CAREER MILESTONES

- Stand-out performances of 2024 were QF at Palermo (l. Muchova) and 3r at WTA 500 Charleston as a lucky loser (l. Sakkari); also made QF at WTA 125 Midland (l. Parks)
- Played mainly ITF in 2023 with best WTA performances at Budapest with 2r (l. Juvan) and winning a WTA 125 title at WTA 125 Bucharest.
- Strongest Tour level result of 2022 was QF at Rabat on clay (l. Liu). Also reached 2r at Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. Azarenka).
- Lifted maiden WTA title at 2021 Charleston [WTA 250] (d. Jabeur in F)
- In 2021 also advanced to QF at Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Sorribes Tormo) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Collins. Also won doubles title at Guadalajara (w/Perez)
- Reached 2r twice in 2020, including at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Alexandrova)
- Contested the main draw at all four Slams in 2019, with her best result coming at Australian Open by reaching 2r (d. Hon, l. Sakkari)
- Rose to career-high ranking of No.85 on June 24, 2019
- Achieved her best win-by-ranking of her career over No.50 S.Zhang during 2r showing at 2019 Strasbourg
- Advanced to career first Tour-level final in 2019 at Bogota (l. Anisimova in F). Lifted first WTA doubles title that same week (w/Hives)
- In mixed doubles finished R-Up in mixed doubles at 2019 Australian Open (w/Smith, l. Krejckova/Ram in F) and made SF in 2020 (w/Smith, l. Mattek-Sands/J.Murray)
- Won seventh career ITF singles title and fourth doubles title (w/Hourigan) at 2019 \$25K ITF/Irapuato-MEX (d. Cepede Royg in singles F)
- Played almost exclusively on ITF Circuit in 2018, posting 37-11 win-loss record and winning three titles
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2018 Hobart, falling at the first hurdle to Nara
- Won first professional title in 2015 at \$10k Sharm EL Sheikh-EGY
- Owns seven singles and four doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Australia in 2011
- Whilst at Vanderbilt University, earned singles and doubles All-American honors
- 2024 season highlights included reaching SF at Bad Homburg and Rabat, QF at Hobart and Seoul; and finishing R-Up at WTA 125 event in Valencia. In Grand Slam play, reached 2r at the Australian Open and Roland Garros for the first time. Set new career-high ranking of No.46 (July 29) and finished inside Top 50 for first time.
- Claimed first WTA 125 event at 2023 Chicago (d. Liu in F). Reached second round at 2023 Wimbledon (l. Boulter). Reached career high ranking of No.71 on May 22, 2023.
- Best result of 2022 was QF run at Eastbourne (as LL, l. Giorgi). Also finished R-Up at WTA 125 in Budapest and at W80 ITF Circuit tournament in Oeiras
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 8, 2022, following SF run at W80 ITF Circuit event in Grodzisk Mazowiecki, Poland
- Advanced to maiden WTA SFs during 2021 season, first at Bogota (l. Zidansek) and then at Belgrade (as LL, l. eventual champion Badosa)
- On Tour's return in 2020, fell 1r at US Open and Istanbul before reaching SF at \$80k ITF/Cagnes sur Mer-FRA
- In final event before the tour's hiatus, made 2r at Lyon (l. Van Uytvanck)
- Started 2020 with a productive spell on ITF Circuit in Great Britain, finishing R-Up at \$25K Glasgow before winning 16th title at this level at \$25K Sunderland (d. Raducanu in F)
- Made four Tour-level appearances in 2019, highlighted by 2r showing at Osaka (as qualifier, d. Cornet, l. Osaka), while won title at \$80K ITF/Biarritz-FRA (d. Kovinic in F)
