McCartney Kessler (USA #31) vs. [6] Linda Noskova (CZE #17)

Tied 1-1

Kessler:

- Won most recent meeting against Linda Noskova at Miami this year
- Making 2nd appearance at Tokyo; on previous showing in 2024 reached 2r (l. Kasatkina)
- Best WTA 500 result is quarterfinal run at Ningbo last week (l. eventual finalist Alexandrova)
- Owns 4 career wins over Top 20 players, all coming in 2025: (d. No.18 Anisimova and No.3 Gauff at Dubai; No.5 M. Andrejeva at Montreal; No.18 Samsonova at Ningbo)
- Has won 31 tour-level matches so far in 2025; career-best for match wins in a single season (previous best was 8 wins in 2024)

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Tokyo; on previous showing in 2023, reached 2r (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Owns 15 wins in 2025 vs. Top 50 players, most recently defeated No.16 Osaka at Wuhan
- Her sole career WTA title came on hard court at Monterrey 2024
- In this year's Asian swing reached first WTA 1000 final at Beijing (l. Anisimova)
- Has won 35 tour-level matches so far in 2025; her career-best for match wins in a single season (previous best was 26 wins in 2024)

[9] Victoria Mboko (CAN #23) vs. [Q] Eva Lys (GER #50)

Mboko leads 1-0

Mboko:

- Won only meeting against Eva Lys at Roland Garros earlier this year
- Defeated fellow Canadian Bianca Andreescu in the first round to register first win since Montreal title run
- Owns 8 career wins over Top 50 players, 5 of which came during title run at WTA 1000 Montreal (No.2 Gauff, No.12 Rybakina, No.27 Kenin, No.39 Bouzkova and No.49 Osaka)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high of No.23; this time last year was ranked No.291
- Has won 14 tour-level matches so far in 2025; prior to this year had never won a tour-level match

Lys:

- Came through qualifying to make Tokyo main draw debut
- During this year's Asian swing, made first WTA 1000 QF at Beijing (l. Gauff) and fell in 2r at Seoul (l. Tauson)
- Owns 12 career wins over Top 50 players, including 3 during recent QF run at Beijing (No.10 Rybakina, No.37 Jovic and No.39 Kessler)
- Best career result on hard court is SF twice: Monastir 2024 (l. Mertens) and Cluj-Napoca 2023 (l. Cirstea)
- Has won 20 tour-level matches so far in 2025; this is her career-best for match wins in a single season (previous best was 9 wins in 2024)

Shnaider:

- Making 2nd appearance at Tokyo; on her previous showing in 2024, she reached the semifinal (l. eventual champion Zheng Qinwen)
- Reached the semifinal at Ningbo last week (l. Alexandrova), her second SF of the 2025 season after claiming the title in Monterrey (d. Alexandrova in final)
- Owns 11 wins in 2025 vs. Top 50 players, most recently No.28 Yastremska in 1r here
- Has won two WTA 500 singles titles in her career: 2024 Bad Homburg and 2025 Monterrey

Kalinskaya:

- Making 2nd appearance at Tokyo; on previous showing in 2023 fell in 1r (l. Alexandrova)
- Defeated lucky loser Suzan Lamens in the previous round to register her first win of this year's Asian swing
- Best WTA 500 result is runner-up twice: Washington DC 2025 (l. Fernandez) and Berlin 2024 (l. Pegula)
- Owns 5 wins in 2025 vs. Top 20 players, most recent was win over No.16 Alexandrova in Cincinnati

Maya Joint (AUS #32) vs. [8] Karolina Muchova (CZE #21)

First meeting

Joint:

- Making Tokyo tournament debut this week
- Owns 8 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.19 Diana Shnaider at 2025 Beijing
- Has a 1-1 tour-level record vs. players from Czech Republic, with both of those matches occurring in this year's Asian swing (d. L. Fruhvirtova at 2025 Seoul; l. Siniakova at 2025 Wuhan)
- Career-best tour-level results on hard court are semifinals at 2025 Hobart and 2025 Seoul
- Her SF at 2025 Seoul is her career-best performance at a WTA 500 event (l. eventual champion Swiatek)

Muchova:

- Making Tokyo tournament debut this week
- Advanced past her fellow Czech Marketa Vondrousova via retirement in 1r; this is the second straight week Muchova moved past Vondrousova in the 1r (after Ningbo)
- Holds a 10-11 record this year vs. Top 50 players
- 1 of 2 Czechs in this week's 2r (also Noskova); the last time 2 players from Czech Republic reached 2r at this event was 2018 (eventual champion Karolina Pliskova and Barbora Strycova)
- Her career-best results at WTA 500 events are SFs at Linz 2025, Ningbo 2024 & Moscow 2019

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2024 saw a breakthrough year, making her Tour-level main draw debut at Auckland (as a qualifier, l. Lulu Sun), winning her first Tour-level main draw match at the Australian Open and claiming her maiden title at Cleveland. She also claimed her first WTA 125 title at Puerto Vallarta and entered the Top 100 for the first time, peaking at No.63 on August 26, 2024.
- Reached WTA 125 series QF at Angers in 2023 (l. Yastremska)
- Lifted first ITF title in 2023 at Rome \$60K
- Played first Tour level matches as a wild card at 2023 US Open, where she won two qualifying matches before falling in the third and failed to make the main draw
- Reached first ITF final in 2021 at Lubbock \$15K
- Made ITF debut in 2016 at Charleston \$10K at the age of 17
- In 2024, achieved first Grand Slam singles quarterfinal at the Australian Open (l. Yastremska), where she also defeated then-World No.1 Iga Swiatek in the 3r; won her first singles title at Monterrey (d. Sun in F); reached SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Linette) and Brisbane (l. eventual champion Rybakina); earned a new career-high ranking of No.25 on August 26, 2024
- Breakthrough year in 2023, achieving runner-up twice; Adelaide 1 (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Prague (l. Hibino). Also reached quarterfinals at Lyon (l. Osorio) and 3r at Indian Wells (l. Gauff) and Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Gauff). Broke into Top 40 on October 9, 2023.
- Made Top-100 debut on August 1, 2022, following SF run at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova); overtook Gauff at the youngest player in Top 100
- Also reached 2r at Tallinn (as qualifier, l. Haddad Maia) and fell 1r at both Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Raducanu) and US Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova). On ITF Circuit, lifted fifth and sixth titles at this level, winning W60 tournament in Croissy-Beaubourg, France and W100 event in Versmold, Germany
- Finished 2021 campaign with 38-9 win-loss record, winning four ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 event in Prerov, Czech Republic
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2020 Prague
- On ITF Circuit, owns six titles in singles and one in doubles
- As a junior, won 2021 girls' singles at Roland Garros.
