[3] Diana Shnaider (#22) vs. [5] Elise Mertens (BEL #21)

Mertens leads 2-1

Shnaider:

- This is her second main draw appearance at Monterrey, losing in 1r to today's opponent Mertens in 2023
- Enter her fourth quarterfinal of the season after Adelaide, Rome and London
- A win today would mean making the SF of a tournament for first time since winning the title at Hong Kong towards the end of the 2024 season
- Two of her four WTA titles have come on hard court: Hong Kong 2024 (d. Boulter in F) and Hua Hin 2024 (d. Zhu in F)
- Best result at a WTA 500 event is champion run at 2024 Bad Homburg (d. Vekic in F), also reached the final at 2023 Ningbo (l. Jabeur in F)

Mertens:

- Making 2nd appearance at Monterrey, reached SF on her only previous appearance in 2023 (l. Garcia)
- This is her fifth quarterfinal of the season, and first since winning the title at Den Bosch earlier this summer
- Record in quarterfinal matches this season stands at 3-1, reaching the final at Hobart (R-Up), Singapore (WON), Den Bosch (WON) and falling at Stuttgart (QF)
- Seven of her 10 career singles titles have come on hard court: Singapore 2025; Monastir 2023 & 2022; Melbourne 500 2021; Doha 2019; Hobart 2018 & 2017

Alycia Parks (USA #71) vs. Rebecca Sramkova (SVK #38)

Sramkova leads 1-0

Parks:

- Making tournament debut
- Best result at WTA 500 events was QF run at Ostrava 2022 (l. eventual champion Krejčíková)
- This is her fifth career quarterfinal and second of the 2025 season after reaching SF at Auckland (l. Osaka)
- Defeat of No.11 Emma Navarro in R16 was seventh Top 20 of career, and third of 2025
- Her career sole singles title came on hard court at Lyon 2023, defeating No.5 Garcia which is her career best win by ranking

Sramkova:

- Making her Monterrey debut
- This is her third quarterfinal of the season after Nottingham (SF) and Merida (QF)
- Best result by a woman from Slovakia at Monterrey was R-Up finish by Daniela Hantuchová in 2010
- Posted a career high ranking this season in July, reaching No.33
- Her sole career title came on hard court at Hua Hin 2 in 2024

[Q] Antonia Ruzic (CRO #89) vs. Marie Bouzkova (CZE #53)

First meeting

Ruzic:

- Making her Monterrey debut
- This is her second career Tour level quarterfinal after Monastir last season (l. Bronzetti in QF)
- Her 2024 Monastir quarterfinal is also her best career result on hard court
- Is the only qualifier to reach the quarterfinals this week; best result by a qualifier at Monterrey was R-Up by Viktorija Golubic in 2021
- Owns 0-1 record against player from Czech Republic so far this season, losing to Muchova at Montreal

Bouzkova:

- Making 5th appearance at Monterrey; her best result was achieving runner-up in 2020 (l. Svitolina in F)
- Has a 3-1 record against qualifiers so far this year, losing only to Kawa at Bogota
- Both her career titles were won on hard court: Prague in 2025 & 2022
- A win today would be her second semifinal of the season after lifting the Prague title (d. Noskova in F)

[6] Linda Noskova (CZE #23) vs. [2] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#14)

First meeting

Noskova:

- Lifted the title here in 2024 in her only previous Monterrey appearance (d. Sun in F)
- Her 2024 Monterrey victory is her only career title
- Enters her sixth QF of 2025, posting her best result at Prague with R-Up (l. Bouzkova in F)
- Owns 14 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently No.7 Mirra Andrejeva at Bad Homburg 2025
- One of two players from Czech Republic into the QF along with Bouzkova; Noskova's 2024 title run is the best result by Czech Republic here

Alexandrova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Monterrey, where her previous result was reaching SF in 2024 (l. Sun)
- Best WTA 500 result is lifting the Linz trophy this season (d. Yastremska in F)
- Also owns two other titles on hard court at Seoul 2022 and Shenzhen 2020
- This is her eighth QF of 2025 and has a QF career record of 26-15
- Is currently ranked at her career-best No.14; this time last year was ranked No.30

