- Tournament's 5th edition, having made debut appearance on the Hologic WTA Tour in 2021. Past singles winners include Diana Shnaider (2024), Katerina Siniakova (2023) and Caroline Garcia (2022)
- This year's field is led by No.1 Jessica Pegula. Making her second appearance at Bad Homburg, Pegula is looking for second Tour-level title on grass after taking the crown at Berlin in 2024 (d. Anna Kalinskaya in F)
- The No.2 seed is Italy's Jasmine Paolini. Holding one singles title in 2025 (Rome), she is seeking her first Tour-level champion run on grass in her tournament debut at Bad Homburg

- Mirra Andreeva is the No.3 seed. Winning back-to-back WTA-1000 events this year (Dubai and Indian Wells), Andreeva is looking to capture her first crown at the WTA-500 level in her second appearance at Bad Homburg.
- Iga Swiatek of Poland rounds out the Top 4 seeds. With 22 Tour-level singles titles in her career, Swiatek is seeking her first on grass. Her 2023 semifinal run in her lone appearance at Bad Homburg is the furthest she has advanced in a Tour-level tournament on grass
- Home favorites Tatjana Maria (fourth appearance) and Laura Siegemund (second appearance) enter the main draw as wildcards. Maria will look to continue her momentum on grass coming off a Champion run at London as Siegemund looks to add a second Tour-level title on home soil after capturing the crown at Stuttgart in 2017
- Naomi Osaka and Maria Sakkari also received a wildcard entry. Sakkari returns to Bad Homburg for the second time after a main draw appearance in 2024 while Osaka, seeking her first Tour-level title on grass, makes her tournament debut
- In doubles, the field is led by the No.1 seed Gabriela Dabrowski of Canada and Erin Routliffe of New Zealand. Dabrowski is making her tournament debut as Routliffe appears for the fourth time after a Runner-up finish in 2022 with Alicja Rosolska
