- 2025 grass season starts, with first events kicking off at London and 's-Hertogenbosch this week
- Tournament is making debut appearance on Hologic WTA Tour, the first women's professional tennis event at Queen's Club since 1973
- This year's field features three Top 10 players and in total ten Top 20 players, led by world No.7 Qinwen Zheng who has come off career first QF run at Roland Garros. The top seed's best result on grass was R16 run at Berlin 2024 (I. Siniakova)
- World No.8 Madison Keys is No.2 seed. The Australian Open champion owns three singles titles on grass at Eastbourne 2014 and 2023, Birmingham 2016

- World No.9 Emma Navarro is No. 3 seed. Navarro’s best result on grass was R-Up at Bad Homburg 2024
- 2022 Wimbledon Champion, world No.11 Elena Rybakina rounds out the Top 4 seeds
- There are two other former Wimbledon champions in this year’s field: Petra Kvitova, who won Wimbledon in 2011 and 2014, returned to play after maternity leave since Austin 2025. Kvitova also owns another four singles titles on grass at Birmingham 2017-2018, Eastbourne 2022 and Berlin 2023. Barbora Krejčíková, who won Wimbledon in 2024, is playing her second tournament of 2025 season, after Strasbourg in May.
- The 2021 US Open champion Emma Raducanu entered the tournament with a wildcard. Her best result on clay was SF run at Nottingham 2024 (l. Boulter)
- The other three wild cards are also granted to the home country’s players: Jodie Burrage, Sonay Kartal, Francesca Jones
- In doubles, Lyudmyla Kichenok and Erin Routliffe lead the field as No.1 seeds; Anna Danilina and Diana Shnaider are No.2 seeds, with Danilina entering off the back of R-Up performance at Roland Garros (w/Krunic against Errani/Paolini in final) while Shnaider reached SF there w/ M. Andrejeva
