

- Jessica Pegula can qualify outright, regardless of other results, if she wins the title this week
- With a win in her opening round match, Jasmine Paolini has a chance to move into the Top 8 today and overtake Elena Rybakina
- Should both Paolini and Rybakina win their opening match, Rybakina will need to finish a round ahead of Paolini this week to stay ahead in the Leaderboard

Hailey Baptiste (USA#55) vs. [6] Jessica Pegula (USA#7) Baptiste:

Pegula leads 2-0

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; she made R16 here last year as a qualifier (I. Alexandrova); her R16 Wuhan performance equaled her best WTA 1000 result, also reaching R16 at 2023 Guadalajara (I. Garcia)
- Holds 1-5 career record against Top 10 opponents, most recently No.10 Barbora Krejcikova at Wuhan 2024
- Could defeat the highest ranked opponent in her career today against No.6 Jessica Pegula
- Has won 20 matches so far in 2025 more than in her entire career combining her previous six seasons on Tour (18 in total)

Pegula:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wuhan, where her previous and best result was reaching 3r in 2024 (I. X. Wang)
- She is a 3-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2022 Guadalajara, 2023 Montreal and 2024 Toronto
- Has won her last nine WTA level meetings against American opponents, with the last loss coming in Adelaide's final vs. Madison Keys
- Has won 46 matches so far in 2025, ranked No.3 on tour for match, behind Aryna Sabalenka, Iga Swiatek
- Only Iga Swiatek and Aryna Sabalenka have claimed more hard court wins than Jessica Pegula (31) in 2025

[Q] Moyuka Uchijima (JPN#91) vs. [3] Coco Gauff [USA#3) Uchijima:

Gauff leads 1-0

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2024 (I. Rakhimova)
- Best WTA 1000 result this season was reaching QF at Madrid (I. Svitolina)
- Holds 1-6 career record against Top 10 players, with only win coming against No.3 Jessica Pegula at Madrid 2025
- The only qualifier/lucky lose to defeat Top 3 player at Wuhan is Johanna Konta in 2015 (d. Simona Halep) and Monica Puig in 2018 (d. Caroline Wozniacki)
- Last time a player from Japan reached 2r at Wuhan was 2016

Gauff:

- Has qualified for WTA Finals
- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan, where previous result was SF in 2024 (I. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2023 Cincinnati and 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in both finals)
- Best WTA 1000 result this season is reaching the final at Madrid (I. Sabalenka) and Rome (I. Paolini)
- Is 17-3 against opponents ranked 50+ during the 2025 season with her only losses coming against Victoria Mboko at Montreal, Belinda Bencic at Indian Wells, and McCartney Kessler at Dubai
- Since 2023, Coco Gauff has 17 wins on Chinese soil at WTA level, only Qinwen Zheng (17) has more during that period in such events

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Rebecca Sramkova (SVK #68)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Has qualified for the WTA Finals and remains in contention for year-end No.1 Ranking
- Making 4th appearance at Wuhan; she is the 3-time defending champion, winning titles at the last three editions (2018-19, 2024)
- Her Wuhan career record currently stands at 17-0
- Contesting her first match since winning her 4th career Grand Slam title at the 2025 US Open
- Holds 18-1 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 (the 1 loss was to eventual champion Vondrousova in Berlin SF)
- At the WTA 1000 events in China last year, Sabalenka won the Wuhan title (d. Zheng Qinwen in final) and reached Beijing QF (l. eventual finalist Muchova)
- She is a 9-time WTA 1000 champion, including two WTA 1000 titles this year (Miami and Madrid)

Sramkova:

- Playing the Wuhan event for the first time in her career
- Her Ir win over Anna Kalinskaya snapped a 3-match losing streak (before this week, her most recent win came over Fernandez in Monterrey 2r in August)
- Seeking her first career Top 10 win (currently 0-5 vs. Top 10 players at tour-level events); this is her first time facing a reigning World No.1 player
- Career-best result on hard court is her title at Hua Hin #2 last year (d. Siegemund in final)
- Best result by a Slovakian player at Wuhan was R-Up finish by Dominika Cibulkova in 2016 (I. Kvitova in final)
- Career-best WTA 1000 results are R16 showings at 2024 Rome and 2025 Doha

[7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #8) vs. [WC] Yuan Yue (CHN #109) *Paolini:*


Paolini leads 3-0

- Remains in contention to qualify for WTA Finals; currently sits at No.9 on the Leaderboard; with a win today, would move ahead Rybakina to No.8 spot
- Rematch of last year's Wuhan 2r, which is Paolini's only straight-sets win over Yuan in their 3 meetings
- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; reached QF last year in tournament debut (I. eventual finalist Zheng Qinwen)
- 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2024 Dubai (d. Kalinskaya in F) and 2025 Rome (d. Gauff in F)
- Holds 8-1 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (the 1 loss was to Ito at Montreal)
- Only Iga Swiatek (27) and Aryna Sabalenka (24 before Wuhan 2r) have won more WTA 1000 matches in 2025 than Paolini (23)

