Alycia Parks (USA #71) vs. [3] Diana Shnaider (#22)

Shnaider leads 2-1

Parks:

- Making Monterrey tournament debut
- Has reached the semifinal at a WTA 500 event for the first time
- Aiming to make her 2nd career WTA singles final, following her championship run at 2023 Lyon
- Her 2023 Lyon title run came on hard court, where she defeated No.5 Garcia in the final (her career-best win by ranking)
- Also seeking to become the first American to reach the final of this tournament

Shnaider:

- Making her 2nd appearance at Monterrey after falling 1r in 2023 to Mertens; d. Mertens in QF here this week
- Into her first semifinal since her title run at Hong Kong at the end of last year
- Seeking a trip to her 6th career WTA singles final; after losing her first Tour level final in 2023, she went 4-0 in WTA finals last year
- Two of her four WTA singles titles have come on hard court: Hua Hin 2024 (d. Zhu in F) and Hong Kong 2024 (d. Boulter in F)
- Career-best result at a WTA 500 event is winning the grass court title at Bad Homburg last year (d. Vekic in F)

Marie Bouzkova (CZE #53) vs. [2] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#14)

Alexandrova leads 2-0

Bouzkova:

- Making 5th main-draw appearance at Monterrey; career-best tournament result was finishing runner-up in 2020 (I. Svitolina in final)
- Has made her 2nd SF of the year, after lifting the 2025 Prague title (d. Noskova in F)
- Owns 20 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.20 Beatriz Haddad Maia in this week's 2r
- Both of her 2 WTA singles titles have come on hard court: Prague in 2022 and 2025
- Career-best showing at a WTA 500 event was finishing runner-up at 2024 Washington (I. Badosa in final)

Alexandrova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Monterrey; she also reached the SF last year (I. eventual finalist Sun)
- Aiming to reach her 10th career WTA singles final and 2nd of this year (won Linz title this February)
- Three of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court: 2020 Shenzhen, 2022 Seoul and 2025 Linz
- Best result at WTA 500 events is her title run at 2025 Linz (d. Yastremska in F)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.14; this time last year was ranked No.30

- Highlight of 2024 season was posting best Grand Slam result courtesy of run to 3r at Australian Open (l. Gauff). Also won two WTA 125 titles, at Warsaw and Gaiba
- Won first singles title in 2023 at Lyon (d. Garcia).
 In doubles won Cincinnati (w/Townsend) and achieved R-Up at Birmingham (w/Hunter).
- Contested three WTA main draws in 2022, highlighted by maiden QF at this level at Ostrava (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Krejcikova)
- In 2022, also made 2r at Berlin (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Jabeur) and finished the campaign with a 10-match winning streak that brought WTA 125K Series titles at Andorra and Angers
- Closed out 2021 with R-Up finish at W25 event in Daytona Beach-Fl, USA
- In 2021, also made 2r at Lausanne and fell 1r at US Open (as WC, l. Danilovic) and Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. Rus); struck 129mph serve during 1r defeat at US Open, matching V.Williams' record for the fastest serve in the tournament's history Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2021 Charleston [250] (as qualifier, l. Jabeur)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Charleston [250] (l. Vikhlyantseva in final round)
- Owns one ITF Circuit singles title from six finals, triumphing at \$25k Orlando-FL in November 2020 (also won doubles title)
- Made ITF Circuit debut at a \$15k event in Orlando-FL, USA in March 2017

- Won first four titles of career in 2024 across all three surfaces; WTA 500 Bad Homburg and WTA 250s Hua Hin, Budapest and Hong Kong. Reached her first Grand Slam 3r at 2024 Wimbledon and advanced to R16 at 2024 US Open
- Cracked into the Top 20 on August 12, 2024, where she stayed for the rest of the year finishing the season at World No.13
- Also in 2024, won the Paris Olympic silver medal in women s doubles with Mirra Andreeva
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2023
 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Sakkari in 3s)
 and Roland Garros 2023 (l. Haddad Maia)
- Won WTA 125K Series title in Montevideo, Uruguay last November to end 2022 just outside Top 100
- Overall win-loss record in 2022 was 56-17; reached four ITF Circuit finals, highlighted by a 15-match, three tournament winning streak, culminating with a W60 title in Istanbul
- Last season only Tour-level outing was qualifying exit at St. Petersburg
- Won first ITF Circuit tournament at W15 event in Antalya in late 2021
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Moscow
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior matches on ITF Circuit towards end of 2020
- As junior, made SF at Roland Garros in 2021 and US Open in 2022. Also won girls' doubles at three of the four majors and reached No.2 in the ITF rankings
