- This is the debut edition of the Singapore Tennis Open in Singapore's first WTA event since hosting the WTA Finals from 2014-2018.
- The field is led by No.1 seed, Anna Kalinskaya, who will face Caroline Dolehide in the opening round and is seeking her first win of the 2025 season.
- No.2 seed, Elise Mertens, has already reached a final this year finishing runner-up in Hobart (l. Kessler in F).
- The No.3 seeded position is held by Amanda Anisimova, whingao is playing the event with a wildcard, will take on China's Xiyu Wang in the first round.
- China's Xinyu Wang rounds out the Top 4 seeds.
- Other notable players in this year's field are: 2021 US Open champion, No.7 seed Emma Raducanu, taking on Spain's Cristina Bucsa in the first round; and No.5 seed Polina Kudermetova, who just reached her first career final last month at WTA 500 Brisbane (l. Sabalenka in F)
- The doubles field is led by No.1 seeds Caroline Dolehide and Taylor Townsend, with Townsend competing in double's final at Australian Open (w/Siniakova)
