Emma Raducanu (GBR #46) vs. [WC] Maria Sakkari (GRE #90)

Raducanu leads 3-0

Raducanu:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Washington D.C., where she has equaled her best result after also reaching QF in 2024 and 2022
- Defeated Marta Kostyuk and Naomi Osaka to reach third QF of 2025 (Queens and Miami)
- Seeking to reach her first Tour-level SF since Nottingham 2024 and first on hard court since Seoul 2022
- Holds a 3-0 career record against Sakkari (all in straight sets), two of which came on hard court (Dubai 2025 and US
 Open 2021)
- Record in Tour-level QF matches stands at 2-9 (2-5 on hard court)

Sakkari:

- Making 2nd main appearance at Washington D.C., where her previous result was reaching R-Up in 2023 (I. Coco Gauff)
- Defeated Katie Boulter and Emma Navarro so far this week to reach her first QF since QF at Linz 2025
- Looking to advance to first Tour-level SF since Charleston 2024. Last hard court SF appearance was Indian Wells 2024
- A win against Raducanu would represent her third straight victory against a Top 50 opponent. She previously did this in a single tournament at Madrid 2025 and last did so on hard court at Miami 2024
- Record in Tour-level QF matches stands at 33-14 (24-7 on hard court); has reached 22 WTA 500 QFs
- Owns 68 career wins at WTA 500 level events (68-52)
- Bidding for 17th WTA 500 SF appearance; only the following have reached more WTA 500 SF: Caroline Wozniacki (29),
 Angelique Kerber (23), Petra Kvitova (23), Daria Kasatkina (21) and Agnieszka Radwanska (18)

[3] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #12) vs. [5] Magdalena Frech (POL #24)

Rybakina leads 2-0

Rvbakina:

- Making main draw debut at Washington D.C.
- After a 1r bye, defeated Victoria Mboko in opening round to reach eighth Tour-level QF of 2025 (fifth on hard court). Her 8 QF appearances are tied for the second-most in calendar year, trailing only her success in 2024 (11)
- This year, only Iga Swiatek (11) and Aryna Sabalenka (10) have reached more QFs in 2025 (Mirra Andreeva also with 8)
- Holds 2-0 record against Frech with both coming on hard court (Dubai 2024 and WTA 125 Taipei 2018)
- Record in Tour-level QF matches stands at 32-18 (22-11 on hard court)
- Owns 65 wins at WTA 500 level events (65-33)

Frech:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Washington D.C., where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2023
- Defeated Yuliia Starodubtseva and Venus Williams so far this week to reach her first QF since QF at Wuhan 2024
- Owns seven wins (six on hard court) in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.7 Mirra Andreeva at Berlin 2025
- Looking to advance to third career Tour-level SF and first since her champion run at Guadalajara 2024
- Record in Tour-level QF matches stands at 2-6 (1-2 on hard court)

Leyla Fernandez (CAN #36) vs. [Q] Taylor Townsend (USA #97)

First meeting

Fernandez:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Washington D.C., where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2023
- Has beaten Maya Joint and Jessica Pegula so far this week to reach her first QF since QF at Nottingham 2025
- Seeking to advance to eighth career Tour-level SF and first since Hong Kong 2024
- Owns three career Tour-level hard court titles: Hong Kong in 2023 and Monterrey in 2022 and 2021
- Record in Tour-level QF matches stands at 8-11 (7-8 on hard court)

Townsend:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Washington D.C., where she has surpassed her previous best result of reaching 2r in 2024 and 2014
- Defeated Tatjana Maria and Sofia Kenin so far this week to reach her second career Tour-level QF and first since
 Toronto 2024. Has not advanced to a SF in her Tour-level career
- Owns 20 wins (18 on hard court) in her career over Top 50 players
- Seeking to win three consecutive matches against Top 50 opponents for the first time her career
- Has served a tournament-high 17 aces in first 2 main draw matches this week
- A qualifier has reached the QF stage in Washington DC five times with the best result coming in 2019 when Anna Kalinskaya reached the SF (to note, Wang Xiyu reached SF as a lucky loser in 2024)
- In the last two editions as a WTA 500 Townsend is third lowest player to reach the QF here, behind only No.176 Amanda Anisimova (QF in 2024) and No.131 Robin Montgomery (QF in 2024)
- With a win in the doubles SF, Towsend would move to the top of the PIF WTA Doubles Rankings; currently the World No.2 ranked doubles player, she is playing this week as the No.2 seed with Zhang Shuai

