[11] Naomi Osaka (JPN #16) vs. Leylah Fernandez (CAN #27)

Fernandez leads 1-0

Osaka:

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; in her previous appearance in 2017, she fell in 1r (l. Mertens)
- Owns 12 wins in 2025 over Top 50 players, most recently No.11 Muchova in US Open QF
- Is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2018 Indian Wells and 2019 Beijing
- Has won 27 tour-level matches so far in 2025 her most in a calendar year since winning 40 matches in 2019
- All of her 7 Hologic WTA Tour-level singles titles have come on hard court, including her four Grand Slam titles (2018 and 2020 US Open; 2019 and 2021 Australian Open)

Fernandez:

- Owns 1-0 record against Osaka, defeating her en route to the 2021 US Open final
- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; in her previous appearance in 2024 she reached 3r (l. eventual finalist Zheng Qinwen)
- Owns 4-5 record in 2025 against Top 20 players; her most recent Top 20 win was over Rybakina during title run in Washington DC
- Best result at a WTA 1000 event is QF three times: Cincinnati 2024, Doha 2024, Guadalajara 2023
- All 4 of her WTA titles have come on hard court: Washington DC 2025, Hong Kong 2023, Monterrey 2022 & 2021

Emma Raducanu (GBR #30) vs. Ann Li (USA #46)

Raducanu leads 1-0

Raducanu:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- Defeated Li in three sets in their only previous career meeting at Eastbourne this year
- Posted her career-best WTA 1000 result earlier this year by reaching quarterfinals at Miami (I. eventual finalist Pegula)
- Is currently ranked No.30, her highest ranking since August 2022 (following her career peak at No.10 in July 2022); this time last year was ranked No.57
- Is 6-5 against players from USA this year, losing her most recent encounter to Pegula at Beijing
- Her sole career title is lifting the 2021 US Open trophy on hard court; she became the first qualifier to win a Grand Slam title in the Open Era

Li:

- Making her Wuhan debut appearance
- Her career-best WTA 1000 result is R32 which she has reached four times, most recently 2025 Madrid
- Owns 13 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.19 Belinda Bencic at US Open 2025 en route to her first career Grand Slam R16
- Her only career title was won on hard court: Tenerife in 2021
- Is currently ranked No.46, close to her career high of No.44 first achieved on January 10, 2022; this time last year was ranked No.130

[14] Emma Navarro (USA #14) vs. [WC] Zhang Shuai (CHN #142)

Zhang leads 1-0

Navarro:

- Making 2nd Wuhan appearance, where she fell in her opening match as No.6 seed last year (I. Frech)
- Her career-best WTA 1000 result is reaching SF at Toronto 2024 (I. Anisimova)
- Posted her best WTA 1000 result of this season last week at Beijing with QF (I. Pegula)
- Is 2-0 against players from China in 2025 (d. Wang Xiyu at Australian Open, d. Wang Yafan at US Open)
- Will become the player with the most meetings against wild cards in 2025, with nine; she currently has a 5-3 record against wild cards this year
- Has an 8-2 record against players ranked outside the Top 100 so far this season (losses to No.124 Seidel at Cincinnati and No.113 Birrell at Brisbane)

Zhang:

- This is her 6th Wuhan appearance; her best previous result was R16 in 2018 (I. eventual finalist Kontaveit)
- Career-best WTA 1000 result is QF which she has reached five times; Beijing 2024, 2018 & 2016,
 Cincinnati 2022, Rome 2014
- Contesting her 80th career WTA 1000 main draw; she is the Chinese player with the most WTA 1000 main-draw appearances since the format's introduction in 2009
- Owns 22 wins in career over Top 20 players; her most recent Top 20 win came over today's opponent,
 No.8 Emma Navarro at Beijing 2024
- With her 2024 Beijing win over Navarro, Zhang became the lowest-ranked player (No. 595) to defeat a Top 10 opponent at the China Open since the inception of the tournament in 2004

Marie Bouzkova (CZE #41) vs. [2] Iga Swiatek (POL #2)

Swiatek leads 1-0

Bouzkova:

- Making 3rd Wuhan appearance, where her best previous result was reaching R32 in 2019 (I. Wang Oiang)
- Career-best WTA 1000 results are semifinals at 2022 Guadalajara and 2019 Toronto
- Owns 11 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently No.3 Aryna Sabalenka at Washington DC 2024
- Looking for her first Top 10 win of the season currently 0-6 vs. Top 10 players in 2025
- Holds an 0-7 career record vs. players ranked inside the Top 2 at the time of their meeting

Swiatek:

- Making her Wuhan tournament debut
- Won her only previous encounter with Bouzkova in straight sets at 2024 Roland Garros
- Owns 11 career WTA 1000 titles; her best WTA 1000 result this season is her title run in Cincinnati (d. Paolini in final)
- Looking to win her 31st consecutive opening match at WTA 1000 events
- Holds a 6-0 record vs. Czech players this season
- Aiming to become the first player to win 60+ WTA Tour-level matches for 4+ consecutive seasons since Martina Hingis (1997-2001) and Lindsay Davenport (1998-2001)

[5] Mirra Andreeva (#5) vs. Laura Siegemund (GER #57)

First meeting

Andreeva:

