MAIN DRAW QUICK-HITS

Wildcards: Victoria Mboko, Naomi Osaka, Maria Sakkari, Venus Williams

Youngest singles player: Victoria Mboko (18) Oldest singles player: Venus Wiliams (45)

- The North American summer hard-court season kicks off on Monday, July 21 with the WTA 500 Mubadala Citi DC Open in Washington, D.C. More than \$1.2 million is at stake during the seven-day D.C. event, with the WTA singles champion collecting \$197,570. Just as important for the singles champion will be 500 points towards their PIF WTA Ranking and the Race to the WTA Finals Riyadh.
- This is the third consecutive year the tournament will be staged as a WTA 500 event; previously, the tournament was played at the WTA 250 level.
- This year's draw features two former PIF WTA World No.1s Naomi Osaka and Venus Williams (both wildcards).
- V.Williams will be contesting her first match in 16 months. The seven-time Grand Slam singles champion last played on tour at the Miami Open in March of 2024. At 45 years old, Williams is the oldest player in the draw and will be making her second appearance at the tournament (also in 2022).
- A finalist in 2023, Maria Sakkari also has received a wildcard into the main draw. Sakkari is currently ranked No.88.
- No.1 seed Jessica Pegula returns to Washington DC for the sixth time; Pegula won her first career singles title here at the tournament in 2019; she also won the doubles in 2022 (w/Routliffe).
- For the second time in the tournament's 13 years, the Top 2 seeds are Americans No.1 seed Pegula and No.2 seed Emma Navarro. The only other time it happened was in 2019 No.1 seed Sloane Stephens (R32) and No.2 seed Madison Keys (R32).
- Pegula (13-4) and Navarro (13-8) have both won 13 matches at the WTA 500 level, tied for the most on Tour this year, along with Ekaterina Alexandrova (13-5).
- Pegula has won three titles this year, including two titles at the WTA 500 level Charleston (clay) and Bad Homburg (grass). Her other title came at a WTA 250 event in Austin.
- No.4 seed Clara Tauson (251) enters the tournament leading the Tour in aces served. No.3 seed Elena Rybakina (249) is second on Tour in aces.
- Paula Badosa won last year's title, but the World No. 10 will not be back to defend her 2024 crown. Badosa pulled out earlier this week due to a back injury.
