**Ashlyn Krueger (USA #45) vs. Hailey Baptiste (USA #51)**

**Tied 1-1**

***Krueger:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan, and looking for her first win at the tournament after falling in 1r last season (l. Tomova)
- Career-best WTA 1000 result is R16, which she reached at Toronto 2024 (as a qualifier) and at Miami this year
- Has won 20 tour-level matches so far in 2025, with 15 of those achieved on hard court
- Best result by an American player at Wuhan was by Venus Williams, who won the title in 2015

***Baptiste:***

- Making her 2nd appearance at Wuhan; she reached R16 here last year as a qualifier (l. Alexandrova)
- Her R16 Wuhan performance last year equaled her career-best WTA 1000 result, having also reached R16 at 2023 Guadalajara (l. Garcia)
- Is 2-6 against her fellow American players this season, with both wins posted over Osuigwe (Montreal and Indian Wells)
- Career-best tour-level hard-court result is a QF finish at 2025 Auckland (l. eventual finalist Osaka)

**[Q] Katerina Siniakova (CZE #62) vs. [15] Diana Shnaider (#19)**

**Shnaider leads 1-0**

***Siniakova:***

- Making 6th appearance at Wuhan, where her best previous result was reaching QF in 2018 as a qualifier (l. eventual finalist Kontaveit)
- Both of her career-best WTA 1000 results were achieved in 2018 in China: back-to-back QFs at Wuhan and Beijing (as a qualifier both times)
- One of 4 players from Czech Republic in this week's main draw, along with Noskova, Muchova and Bouzkova
- Best results by the Czech Republic at Wuhan were by Petra Kvitova, who claimed the title in 2014 and 2016

***Shnaider:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan and looking for her first win at the tournament, after 1r loss in 2024 (l. Fernandez)
- Career-best WTA 1000 result is semifinal at 2024 Toronto (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Is 5-2 against qualifiers in 2025, with only losses to Parks at Doha and Parry at Wimbledon
- 3 of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court: Monterrey in 2025; Hong Kong 250 and Hua Hin in 2024

**Zhu Lin (CHN #253) vs. Maya Joint (AUS #36)**

**Joint leads 1-0**

***Zhu:***

- Making 2nd main-draw appearance at Wuhan, after reaching 1r as a qualifier in 2019 (l. Rybakina)
- Career-best WTA 1000 result is R16 at Montreal this year (l. Bouzas Maneiro)
- Her only Top 50 win of the season was over No.15 Ekaterina Alexandrova at Montreal (1-3 vs. Top 50 players this year)
- Best result by China at Wuhan was runner-up finish by Zheng Qinwen last year (l. Sabalenka in final)
- This is only her sixth tour-level hard-court main draw of 2025 after taking time away due to injury

***Joint:***

- Making her Wuhan debut appearance
- Her career-best WTA 1000 results are R32 showings this year at Cincinnati (l. Alexandrova) and last week in Beijing (l. Kartal)
- Has only faced two players from China so far this season, both at Singapore where she defeated today's opponent Zhu in qualifying (via retirement) before losing to Wang Xinyu in R16
- Best result by Australia at Wuhan was runner-up finish by Ashleigh Barty in 2017 (l. Garcia in final)
- In tour-level main-draw matches, holds a 7-1 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100

**[Q] Moyuka Uchijima (JPN #92) vs. Wang Xinyu (CHN #33)**

**Wang leads 1-0**

***Uchijima:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; last year, she came through qualifying to reach the main draw (l. 1r to lucky loser Rakhimova)
- Qualified for the Wuhan main draw again this year with wins over Alexandra Eala and Wang Xiyu
- Owns 8 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.39 Olga Danilovic at 2025 US Open
- Contesting her 13th career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 performance is reaching the 2025 Madrid QF (l. Svitolina)

***Wang:***

- Making her 2nd main-draw appearance at Wuhan; she reached the SF in her tournament main-draw debut last year (l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Contesting the 27th WTA 1000 main draw of her career; her career-best WTA 1000 showing was her SF run here last year
- Her career-best tour-level results on hard court are 8 semifinal finishes, including here last year and 3 times this year (Singapore, Prague and Cleveland)
- Winner of this match to face No.3 seed Coco Gauff in 2r

