Viktoriya Tomova (BUL #64) vs. [WC] Alexandra Eala (PHI #72)

First meeting

Tomova:

- Looking for her first Madrid main draw win today after playing 1r in 2023 (as lucky loser, l. Grabher) and 2024 (l. Xinyu Wang)
- Best results on clay came with semifinals at 2024 Rabat and Belgrade & Bogota in 2021
- Winner today will face reigning Madrid champion and No.2 seed Iga Swiatek in 2r

Eala:

- Making her third main draw appearance at Madrid, posting the first WTA 1000 win of her career here in 2024 by reaching 2r (l. Cirstea)
- Her four Tour level main draw match wins of 2025 so far came during her breakthrough run to WTA 1000 Miami semifinal (l. Pegula)
- On the way to the 2025 Miami semifinal, she defeated three Grand Slam champions; Jelena Ostapenko in 2r, Madison Keys in 3r and Iga Swiatek in QF

Naomi Osaka (JPN #55) vs. Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #58)

Osaka leads 2-0

Osaka:

- Making sixth appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching quarterfinal in 2019 (l. Bencic)
- Undefeated against Bronzetti winning both meetings in 2024 including one clay win in the first round at Roland Garros
- Best career result on clay was semifinal at 2019 Stuttgart
- One of two players from Japan to feature in the main draw along with Uchijima

Bronzetti:

- Making third main draw appearance at Madrid, previously making 2r once before in 2024 (l. Rybakina)
- Currently ranked No.58, this time last year was at a career high of No.46 following R32 runs at Dubai and Indian Wells
- Owns one clay court title at Rabat 2023
- Best result by Italy at Madrid was Sara Errani's semifinal performance in 2013

Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #73) vs. Mayar Sherif (EGY #61)

Sherif leads 1-0

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 2nd appearance at Madrid, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (l. Ostapenko)
- Making sixth appearance at a WTA 1000 event; owns 2 wins at such events, one at the Madrid Open here last year and the other at 2024 Cincinnati
- Best result by Spanish player at Madrid was SF run by Paula Badosa in 2021
- Reached her second QF at WTA level event last week at Rouen (l. eventual champion, Svitolina)

Sherif:

- Making 3rd appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching QF in 2023 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka), becoming the first player from Egypt to reach QF at a WTA 1000 event since the format introduction in 2009
- Eight of her 11 wins at WTA 1000 events have come on clay; has a win rate of 66.7% on clay at WTA 1000 events compared to 16.7% on hardcourt
- Has lost her last 10 matches against opponents ranked 50+
- Holds a 1-7 record in the 2025 season, with her only win coming at Miami

Katie Boulter (GBR #40) vs. Katerina Siniakova (CZE #56)

First meeting

Boulter:

- Making 2nd appearance at Madrid, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (l. Montgomery)
- Best career result on clay is R64 run which she has reached on three occasions all in 2024: Paris Olympics, Rome, and Madrid
- Best result by player from the United Kingdom at Madrid was R16 by Emma Raducanu in 2022 and Laura Robson in 2013
- Beginning her 2025 clay court season here in Madrid

Siniakova:

- Making 7th appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching R32 in 2022 (l. Rybakina) and 2017 (l. Kerber)
- Owns 5-2 career record against players from United Kingdom
- Owns one career singles title on clay at 2017 Bastad (d. Wozniacki in F)
- Is currently World No.1 in doubles and has claimed doubles titles at Australian Open and Dubai already this season with Taylor Townsend

Arango:

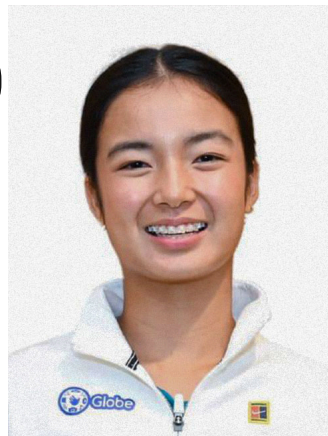
- The only two players from Colombia face each other in the 1r

- Her best career result on clay was quarterfinal at 2018 Bogota

Osorio:

- Is on a five-match winning streak after claiming her third title at Bogota (d. Kawa in final) earlier this month
- Reached 3r in her first main draw appearance at Madrid in 2023 (I. eventual champion Sabalenka), equalling the best Madrid result by a player from Colombia made by Mariana Duque-Mariño in 2017 and 2015
- Has won 10 matches so far in 2025 with half of those achieved on clay during her title run at Bogota
- Faced Arango once before at ITF level in 2019 with Arango retiring during the second set