Yuan:

- Making 2nd main-draw appearance at Wuhan; she lost to Paolini in the same round last year
- Career-best WTA 1000 result is the 2024 Indian Wells QF (I. Gauff)
- Holds 1-10 career record vs. Top 10 players, with her one Top 10 win coming over No.8 Zheng Qinwen at 2024 Indian Wells (0-7 vs. Top 10 players since then)
- Her I career WTA singles title has come on hard court: 2024 Austin
- Among Chinese players, only Zheng Qinwen (20) and Wang Xinyu (19) have won more tour-level matches than Yuan (8) so far this season

Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #48) vs. [8] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #9)

Rybakina leads 2-1

Cristian:

- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; last year she also reached 2r (I. eventual finalist Zheng Qinwen)
- Defeated McCartney Kessler in 1r this week, snapping a 3-match losing streak (before this week, her last win was over Krueger in US Open 2r)
- Holds 1-10 career record vs. Top 10 players, with her one Top 10 win coming over No.10 Krejcikova at 2024 Beijing
- One of 2 players from Romania in this week's main draw along with Cirstea; they both reached 2r

Rybakina:

- Remains in contention to qualify for WTA Finals; enters the tournament at No.8; if Paolini wins today, would slide to No.9 (even with a win; needs to earn more than 108 points this week to add to her total)
- Making 2nd appearance at Wuhan; she reached the QF as a wild card in 2019 (I. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2023 Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in final) and 2023 Rome (d. Kalinina in final)
- Has a 26-6 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 40 (at tour-level events)
- 4 of 9 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court; her most recent hard-court title is 2024 Abu Dhabi
- This year's tour leader in total aces (394) and percentage of service games won (81.0%)

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 made Tour level R16 at Bogota, Seoul and Wuhan as well as reaching 2r at Roland Garros. Also made semifinal at WTA 125 Puerto Vallarta and broke into the Top 100 for the first time, achieving a career high ranking of No.80 in October.
- Won back-to-back main draw matches for the first time at 2023 Guadalajara 1000 reaching R16 (l. Garcia); also in 2023 fell 2r at Charleston and Washington DC, 1r at Miami and QF at WTA 125K Midland
- 2022 season including, 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara [250] (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet); also fell 1r at Indian Wells, Miami and Roland Garros and QF at WTA 125K Montevideo
- In 2021, came through qualifying to reach 2r at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Kenin), also reached 2r at Chicago [500] (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur). Fell 1r on three occasions including US Open Won doubles title at 2021 Charleston [250] w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- Played one main draw in 2020 at US Open in Grand Slam main draw debut falling to Kristina Mladenovic in 1r; also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Lexington
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as WC d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic)
- Also contested qualifying at US Open and on ITF Circuit won \$25k titles at Tucon, Sumter and Plantation
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017

- In 2024, won two singles titles Toronto (WTA 1000) and Berlin en route to year-end ranking of No.7, her third-straight year-end Top 10 finish; two-time runner-up at Cincinnati and US Open; joined Rosie Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013) as the only women in the Open Era to make the final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in the same season
- Also qualified for the 2024 WTA Finals (withdrew during round-robin play due to left knee injury)
- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun.
 - In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open.
- Achieved career-high No. 3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Fort Worth in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
- Reached QF at three of the four majors in 2022, breaking into Top 10 after doing so at Roland Garros (June 6, 2022)
- One of seven players to win 40 or more matches in 2022, alongside Swiatek, Jabeur, Garcia, Sakkari, Kasatkina and Bencic
- In 2021, reached the QF or better on seven occasions, including at the Australian Open
- Broke into Top 20 on November 1, 2021
- Began 2020 with runner-up finish at Auckland (l. S.Williams), other standout results were a QF at Western & Southern Open (as qualifier, l. Mertens) and a 3r showing at US Open (l. Kvitova)
- On the doubles court in 2020, reached QFs of Roland-Garros (w/Muhammad) and Cincinnati (w/Rogers)
- Won her first WTA title at 2019 Washington DC (d. Giorgi in F)
- Also in 2019, fell 1r on main draw debut at Roland-Garros (l. eventual champion Barty) and Wimbledon (l. Buzarnescu) and Miami (as a qualifier, l. Konta)
- Broke into Top 100 for the first time on February 4, 2019 following back-to-back R-Up finishes at

- WTA 125K Series event at Newport Beach and W100 ITF Circuit tournament in Midland-MI, USA
- Highlights of 2018 included finishing R-up as a qualifier at Quebec City (l. Parmentier in F), recording SF finish at Houston WTA 125K Series tournament (l. S.Peng) and reaching QF or better at 10 ITF events
- Did not play between January and August 2017 after undergoing hip surgery. Primarily played at ITF Circuit events for the rest of the year, winning two doubles titles with Townsend
