Sakkari leads 2-1

#### Maria Sakkari:

- A finalist in 2023 (I. Gauff), has received a wildcard into the main draw
- Owns 1 career singles title on hard court at Guadalajara in 2023, has further reached seven hard court finals
- Best results by wildcards at Washington DC were Champion runs by Paula Badosa in 2024 and Nadia Petrova in 2011
- Owns 52 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.6 Jasmine Paolini at Madrid 2025
- Holds a 2-11 win record against seeded players in 2025, wins coming in against No.6 Paolini and No.29
   Linette both at Madrid

#### Emma Navarro:

- Making debut appearance at Washington DC
- Owns 2 career singles titles on hard court, at Merida in 2025 and Hobart in 2024
- Has been involved in 16 three-set matches in 2025
- For the second time in the tournament's 13 years, the Top 2 seeds are Americans No.1 seed Jessica Pegula and No. 2 seed Emma Navarro (last time in 2019, No.1 seed Sloane Stephens and No.2 seed Madison Keys)

#### Elena Rybakina:


- Making debut appearance at Washington DC

- Entering Washington DC, holds second most aces (249) served on Tour in 2025

#### Victoria Mboko:

- Making debut appearance at Washington DC, as a wildcard
- Bidding to earn first match win against Top 20 player
- Faces a Top 20 player for the fourth time in her career, previous encounters include No.3 Gauff at 2025
   Rome, No.7 Zheng at 2025 Roland Garros and No.11 Badosa at 2025 Miami

- Defeated Danielle Collins in 1r this week, winning her first match since the Nottingham QF (snapped 3-match losing streak)
- 2 of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2019 Bronx and 2020 Hua Hin)
- The last Polish woman to make Washington QF was Linette herself in 2018

#### Kalinskaya:

- Making 3rd appearance at Washington, where she has never lost before QF; she made 2019 SF (as qualifier, I. eventual champion Pegula) and 2022 QF (I. eventual finalist Kanepi)
- Owns 43 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.3 Jessica Pegula at 2025 Strasbourg
- Owns 1-2 career tour-level record against players from Poland (that 1 tour-level win was over then-World No.1 Iga Swiatek in 2024 Dubai SF)
- Career-best showing at a WTA 500 event was runner-up finish at 2024 Berlin (I. Pegula in final)

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Key result of 2024 was reaching Indian Wells final for the second time, losing to Swiatek who also defeated her in 2022 final. Also reached SF at Charleston (l. Collins). Did not play after US Open
- Won first WTA 1000 title in 2023 at Guadalajara (d. Dolehide in F). Also finished R-Up at Washington (l. Gauff). Contested WTA Finals for third consecutive season (was first alternate and went 0-3 in Group Stage following Muchova withdrawal).
- Finished 2022 ranked No.6 for the second consecutive year; a four-time finalist in 2022 including runs to the final at two WTA 1000 tournaments 

   Indian Wells and Guadalajara [1000]; returned to the WTA Finals advancing to the semifinals, falling to eventual champion Caroline Garcia.
- Climbed as high as No.3 in the rankings (March 21, 2022), the highest ranking every achieved by a Greek woman.
- Historic 2021 season was highlighted by her becoming first Greek woman to break into the Top 10 (at No.10, September 27) as well as the first from her country to qualify for the WTA Finals.
- In 2021, also reached third WTA final at Ostrava (l. Kontaveit), while advanced to SF at Roland-Garros, US Open - defeating three Top-20 ranked opponents at both events - and WTA Finals in Guadalajara
- Posted a Tour-leading nine Top-10 wins in 2021, including two over the World No.2 (Osaka at Miami and No.2 Sabalenka at WTA Finals)
- Broke into Top 20 on February 24, 2020 for first time, at No.20
- Scored third and fourth Top-5 wins of her career in 2020, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic at St. Petersburg. Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final
- Highlights of 2018 were reaching her first tourlevel final at San Jose (l. Buzarnescu) and scoring maiden Top-5 win over No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Rome

- Voted 2024 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year Award, finished the year ranked No.8 with a singles record of 54-24, winning her first career title at 2024 Hobart; climbed to a year-end ranking at No.8 after finishing 2023 at No.38 (and No.143 in 2022)
- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay; Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng) and one semifinal on grass; Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova).
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tourlevel, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Broke into Top 200 for the first time on March 7, 2022
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA division 1 women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- In 2021, reached 2r at both Charleston [500] and Charleston [250]
- Fell 1r at 2020 Monterrey (l. Stephens)
- Only other events in 2020 came on ITF Circuit, ending year ranked No.463
- Owns three ITF Circuit titles in singles and one in doubles
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter Bowl
- Also R-Up in girls' doubles at 2019 Australian Open w/Beck

- Notched first Top-10 victory of career over No.6 Wozniacki en route to first WTA SF of career at 2017 Wuhan
- Broke into Top 50 for first time at No.49 on October 9, 2017
- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, l. Suarez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, l. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, l. Q.Wang)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2010; owns seven ITF Circuit singles titles and five in doubles