Anna Kalinskaya (#48) vs. [4] Clara Tauson (DEN #19)

Series tied 1-1

Kalinskaya:

- Making 3rd appearance at Washington DC, where she has never lost before QF stage; she made 2019 SF (as a qualifier,
 I. eventual Champion Pegula) and 2022 QF (I. eventual finalist Kanepi)
- Owns 19 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.3 Jessica Pegula at Strasbourg 2025
- Her career-best tour-level result on hard court was reaching WTA 1000 Dubai final in 2024 (I. Paolini)
- Career-best showing at a WTA 500 event was R-Up finish at 2024 Berlin (I. Pegula in F)

Tauson:

- Making 2nd appearance at Washington DC, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2022 (I. Petkovic)
- Owns 28 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently against today's opponent, No.39 Anna Kalinskaya at Wimbledon 2025
- All 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2021 Lyon, 2021 Luxembourg, and 2025 Auckland)
- Is currently ranked at career-high of World No.19; this time last year was ranked No.63; with a win today would climb to a career-best ranking of No.18; can climb as high as No.14 this week
- Has won 28 matches so far in 2025
- Currently leads the Tour in aces served (254), including 3 in her opening round win

CAREER MILESTONES

- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made fourth round of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023.
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best winby-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top-50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- · Owns three singles titles on ITF Circuit
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarter finals of Wimbledon and US Open in 2018

- Key result of 2024 was reaching Indian Wells final for the second time, losing to Swiatek who also defeated her in 2022 final. Also reached SF at Charleston (l. Collins). Did not play after US Open
- Won first WTA 1000 title in 2023 at Guadalajara (d. Dolehide in F). Also finished R-Up at Washington (l. Gauff). Contested WTA Finals for third consecutive season (was first alternate and went 0-3 in Group Stage following Muchova withdrawal).
- Finished 2022 ranked No.6 for the second consecutive year; a four-time finalist in 2022 including runs to the final at two WTA 1000 tournaments | Indian Wells and Guadalajara [1000]; returned to the WTA Finals advancing to the semifinals, falling to eventual champion Caroline Garcia.
- Climbed as high as No.3 in the rankings (March 21, 2022), the highest ranking every achieved by a Greek woman.
- Historic 2021 season was highlighted by her becoming first Greek woman to break into the Top 10 (at No.10, September 27) as well as the first from her country to qualify for the WTA Finals.
- In 2021, also reached third WTA final at Ostrava (l. Kontaveit), while advanced to SF at Roland-Garros, US Open - defeating three Top-20 ranked opponents at both events - and WTA Finals in Guadalajara
- Posted a Tour-leading nine Top-10 wins in 2021, including two over the World No.2 (Osaka at Miami and No.2 Sabalenka at WTA Finals)
- Broke into Top 20 on February 24, 2020 for first time, at No.20
- Scored third and fourth Top-5 wins of her career in 2020, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic at St. Petersburg. Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final
- Highlights of 2018 were reaching her first tourlevel final at San Jose (l. Buzarnescu) and scoring maiden Top-5 win over No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Rome

- Notched first Top-10 victory of career over No.6 Wozniacki en route to first WTA SF of career at 2017 Wuhan
- Broke into Top 50 for first time at No.49 on October 9, 2017
- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, l. Suarez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, l. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, l. Q.Wang)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2010; owns seven ITF Circuit singles titles and five in doubles

OTHER INFORMATION

- Only child, parents are Ian (Romanian) and Renee (Chinese). Born in Toronto and moved to Bromley, south of London, at the age of two
- Favorite shot is forehand and favorite surface is hard
- Started playing tennis aged five
- In the summer of 2021, completed her A-level exams in maths and English
- Has a wide variety of interests in sports such as go-karting, horse riding, tap dancing, golf, skiing and basketball
- Parents are Konstantinos and Angeliki; brother is Yannis (studies at Boston University) and sister is Amanda. Introduced to tennis by parents at age 6; mother played on WTA; achieved a Top 50 singles ranking
- Born and raised in Athens; moved to Barcelona at age 18 to train
- Favorite surfaces are hard and clay; favorite shot is serve
- Tennis idols are Serena Williams, Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer
- During free time enjoys going back to Greece and seeing friends.