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan, where her previous result was reaching 2r last year (lost to her older sister Erika Andreeva)
- Won back-to-back WTA 1000 titles this year at Dubai (d. Tauson in final) and Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in final)
- By triumphing at Dubai 2025, Andreeva became the youngest player to win a WTA 1000 title since the format introduction in 2009
- Holds a 16-3 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 (the three losses were to Boisson at Roland Garros QF, Townsend in US Open 3r, and Kartal at Beijing R16)
- Two of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court both of her WTA 1000 titles at 2025
 Indian Wells and 2025 Dubai

Siegemund:

- Making 2nd main-draw appearance at Wuhan; her previous main-draw result was reaching 2r in 2016 (l. Cibulkova)
- Her best WTA 1000 result this season was reaching 3r at Rome (gave walkover to Ostapenko)
- Owns 12 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.8 Madison Keys at Wimbledon 2025
- Holds a 5-14 career record vs. Top 5 players, with her most recent Top 5 win coming over No.5 Zheng
 Qinwen at this year's Australian Open
- With a victory today, Siegemund would register three Top 10 wins in a calendar year for the first time since 2017 (she posted five Top 10 wins during that year)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Returned to play in 2024 following maternity leave and reached the QF at Doha and 's-Hertogenbosch, as well as R16 at Rome and Beijing
- Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023
 - In 2022 had success at Miami, where she fell to Swiatek in the final, her first final since the 2021 Australian Open. Also reached the semifinals at Melbourne 250 #1 (withdrew before semifinal with Kudermetova w/abdominal injury)
- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era
- At 2020 US Open, came from a set and a break down to Azarenka and win third Grand Slam title of career
- Also last season was R-Up at Western & Southern Open - withdrew w/left hamstring injury before final against Azarenka
- Won second Grand Slam at Australian Open (d. Kvitova in F); became first Japanese player to reach World No.1 ranking following the tournament
- In addition, won back-to-back titles for first time in her career at Osaka (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and Beijing (d. Barty in F); defeated No.1 Barty in Beijing final for second career victory over world No.1 (also beat Halep at 2018 Indian Wells)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2018, posting a 40-20 record resulting in a No.5 (first Top 10 season), up from No.68 in 2017
- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated fivetime major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16
- Reached one further final in 2018, at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (197, 122d)

- 2024 season highlights were reaching first final on grass finishing R-Up at Eastbourne (l. Kasatkina) and as part of title defence made SF at Hong Kong. Also reached final of Cincinnati in doubles w/ Putintseva
- In 2023, earned third career title at Hong Kong (d. Siniakova). Prevented from a consecutive title run by Siniakova who defeated her in Nanchang SF. Other notable results where quarterfinals at Guadalajara (l. Kenin), Cleveland (l. Maria) and Auckland (l. Bonaventure). Also defeated Paolini at Billie Jean King Cup Finals to lift title with Canada.
- Broke into the Top 20 in doubles in 2023, after reaching final at Roland Garros, Miami (both w/Townsend) and Auckland (w/Mattek-Sands) as well as QF at US Open (w/Townsend).
 - In 2022 won her second title at Monterrey (d. Osorio in F; saved 5MP), and reached the QF at Roland Garros (l. Trevisan); missed grass-court season due to grade three stress fracture in her right foot suffered during match vs. Trevisan in Paris
- Enjoyed a memorable 2021 campaign, lifting first career title in Monterrey and advancing to maiden Grand Slam final, at US Open (l. Raducanu)
- En route to the final at Flushing Meadows in 2021, upset defending champion and No. 3 Osaka in 3r, 2016 winner Kerber in R16, No.5 Svitolina in QF and No. 2 Sabalenka in SF, becoming the youngest woman to beat multiple Top-5 opponents at the same major since S. Williams at 1999 US Open
- Breakout year in 2020 saw her crack Top 100 for the first time on September 14 and finish campaign by reaching 3r at Roland Garros
- Earned first career Grand Slam win at 2020 US Open (d. Zvonareva, l. Kenin in 2r) and made Grand Slam debut at 2020 Australian Open as qualifier (l. Davis in 1r)
- Reached first career WTA final and notched first tour-level back-to-back wins at 2020 Acapulco as qualifier (l. Watson in F); at 17y, 177d, she was the youngest Canadian to reach a WTA singles final in 34 years (since Helen Kelesi at 1986 Tokyo [Japan Open] won at 16y, 338d)
- Also in 2020, earned first Top-100 win over No.5 Bencic in Billie Jean King Cup
- Owns one singles title and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit

- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 5 win of career when she defeated No.5 V.Williams at 2017 Hong Kong. Upset win over defending champion and No.6ranked Kerber at 2017 US Open marked first career Top 10 win
- Voted 2016 WTA Newcomer of the Year; highlight was career-first WTA final at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Wozniacki). Also reached QF on three occasions and 3r at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open
- Ranked No.406, made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Stanford. As an alternate, won through qualifying (achieving first WTA qualifying wins), and came from match point down to shock No.19 Stosur in 1r of main draw, before losing to No.18 Petkovic in 2r
- Made WTA qualifying debut at Quebec City in 2013 (l. Dabrowski)

- Won 2019 Roland Garros junior's title (d. Navarro) becoming first Canadian to win a junior Grand Slam since Bouchard in 2012
- Played first WTA main draw and earned first main draw win of career at 2018 Quebec City defeating countrywoman Dabrowski in 1r (l. Watson in 2r)
- Member of Canadian Billie Jean King Cup Team 2019, 2021-22
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in USA in 2016


