Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #164) vs. [Q] Wang Xinyu (CHN #49)

First meeting

Vondrousova:

- Into her first WTA singles final since she won the 2023 Wimbledon title
- At No.164, is the lowest-ranked Berlin finalist, and aiming to become the lowest-ranked Berlin champion (Liudmila Samsonova won this title as a No.106-ranked qualifier)
- This week is the 2nd time she has defeated 3 Top 20 players at a single tournament (1st time was her 2023 Wimbledon title run)
- Her SF win over Sabalenka was her first victory over a reigning World No.1 (previously 0-3 vs. reigning World No.1 players)
- Seeking to become 2nd Czech in 3 years to win the Berlin title (Petra Kvitova was the 2023 champion)

Wang:

- Into her first WTA singles final of career (previously 0-6 in WTA singles SFs)
- Making 4th appearance at Berlin; successfully qualified for the main draw in each of the last 4 editions
- Defeated 4 Top 20 players in a row to make the final; before this week, she had never posted multiple Top 20 wins at a single tournament
- Only player from China in this week's main draw, and the first Chinese player to reach the Berlin final
- Aiming to become the first qualifier to win this title since Liudmila Samsonova in 2021 (Wang beat Samsonova in Saturday's SF)

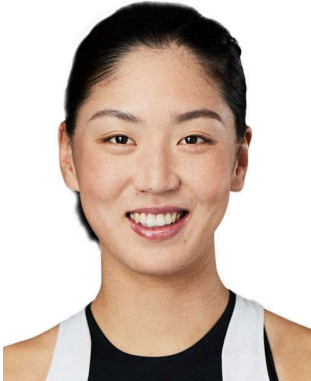

PLAYER NOTES

- Making 4th appearance at Berlin; her best previous result was reaching the QF in 2023 (L. Sakkari)
- Has beaten No.7 seed Madison Keys, Diana Shnaider, Ons Jabeur and No.1 seed Aryna Sabalenka so far this week, reaching her first final since she won the 2023 Wimbledon title
- Faces No.49 Wang Xinyu in today's final; owns 74 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in the previous round
- Her SF win over Sabalenka was her first victory over a reigning World No.1 (previously 0-3 vs. World No.1 players at the time of their meetings)
- This week is the 2nd time she has defeated 3 Top 20 players at a single tournament (1st time was her 2023 Wimbledon title run)
- Owns 3-4 career tour-level record against players from China (0-0 in 2025)
- Holds a 2-4 record in WTA singles finals, with her 2 titles coming at 2017 Biel (WTA 250 on hard court) and 2023 Wimbledon (Grand Slam on grass)
- Her career-best grass-court result was her run to the Wimbledon title in 2023 as an unseeded player (d. Jabeur in final)
- This week marks her first final at a WTA 500-level event
- Aiming to become 2nd Czech in 3 years to win the Berlin title (Petra Kvitova was 2023 champion)
- Is currently ranked No.164; this time last year was ranked a career-high No.6
- Has become the lowest-ranked Berlin finalist, and would become the lowest-ranked champion, surpassing 2021 champion Samsonova, who won this title as a qualifier ranked No.106
- During last year's grass swing, reached Berlin 2r, then lost 1r in Wimbledon title defense (L. Bouzas Maneiro)

- Making 4th appearance at Berlin; successfully qualified for main draw in all of the last 4 editions and previously reached R16 in 2022 (L. Gauff)
- After qualifying for main draw, defeated Daria Kasatkina, No.2 seed Coco Gauff, No.8 seed Paula Badosa (via retirement) and Liudmila Samsonova so far this week to make her first WTA singles final
- Before Saturday, was 0-6 in WTA singles semifinals
- Defeated 4 Top 20 players in a row to make the final; before this week, she had never posted multiple Top 20 wins at a single tournament
- Faces No.164 Marketa Vondrousova in today's final; Wang is 6-3 vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 this year
- Owns 1-7 career tour-level record against players from Czech Republic (0-0 in 2025)
- Before this week, her career-best tour-level results on grass were R16 showings at 2022 Berlin and 2024 Wimbledon
- Only player from China in this week's main draw, and the first Chinese player to reach the Berlin final
- Aiming to become the first qualifier to win this title since Liudmila Samsonova in 2021 (Wang beat Samsonova in Saturday's SF)
- Is currently ranked No.49; this time last year was ranked No.40. Reached career-high No.32 for the first time in 2023
- During last year's grass swing, lost 1r at Berlin and Eastbourne but made R16 at Wimbledon

