIF Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard (or No.12 with title); she would need back-to-back titles (Beijing and Wuhan) to move into the Top 10 on the Leaderboard

Anisimova:

- Making her 3rd main-draw appearance at Beijing; her previous best tournament result was 4r last year (l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Contesting the 43rd WTA 1000 main draw of career and is into her 3rd WTA 1000 final; she won the 2025 Doha title (d. Ostapenko in F) and finished runner-up at 2024 Toronto (l. Pegula)
- This is her 5th tour-level final of the year; along with her Doha title, she reached her first two Grand Slam finals at Wimbledon and US Open (runner-up at both) and was also a runner-up at Queen's Club
- Only Aryna Sabalenka (8) has reached more tour-level finals in 2025 than Amanda Anisimova (5 – tied with Jessica Pegula)
- Seeking to become the 2nd straight American to win this title after Coco Gauff last year; other China Open titles won by Americans are Serena Williams' two championships in 2004 and 2013 (Americans are 3-0 in China Open finals)
- She is 2-0 vs. Czech players in 2025; she beat Noskova at Wimbledon and Muchova at this event
- This marks her 9th career WTA singles final overall; she has a 3-5 record in finals, with her titles coming at 2019 Bogota (clay), 2022 Melbourne #2 (hard court) and 2025 Doha (hard court)
- Leads this tournament in total winners (151)
- Currently playing at a career-high ranking of No.4; this time last year was ranked No.43
- Secured her first-ever WTA Finals qualification by reaching the Beijing SF; she is one of 3 Americans already qualified for the 2025 WTA Finals (also Gauff and Keys) – the most since 2002

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024, achieved first Grand Slam singles quarterfinal at the Australian Open (l. Yastremska), where she also defeated then-World No.1 Iga Swiatek in the 3r; won her first singles title at Monterrey (d. Sun in F); reached SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Linette) and Brisbane (l. eventual champion Rybakina); earned a new career-high ranking of No.25 on August 26, 2024
- Breakthrough year in 2023, achieving runner-up twice; Adelaide 1 (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Prague (l. Hibino). Also reached quarterfinals at Lyon (l. Osorio) and 3r at Indian Wells (l. Gauff) and Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Gauff). Broke into Top 40 on October 9, 2023.
- Made Top-100 debut on August 1, 2022, following SF run at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova); overtook Gauff at the youngest player in Top 100
- Also reached 2r at Tallinn (as qualifier, l. Haddad Maia) and fell 1r at both Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Raducanu) and US Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova). On ITF Circuit, lifted fifth and sixth titles at this level, winning W60 tournament in Croissy-Beaubourg, France and W100 event in Versmold, Germany
- Finished 2021 campaign with 38-9 win-loss record, winning four ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 event in Prerov, Czech Republic
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2020 Prague
- On ITF Circuit, owns six titles in singles and one in doubles
- As a junior, won 2021 girls' singles at Roland Garros.

- In 2024 made first WTA 1000 final of career at Toronto, finishing R-Up to Pegula (defeated No.3 Sabalenka en route). Also enjoyed run to R16 at Australian Open, her third time reaching that stage in Melbourne
- Played a small number of tournaments in 2023 before taking a break away from the sport after Madrid in April
- Lifted second career title at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (d. Sasnovich in F) in January 2022
- In 2022, also made SF at Charleston (l. Jabeur) and five further QFs, including at Wimbledon (l. Halep)
- Ended 2021 season with 3r run at Indian Wells to secure her fourth consecutive Top-100 finish. Best results were QF runs at Parma and Bad Homburg
- Opened 2020 with SF showing at Auckland, going on to reach 3r at US Open, Roland Garros and Doha; during Doha run, earned third career Top 10 win over No.7 Svitolina (l. Kuznetsova in 3r due to walkover)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.24 - the youngest of three teenagers in the Top 50 (also Andreescu and Yastremska)
- Posted career best Grand Slam result with SF run at 2019 Roland Garros - first player (man or woman) born in 2000s to advance to this stage of a major. Scored maiden win over a Top 5 player during 2019 Roland Garros, upsetting No.3 and defending champion Halep in QF
- Result boosted her into Top 50 for first time at No.26 on June 10, 2019
- Won maiden title at 2019 Bogota (d. Sharma in F); at 17y 222d was the youngest American to win a title since S.Williams at 1999 Indian Wells (17y 169d)
- Made Top 100 debut at No.95 on September 17, 2018, after reaching first WTA final at Hiroshima (as qualifier, l. Hsieh)
- Also in 2018, upset No.9 Kvitova to become the joint-youngest player to reach R16 at Indian Wells, along with Majoli, who made SF in 1994 (both aged 16 years, 199 days)
- Played only two ITF tournaments before making WTA main draw debut at 2017 Miami (l. Townsend in 3s), with Grand Slam bow coming at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Nara in 1r)
- In juniors, won US Open girls' singles in 2017 (d. Gauff in F) and was R-Up at 2016 Roland Garros; reached No.2 in junior world rankings
- Owns one singles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at 2016 US Open qualifying (l. Hozumi in 2r)
