- This will be the 16th edition of the Women's Singles at the Madrid Open, with the inaugural edition of the women's singles coinciding with the tournament's switch to clay from hard court in 2009.
- Petra Kvitova has won the most titles at Madrid, winning the event on three occasions 2011, 2015 and 2018.
- Since the event's inauguration in 2009, Petra Kvitova has both appeared in (42) and won (32) the most Women's Singles matches at the Madrid Open.

- Among players with 5+ matches at the event since 2009, Serena Williams (87.0%, 20-3) holds the highest win rate in Madrid, while Iga Swiatek (86.7%, 13-2) is best among currently active players.
- Two players have won back-to-back titles in Madrid Serena Williams (2012-13) and Simona Halep (2016-17).
- Since 2009, Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (15) has appeared in the most Women's Singles main draws in Madird
- Kiki Bertens (2019) is the only player to have won the title at Madrid without dropping a set, since the event's inauguration in 2009.
- At 31 years and 228 days, Serena Williams (2013) is the oldest player to win title in Madrid. Williams is the only player aged 30+ to win the event, doing so in consecutive years (2012-13).
- Kvitova (2011) is one of three players to win the event before turning 23, along with Aryna Sabalenka (2021) and Iga Swiatek (2024).
- Aravane Rezai (#24) is the only player ranked outside the WTA Top 20 to win the title at Madrid, defeating Venus Williams in the final to claim tournament victory in 2010.
- Since 2009, Simona Halep and Aryna Sabalenka have conceded the equal-fewest games en route to the title at Madrid, conceding 28 games respectively in 2016 and 2021.
- Since the event's inauguration in 2009, Ons Jabeur has conceded the most games en route to winning the Women's Singles at the Madrid Open, conceding 55 games in 2022.
- Three players have won the Women's Singles title at the Madrid Open while holding the WTA #1 ranking, since the event's inauguration Dinara Safina (2009), Serena Williams (2013) and Iga Swiatek (2024).
- Dominika Cibulkova (#38) is the lowest-ranked player to reach the Women's Singles final at the Madrid Open, eventually losing to Simona Halep in 2016.
- Since the event's inauguration in 2009, a Spanish player is yet to reach the Women's Singles final at the Madrid Open Paula Badosa has gone the furthest of any Spanish player at the event, reaching the semi-final in 2021.
- Last year, Iga Swiatek became only the third player to win titles in both Madrid and Rome in a season after Dinara Safina (2009) and Serena Williams (2013).
- Defeating Aryna Sabalenka in Madrid final last year, Iga Swiatek was one of two players to win a WTA event from championship point down in 2024, along with Jessica Pegula (Berlin).
- At this year's Madrid Open, Victoria Azarenka will be appearing in her 100th WTA-1000 main draw, becoming the third player since 2009 to appear in 100+ WTA-1000 main draws along with Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (114) and Petra Kvitova (105).
- Since the format's introduction in 2009, Iga Swiatek (89.2%, 33-4) holds the best win rate of any player at WTA-1000 events on clay minimum 10 matches.


