TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

Wildcards: Anna Kalinskaya, Renata Jamrichova (SVK), Zeynep Sonmez (TUR), Sloane Stephens (USA) Youngest singles player: Renata Jamrichova (17) Oldest singles player: Magda Linette (32)

- Tournament's first edition as a WTA 500 event; took place in 2023-2024 as a WTA 250 event
- The field is led by two Top 10 players world No.9 Emma Navarro and world No.10 Paula Badosa
- Two other Top 20 players, No. 16 Beatriz Haddad Maia and No. 19 Anna Kalinskaya rounds out Top 4 seeds
- All the Top 4 seeds are making tournament debut, looking for their first wins at Merida after first round Byes
- Defending champion Zeynep Sonmez returns as a wild card, facing No.8 seed Maria Sakkari in first round
- 2017 US Open champion **Sloane Stephens**, playing the tournament with a wild card, is making second appearance at Merida. Having reached QF at Merida 2023 (I. eventual champion Giorgi), Sloane Stephens will face a qualifier in opening round.
- As the youngest player in main draw (17 years old), Renata Jamrichova from Slovakia is making tournament debut with a wildcard, looking to her first main draw win at WTA tour-level events. She's facing Spain's Jessica Bouzas Maneiro in opening match