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 reached QF at Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek); further highlights included semifinal at Stuttgart and quarterfinals at Strasbourg and Dubai. Ended her season after Wimbledon through shoulder injury
- Following injury issues in second half of 2022, bounced back in 2023 for best-ever season, winning debut Slam title at Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F - becoming the first unseeded player in the open era to claim the Wimbledon title), making Top 10 debut and qualifying for first WTA Finals.
- Best result of 2022 season was SF run at Dubai (withdrew prior to match vs. w/right adductor injury). Missed most of second half of the season due to left wrist injury, returning in October to play a few ITF Circuit events and Billie Jean King Cup Finals
- Finished 2021 with SF runs at Luxembourg, Chicago [500] and Moscow
- Won silver medal in singles at Olympics in Tokyo (l. Bencic)
- Opened 2021 campaign with SF at Yarra Valley Classic before R16 showing at Australian Open
- Highlights of 2020 include defeating No.6 Svitolina to reach SFs at Rome (l. Ka.Pliskova) as well as a QF run to kick off the season at Adelaide (l. No.1 Barty)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2019, reaching three finals across the year and posting career-high ranking of No.14 on July 1, 2019
- Finished R-Up at Budapest (l. Van Uytvanck) and Istanbul (l. Martic) before reaching championship match at Roland Garros (l. Barty); did not drop a set en route to final in Paris
- Ranked No.38, was joint-third lowest-ranked woman to reach Roland Garros final, and aged 19, was first teenager to reach title match there since Ivanovic in 2007
- Posted first win of career over a Top 2 player in 2019, defeating No.2 Halep at Indian Wells and then Rome
- Forced to end 2019 season down early due to left wrist injury - did not play again following 1r exit at Wimbledon
- In doubles, has reached SF at 2019 Australian Open (w/Strycova) and QF at 2017 Wimbledon (w/Bellis)
- At 2018 US Open, became the first teenager to reach the last 16 at Flushing Meadows since 2016 (Konjuh, QF - 18) and the youngest Czech player to advance to this stage in New York since 2005 (Vaidisova, R16 - 16)

- In 2024, made her best to date run at a Grand Slam by reaching R16 at Wimbledon; also made her first WTA 1000 semifinal at Wuhan and a second semifinal at WTA 250 Hua Hin
- Dramatically improved her ranking across 2023 season, making Top 50 debut in September and hitting No.32 in October. Posted best result at three of the four Slams, including R16 run at Roland Garros. Also reached semifinals at Hua Hin and Osaka (l. Zhu both times).

In doubles, claimed Roland Garros title (w/Hsieh) and runner-up at Hua Hin (w/Zhu) and Merida (w/Wu), with her doubles ranking peaking at No. 18 on September 11, 2023.

- Reached 2r on six occasions in 2022, including at Australian Open (l. Sabalenka). Also won sixth career ITF Circuit title, at W60 event in Tokyo in November
- Made Top 100 debut on November 15, 2021
- Highlight of 2021 was SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Krejckikova). Also advanced to QF at Courmayeur (l. Vekic) and Linz (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Riske)
- In 2020, fell 1r at Shenzhen (l. Muguruza) and Hua Hin (l. Liang)
- Opened 2019 season with maiden Tour-level main draw win at Shenzhen Open (d. F.Xun, l. Sharapova), went on to post two more 2r runs at Nanchang (l. Rybakina) and Tianjin (as qualifier, l. Peterson)
- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2019 Nanchang w/L.Zhu (d. Peng/Zhang in F)
- Won three consecutive ITF titles in 2019, at \$25K ITF/Shenzhen 2-CHN (d. F.Xun in F), \$25K ITF/Hengyang-CHN (d. Z.Sun in F) and \$25K ITF/Tianhin-CHN (d. Jovic in F)
- In 2018, won maiden title of career at \$25K ITF/Nonthaburi 4-THA (d. Wang Xiyu in F)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Australian Open (l. Cornet in 1r)
- Also in 2018, contested qualifying on WTA Tour for the first time at Shenzhen Open and competed in maiden WTA main draw at Guangzhou (l. Khazaniuk)
- Advanced to 2r on professional debut at \$10K ITF/Prokuplje 2-SRB in 2016 (as qualifier, l. Zakarlyuk)

- Was the biggest ranking mover on tour in 2017, moving from No.376 to No.67 (309 places)
- Made WTA breakthrough by winning International-level title at 2017 Biel/Bienne (d. Kontaveit in F), in just her second WTA main draw. At No.233, was the lowest-ranked title winner in 2017 and aged 17 years, 293 days was the youngest since Konjuh (17 years, 169 days) at 2015 Nottingham
- Advanced to 2r on tour-level debut at 2016 Prague - as wildcard
- Made professional debut at 2014 \$100k ITF/Prague-CZE (d. Suk, l. Brengle in 2r); on ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles and four doubles titles
- In juniors won doubles at Australian Open and Roland Garros in 2015 (both w/Kolodziejova). In singles, was semifinalist at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon and rose to No.1 on ITF junior rankings in 2015

OTHER INFORMATION

- Coached by Jan Hernych
- Lives and trains in Prague; moved to the city on her own to train at 15 years old
- Began playing tennis at 4 years old with her father, David Voudrouš, and by 10-years-old she was practicing in Prague. Mother, Jindriska Anderlova played volleyball in the top Czech league
- Married partner Stepan Simek in the summer of 2022
- Favorite surface is clay because she grew up on it, but believes her game is more suited for hard courts
- Chose tennis over soccer because she prefers the individual nature of the sport
- Tennis idol is Roger Federer
- Has a Sphinx cat named Frankie
- Describes herself as "quiet" and "calm"

- Father, Peng Wang, is a former professional player and Fed Cup captain, mother is Jinghui Zhou
- Started playing tennis with father at the age of six. Describes her game as "aggressive and decisive"
- Best moment in tennis to date was playing Maria Sharapova at Shenzhen in 2019
- Favorite surface is hard and favorite tournaments are the Australian and US Opens
- Li Na was her role model growing up
- Long-term goal is to win a Grand Slam
- Passions away from the court are yoga and food. Favorite book is Little Women, movie is The Hunger Games and musician is Jay Chou
- Words she would use to describe herself are "peace and love".