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2024 season highlights included reaching SF at Bad Homburg and Rabat, QF at Hobart and Seoul; and finishing R-Up at WTA 125 event in Valencia. In Grand Slam play, reached 2r at the Australian Open and Roland Garros for the first time. Set new career-high ranking of No.46 (July 29) and finished inside Top 50 for first time.
- Claimed first WTA 125 event at 2023 Chicago (d. Liu in F). Reached second round at 2023 Wimbledon (l. Boulter). Reached career high ranking of No.71 on May 22, 2023.
- Best result of 2022 was QF run at Eastbourne (as LL, l. Giorgi). Also finished R-Up at WTA 125 in Budapest and at W80 ITF Circuit tournament in Oeiras
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 8, 2022, following SF run at W80 ITF Circuit event in Grodzisk Mazowiecki, Poland
- Advanced to maiden WTA SFs during 2021 season, first at Bogota (l. Zidansek) and then at Belgrade (as LL, l. eventual champion Badosa)
- On Tour's return in 2020, fell 1r at US Open and Istanbul before reaching SF at \$80k ITF/Cagnes sur Mer-FRA
- In final event before the tour's hiatus, made 2r at Lyon (l. Van Uytvanck)
- Started 2020 with a productive spell on ITF Circuit in Great Britain, finishing R-Up at \$25K Glasgow before winning 16th title at this level at \$25K Sunderland (d. Raducanu in F)
- Made four Tour-level appearances in 2019, highlighted by 2r showing at Osaka (as qualifier, d. Cornet, l. Osaka), while won title at \$80K ITF/Biarritz-FRA (d. Kovinic in F)
- Highlights of 2018 were Grand Slam main-draw debut at Australian Open (l. Gibbs in 1r) and first ever Grand Slam main-draw victory at Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Smitkova, l. S.Williams). Also made 2r at Istanbul and Hong Kong
- In 2017, reached 2r at Bastad (as qualifier, l. Krunic) and Linz (as qualifier, l. Golubic). Also fell 1r at Gstaad - making her WTA main draw debut - and in qualifying on 12 occasions (including all four majors)
- Maiden Top-50 upset came over No.40 Goerges in 1r at 2017 Bastad (via ret.)
- Made successful comeback from injury in 2016, winning 64 matches and four titles, rising over 300 places in the rankings. Since return has stopped playing doubles to protect injury
- In 2015, missed five months with a leg muscle strain - ended season at No.474
- In 2024 made 2r at WTA 1000 Madrid (l. Cirstea) as well as playing main draw at Abu Dhabi, Guadalajara, Wuhan, Guangzhou and Jiujiang. Earned fourth ITF career title at W100 Vitoria-Gasteiz and reached a career high ranking of No.143 in July
- Entered first Grand Slam in 2023 at Australian Open qualifying (l. Doi in Q1). As a qualifier reached main draw at Hua Hin (l. Maria), Osaka (l. Sakatsume), Guangzhou (l. Maria) and Monastir (l. Mertens) taking her ranking into Top 200 for first time.
- Claimed first ITF title in 2022 at Chiang Rai \$25K and also played WTA Miami opening main draw match (l. Brengle) and qualifying at Madrid (l. Bondar).
- In 2021 played first Tour level match at Miami qualifying (l. Kuzmova) and reached 2r at Cluj Napoca on clay (l. Sherif).
- Best result of 2021 was reaching QF at Grenoble \$25K.
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2020 at the age of 14.

- Member of Bulgarian Billie Jean King Cup Team, 2014-15, 2017-19, 2021-22
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2010 Miami
- On ITF Circuit owns 16 singles titles and 12 doubles titles
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Bulgaria in 2009

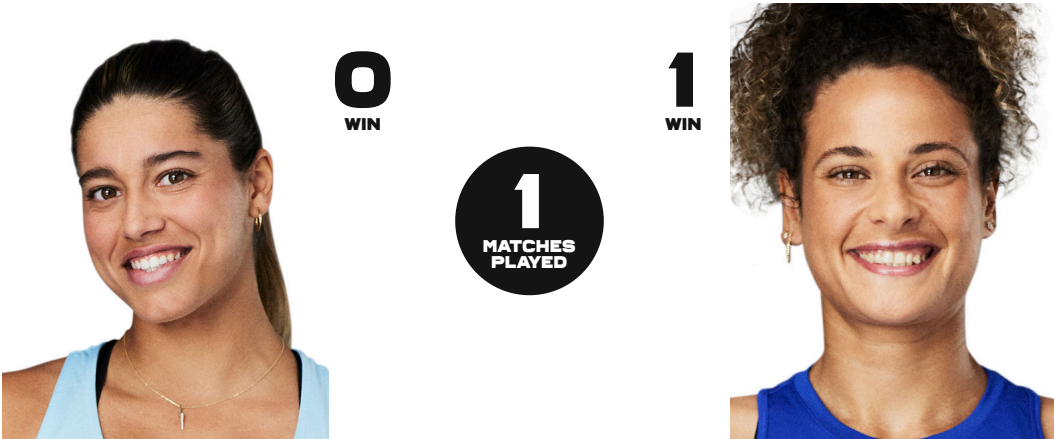
