MAIN DRAW QUICK-HITS

Wildcards: Bianca Andreescu (CAN), Eva Lys (GER), Naomi Osaka (JPN)

Youngest singles player: Mirra Andreeva (18) Oldest singles player: Jessica Pegula (31)

- Tournament's fifth edition in the second week of 2025 grass season, along with Nottingham
- Strong field with nine Top 10 players in the field and in total Top 20 players, led by world No.1 Aryna Sabalenka. The top seed's best result at Berlin was QF run in 2024 (I. Kalinskaya), while she made two finals on grass at Eastbourne 2018 (I. Wozniacki) and 's-Hertogenbosch 2022 (I. Alexandrova)
- World No.2 Coco Gauff is No.2 seed. The Newly crowned Roland Garros champion reached SF twice here at Berlin 2024 (I. eventual champion Pegula) and in 2022 (I. eventual champion Jabeur), which is also her best run on grass

- Defending champion Jessica Pegula returns as No.3 seed, making 3rd appearance at Berlin, having also reached QF in 2021 on her tournament debut
- World No.4 Jasmine Paolini is making tournament debut. Paolini owns an 8-2 record during 2024 grass season, achieving her career best result on grass at Wimbledon 2024 (R-Up), also reached SF at Eastbourne 2024.
- There are another three former Grand Slam champions in the field: 2022 Wimbledon Champion, world No.11 Elena Rybakina, playing her opening match against China's Qinwen Zheng, who has just come off her first career SF run on grass in London; 2019 US Open champion Bianca Andreescu and the four-time champion Naomi Osaka (US Open 2018, 2020 and Australian Open 2019, 2021) are both playing the tournament with wildcards
- The third wild card goes to the home country's Eva Lys, who faces No.8 seed Paula Badosa in first round
- In doubles, the newly crowned Roland Garros doubles champion Sara Errani/ Jasmine Paolini are leading the field as No.1 seeds, taking on Kostyuk/Lys in first round
