- Tournament's 11th edition, having made debut appearance on the Hologic WTA Tour in 2015. Past singles winners include Magda Linette (2024), Nao Hibino (2023) and Marie Bouzkova (2022)
- This year's field is led by No.1 Linda Noskova. Making her fourth appearance at Prague, Noskova is looking to breakthrough with her first title at Prague after appearing in the final in 2023 and the semifinal in each of the last three editions (2024, 2023 and 2022)
- The No.2 seed is China's Xinyu Wang. A semifinalist at Prague in 2021, Wang is seeking her first Tour-level title
 after making her first final on Tour at Berlin earlier this season

- Slovakia's Rebecca Sramkova is the No.3 seed. Entering the main draw for the second time at Prague, Sramkova has made runs to the final in three of her last five WTA 250-level events on hard court
- Dayana Yastremska of Ukraine rounds out the Top 4 seeds. Already with one appearance in a final on hard court in 2025 (Linz), Yastremska is seeking her third career Tour-level hard court title after champion runs at Hua Hin in 2019 and Hong Kong in 2018
- Czech Republic leads the tournament with nine representatives in the main draw (Sara Bejlek, Marie Bouzkova, Lucie Havlickova, Linda Noskova, Barbora Palicova, Dominika Salkova, Laura Samson, Katerina Siniakova and Tereza Valentova), with Valentova as the only one of the group making her tournament main draw debut. In total, five players from Czech Republic have won the title at Prague, including Bouzkova in 2022
- In doubles, the field is led by the No.1 seed Nadiia Kichenok of Ukraine and Makoto Ninomiya of Japan. Kichenok is making her third doubles appearance at Prague (2016 with Lyudmyla Kichenok and 2017 with Eva Hrdinova) while Ninomiya is making her second (2019 with Yana Sizikova)
