[6] Mirra Andreeva (#7) vs. Ekaterina Alexandrova (#22)

First meeting

Andreeva:

- Making her Stuttgart debut and defeated her sister Erika Andreeva in the 1r via retirement
- Owns a 15-4 record against Top 50 players so far in 2025 with her most recent victory over No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in the final at Indian Wells
- Owns one singles title on clay at WTA 250 Iasi in 2024
- Has won 21 matches so far in 2025 and ranked fourth on Tour behind Pegula (25), Sabalenka (23) and Swiatek (22)

Alexandrova:

- Making a fifth appearance at Stuttgart, previously making quarterfinal in 2021 (l. Halep)
- Owns 17 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently No.8 Qinwen Zheng at Charleston 2025
- Recently equaled her best clay court result with SF at Charleston; also made SF at Madrid and Charleston in 2022
- Claimed her fifth career title this season at Linz (d. Yastremska in final)

[WC] Jule Niemeier (GER #121) vs. [5] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #6)

Paolini leads 2-0

Niemeier :

- Has reached 2r for the first time at Stuttgart after two 1r appearances in 2022 and 2023
- Her 1r win over Laura Siegemund was her second Tour level main draw match win of the season so far; also won her 1r Australian Open match
- Owns four career wins over Top 10 opponents, with one of those achieved on clay against Petra Kvitova at 2023 Madrid
- The Stuttgart title has been claimed by a wild card on two occasions: Siegemund in 2017 and Justine Henin in 2010

Paolini:

- Reached QF in her Stuttgart debut last season (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- Is 2-0 against players from Germany so far in 2025, defeating Eva Lys on both occasions (at Dubai and here in her 1r Stuttgart match)
- Undefeated against players ranked outside the Top 100 so far this season (4-0); her last loss to such player was in 2023 at Hamburg to No.225 Daria Saville
- Her best clay result to date is runner-up at 2024 Roland Garros and 2023 Palermo

Magdalena Frech (POL #28) vs. [3] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

Pegula leads 2-0

Frech:

- Making her main draw debut at Stuttgart, after competing in qualifying in 2018 and 2019
- Owns one career win over Top 10 players which she achieved over No.8 Emma Navarro at Wuhan 2024
- One of two players to make 2r along with Iga Swiatek
- Her best clay result was runner-up at Prague in 2024 (I. Linette in final)

Pegula:

- Making her Stuttgart debut
- Defeated Frech once before on clay at 2023 Madrid
- Best career result on clay is her recent title win at Charleston 2025
- One of three players to feature in the 2r along with Gauff and Navarro
- The last time three players from USA made Stuttgart 2r was 2003 (Capriati, Davenport and Rubin)

[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [LL] Ella Seidel (GER #124)

First meeting

Gauff:

- Making fourth appearance at Stuttgart with best result reaching QF last year
- Looking to reach second QF of the year
- Has won her last 15 matches against players outside Top 100; last loss came at 2023 Wimbledon to No.128 Sofia Kenin
- Has dropped first match of a tournament twice this year; however, has not done so at a clay tournament since falling 1r here in 2022

Seidel:

- Making main draw debut at Stuttgart, contested qualifying in 2023 and 2024
- Lost only other match against a Top 10 or 20 opponent falling to No.2 Aryna Sabalenka at 2024 Australian Open
- A win today would earn spot in first career WTA 500 QF and fourth QF of career
- Would be second QF of the year also advancing to final eight at Cluj-Napoca, her only other WTA main draw appearance this season

[7] Emma Navarro (USA #11) vs. Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #24)

First meeting

Navarro:

- Making debut appearance at Stuttgart
- Looking to reach fifth QF of the year but first on clay since 2023
- Beat fellow Top 20 player, Beatriz Haddad Maia in 1r
- Six of her eight losses this year have come to players outside the Top 20

Ostapenko:

- Making seventh appearance at Stuttgart, where her best result was reaching QF as No.4 seed in 2018
- Looking to reach second QF of the year after finishing R-Up at Doha and 10th career QF on clay
- Has gone 2-1 against Top 20 players this year with wins over No.4 Jasmine Paolini and No.2 Iga Swiatek, both in straight sets en route to Doha final

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached first two WTA finals of career in 2024 winning the title at Iasi and finishing runner-up at Ningbo
- Made first Grand Slam semifinal at 2024 Roland Garros beating World No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinals
- Made Top 20 debut on October 8, 2024 finishing the year at World No.16. Also won 2024 Paris Olympic silver medal in women's doubles with Diana Shnaider
- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell 1r on WTA main-draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneeva)

- In 2024, highlights included reaching the final at Linz (l. Ostapenko in Final) and semifinals at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Ostapenko), Miami (l. eventual champion Collins), 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Samsonova) and Monterrey (l. Sun); also made quarterfinals at Wuhan (l. Xin. Wang) and her best Grand Slam result of the season came during a 3r run at US Open (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- In 2023, won fourth career singles title at 's-Hertogenbosch, successfully defending the title and defeating top seed, Kudermetova in the final. A run of successful results followed with SF at Berlin (l. eventual champion, Kvitova), 4r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka) - a career best result at any of the majors and runner-up at Cleveland (l. Sorribes Tormo).
- Reached a 2023 peak ranking of No. 16 on February 20, 2023 following a 3r finish at Australian Open (l. Linette), before posting two QF results at Miami (l. eventual champion Kvitova) and Charleston (l. Bencic). Another QF then came in the Asian Swing at Tokyo (l. Pavlyuchenkova).
- In 2022, won titles at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Sabalenka in F) and Seoul (d. Ostapenko in F). Also advanced to SF at Charleston, Madrid and Ostrava, making Top-20 debut on October 10, 2022
- Reached third WTA singles final in 2021, enjoying run to final at home tournament of Moscow (l. Kontaveit). Other key result was SF run at Gippsland Trophy (l. Kanepi)
- Posted two best wins-by-ranking of career in 2021, defeating No.2 Halep (Gippsland Trophy) and No.2 Sabalenka (Moscow)
- Reached 2r on Olympic debut at Tokyo 2020
- Opened 2020 season by lifting her maiden WTA singles title, at Shenzhen (d. Rybakina in F)
- Won both singles rubbers on Billie Jean King Cup debut in 3-2 win over Romania in February 2020
- Made Top-50 debut on June 17, 2019 after QF run at 's-Hertogenbosch
- Registered 30 Tour-level match wins during 2019, in which she reached SF at Budapest, Seoul and Linz and made QF at St. Petersburg, 's-Hertogenbosch, Eastbourne and Moscow. Also advanced to 3r at a major for the first time, at Roland Garros
- Won sole WTA doubles title at 2019 Budapest (w/Zvonareva)

- Came through qualifying to make maiden WTA final appearance at 2018 Linz (l. Giorgi)
- Advanced to first WTA QF at 2018 Seoul, scoring maiden Top 10 win of her career en route, over No.10 Ostapenko
- Made Top-100 debut at No.93 on March 20, 2017 after winning title at \$60K ITF/Shenzhen-CHN
- At 2016 Wimbledon, ranked No.223, won her way through qualifying on her maiden Slam appearance, going on to reach 2r (upset No.23 seed Ivanovic in 1r)
- Won WTA 125K Series title at Limoges in 2016, 2018-19
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2016 Katowice (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Giorgi)
- Contested qualifying for the first time at a WTA-level tournament at 2014 Bad Gastein
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Europe in 2011