**First meeting**

***Alexandrova:***

- Making 3rd appearance at Wuhan, where her career-best showing is reaching last year's QF (l. Wang Xinyu)
- Contesting her 46th career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 finishes are 3 SFs (2022 Madrid, 2024 Miami and 2025 Doha)
- Has won 41 tour-level matches so far in 2025, 7th-most on tour this year
- So far in this year's Asian swing, made Seoul final (l. Swiatek), then lost opening match in Beijing (after 1r bye, l. Krejčíková)
- Currently at a career-high No.11 in the PIF WTA Singles Rankings

***Mboko:***

- Making her Wuhan tournament debut
- Contesting her 5th career WTA 1000 main draw; in just her 3rd career WTA 1000 main draw, she won the Montreal title on home soil earlier this year (d. Osaka in final)
- Has posted two Top 20 wins in her career, defeating No.2 Coco Gauff and No.12 Elena Rybakina during her 2025 Montreal title run (saving match point vs. Rybakina)
- Recently reached a career-high of No.23 in the PIF WTA Singles Rankings; this time last year was ranked No.319
- Best result by Canada at Wuhan was the runner-up finish by Eugenie Bouchard in the inaugural 2014 edition (l. Petra Kvitová in final)

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 made main draw at all four majors for the first time, posting her best career Slam result at US Open with 3r (l. Samsonova). Further notable results were reaching 3r at WTA 1000s Madrid, Toronto and Beijing and peaking at a career high of No.51 in September. Also claimed first career doubles title at WTA 500 Charleston with Sloane Stephens.
- In 2023, captured first career singles title in Osaka; did not drop a set en route to the title, defeating World No.35 and top seed Zhu Lin in the final. As a result of the title run, made Top 100 debut (week of September 18, 2023).
- Also reached tour level QF at 2023 S<sup>1</sup> Hertogenbosch (l. Hrucakova).
- Highlight of 2022 season was playing main draw Indian Wells, Miami, San Jose and US Open
- On ITF circuit in 2022, won title at W60 Evansville, IN, USA and reached final at W25 Sarasota, FL, USA
- In 2021, also received WC to Indian Wells, where she was defeated in 1r (l. Martincova)
- Fell 1r on Tour-level debut at 2021 US Open (as WC, l. Schmiedlova in 3s)
- Also made 2r as WC in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/Montgomery, l. Fernandez/Routliffe) WTA qualifying debut came at 2021 San Jose
- Earned wild cards into the singles and doubles draws at 2021 US Open after sweeping the USTA National Championships
- Best career result on ITF Circuit was coming through qualifying to reach SF on professional debut in 2019 at W15 event in Carson, CA, USA
- As a junior won 2020 Orange Bowl tournament as a wildcard. Also lifted girls' doubles title at 2021 US Open (w/Montgomery)

- In 2024 made Tour level R16 at Bogota, Seoul and Wuhan as well as reaching 2r at Roland Garros. Also made semifinal at WTA 125 Puerto Vallarta and broke into the Top 100 for the first time, achieving a career high ranking of No.80 in October.
- Won back-to-back main draw matches for the first time at 2023 Guadalajara 1000 reaching R16 (l. Garcia); also in 2023 fell 2r at Charleston and Washington DC, 1r at Miami and QF at WTA 125K Midland
- 2022 season including, 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara [250] (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet); also fell 1r at Indian Wells, Miami and Roland Garros and QF at WTA 125K Montevideo
- In 2021, came through qualifying to reach 2r at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Kenin), also reached 2r at Chicago [500] (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur). Fell 1r on three occasions including US Open Won doubles title at 2021 Charleston [250] w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- Played one main draw in 2020 at US Open in Grand Slam main draw debut falling to Kristina Mladenovic in 1r; also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Lexington
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as WC d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic)
- Also contested qualifying at US Open and on ITF Circuit won \$25k titles at Tucon, Sumter and Plantation
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017

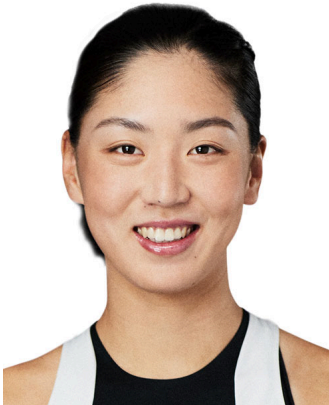

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024, highlights included reaching the final at Linz (l. Ostapenko in Final) and semifinals at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Ostapenko), Miami (l. eventual champion Collins), 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Samsonova) and Monterrey (l.