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won first four titles of career in 2024 across all three surfaces; WTA 500 Bad Homburg and WTA 250s Hua Hin, Budapest and Hong Kong. Reached her first Grand Slam 3r at 2024 Wimbledon and advanced to R16 at 2024 US Open
- Cracked into the Top 20 on August 12, 2024, where she stayed for the rest of the year finishing the season at World No.13
- Also in 2024, won the Paris Olympic silver medal in women's doubles with Mirra Andreieva
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2023 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Sakkari in 3s) and Roland Garros 2023 (l. Haddad Maia)
- Won WTA 125K Series title in Montevideo, Uruguay last November to end 2022 just outside Top 100
- Overall win-loss record in 2022 was 56-17; reached four ITF Circuit finals, highlighted by a 15-match, three tournament winning streak, culminating with a W60 title in Istanbul
- Last season only Tour-level outing was qualifying exit at St. Petersburg
- Won first ITF Circuit tournament at W15 event in Antalya in late 2021
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Moscow
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior matches on ITF Circuit towards end of 2020
- As junior, made SF at Roland Garros in 2021 and US Open in 2022. Also won girls' doubles at three of the four majors and reached No.2 in the ITF rankings
- Kicked off 2024 season with R-Up finish at Hobart (l. Navarro) which marked her 13th WTA singles final. In doubles won Australian Open, Indian Wells and Birmingham all w/ Hsieh Su-Wei and qualified for WTA Finals for sixth consecutive time
- Ended 2023 as only Top 100 player to finish year exactly where she started, at No. 29. Strongest singles results came at Monastir, successfully defending her title (d. Paolini), and SF at Monterrey (l. Garcia). Achieved a year-end doubles ranking of No. 2 after lifting two titles at Guadalajara and Rome (w/Hunter) and SF at WTA Finals Cancun (l. eventual champions Siegemund/Zvonareva).
- Finished 2022 ranked No.29 in singles, her sixth consecutive Top 50 finish; also finished No.5 in doubles for her fourth consecutive Top 10 finish in doubles and second consecutive Top 5 finish
- Lifted seventh WTA title, at 2022 Monastir (d. Cornet in F), while in doubles alongside partner Kudermetova won Dubai and WTA Finals, as well as finished R-Up at Wimbledon
- Enjoyed a productive start to 2021 season in Melbourne, triumphing at the Gippsland Trophy (d. Kanepi in F) to lift sixth WTA singles title, then teamed up w/Sabalenka at Australian Open to claim second Grand Slam doubles title (d. Krejčíková/Siniakova in F). Later in the year, won third career Grand Slam doubles title, at Wimbledon w/Hsieh
- Won the most matches on Tour in 2020, going 34-13 across the season and finishing as R-Up at both Prague (l. Halep) and Linz (l. Sabalenka)
- Earned her milestone 200th career main draw win with victory over Kalinina in 1r at 2020 Linz
- Singles highlights in 2019 were winning biggest title of career at Doha (d. No.3 Halep in final) and advancing to QF at US Open for the first time (l. eventual champion Andreescu in 3s)
- Enjoyed standout season in doubles in 2019 - won maiden major doubles title at US Open w/Sabalenka (d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Also Completed 'Sunshine Double' in doubles (w/Sabalenka), lifting the back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejčíková/Siniakova) and Miami (d. Stosur/Zhang), and qualified for Shiseido WTA Finals Shenzhen (went 1-2 in RR)
- Advanced to first Grand Slam SF of career at 2018 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Wozniacki)
- During 2018, lifted titles at Hobart, Rabat and Lugano, finishing with 46 main-draw match wins across the campaign - only Ka.Pliskova (49) and

Kvitova (47) registered more. By contrast, prior to 2018 season owned only 36 wins at this level across entire career

- In doubles in 2018, won four titles and reached QF at WTA Finals (w/Schuurs)
- Finished 2017 season at No.35, up from No.120 in 2016 - first Top 50 and Top 100 year-end finish. Season highlighted by first career singles title at Hobart (as a qualifier, d. Niculescu in F)
- Registered first Top-10 win of career over No.10 Cibulkova in 1r at 2017 Beijing
- Made WTA singles main draw debut at 2016 's-Hertogenbosch - made QF (as qualifier, l. Mladenovic)
- Won first WTA title of any kind in doubles at 2016 Auckland (w/Mestach)
- Played first Tour-level event of career at 2015 Antwerp (fell in qualifying)
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Belgium in 2010; owns 11 singles and 14 doubles titles on ITF Circuit

OTHER INFORMATION

- Started playing tennis in Tolyatti (Kasatkina's hometown), 40 kilometres from her home in Zhigulevsk and parents
- Moved to Moscow aged nine and is now studying at North Carolina State where she is majoring in exploratory studies
- Favorite movie is Never Back Down and favorite food is Asian

- Formerly worked with Alexander Kneepkens, Robbie Ceyssens, Dieter Kindlmann, Daniel Goffin and Philippe Dehaes
- Previously trained under Belgian Federation until early teens, also spent a year at the Mouratoglou Academy in Paris
- Mother is Liliane Barbe (teaches languages and history); father is Guido Mertens (makes furniture for churches). Began playing tennis at age 4, introduced to game by older sister Lauren, an airline pilot with KLM
- First tennis memory is watching Kim Clijsters playing live
- Was home schooled, enjoyed studying languages; speaks English, Dutch/Flemish and French
- Loves animals and has lots of pets at home
- In 2021, launched a charitable initiative to support the Virunga National Park's efforts to save the gorilla population in the Democratic Republic of Congo. During 2021 season she will be wearing a Virunga Ranger necklace and sporting a badge on her bag to help raise awareness
