CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024, won second career WTA 125 title at Hamburg (first came at 2021 Buenos Aires). In doubles reached the final at Bogota w/Khromacheva and earned WTA 125 titles at Hamburg and San Luis Potosi (both with Zimmermann)
- In 2023 won first Grand Slam main draw match defeating Bogdan in 1r at Australian Open; also reached semifinal at Lausanne (l. Cocciaretto) and made 3r at Rome (as qualifier, l. Zheng).
- Highlights of 2022 were SF at Rabat (withdrew w/right shoulder injury before match versus Liu) and QF at Lyon (l. Cirstea), Istanbul (l. Kudermetova) and Palermo (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- Won first career title on Tour in doubles at Palermo (w/Zimmermann)
- Made Top 100 debut on November 15, 2021, following title run at W60 ITF Circuit event in Santiago, Chile
- Ended 2021 in fine form, winning 27 matches after US Open, lifting titles at WTA 125K Series event at Buenos Aires and two ITF Circuit tournaments
- In 2020, reached two QF on ITF Circuit and made 2r at WTA 125K Series event at Prague
- Suffered 1r defeat on WTA main draw debut at 2019 Budapest (l. Cirstea). Also that year, fell 1r at Bucharest (as qualifier, l. Tig) and in qualifying on three occasions
- Contested Grand Slam qualifying for the first time at 2019 Wimbledon
- Won the most recent of her 10 ITF Circuit singles titles in January 2019, at \$25k Daytona Beach, FL-USA
- Fell at first hurdle on debut in WTA qualifying at 2018 Budapest
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2014, winning a title in only her second event, at \$10k Antalya-TUR
- Played only Australian Open in 2024 before taking the rest of the season away from competition
- Best result of 2023 season was QF at Budapest (as qualifier, l. eventual champion, Timofeeva); also went 2-1 at Billie Jean King Cup Finals representing Slovenia and reached SF at WTA 125 San Luis Potosi (l. Errani).
- Strongest Grand Slam result of 2023 came at US Open with 3r (as qualifier, l. Swiatek).
- In 2022, reached maiden WTA final at Strasbourg (l. Kerber - longest final of the season at 3h 16m)
- Other highlights of the 2022 season were QF at Adelaide [500] (l. Doi) and 3r showing at Wimbledon (l. Watson); scored first Top-10 win over No.2 Sabalenka during Adelaide run
- Posted career-high ranking of No.58 on June 6, 2022
- Reached first WTA SF on home soil at 2021 Portoroz (l. Riske)
- Performed well at the majors in 2021, reaching 3r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Brady) and Wimbledon (l. Gauff)
- Broke into the Top 100 on October 26, 2020 at No.100
- Claimed maiden Top-20 win over No.18 Vondrousova at 2020 Palermo
- In 2019, made Grand Slam and Tour-level debut as a lucky loser at Roland Garros, falling 1r (l. Cirstea) and won first Grand Slam match as qualifier at Wimbledon (d. Kr.Pliskova) before losing to S. Williams on Centre Court in 2r
- Rose nearly 400 places in the rankings to finish 2018 at No.174
- Ended 2018 campaign with 42-10 record and four titles on ITF Circuit. Also fell at the first hurdle on WTA qualifying debut at Budapest (l. Schnyder)
- Made Billie Jean King Cup debut for Slovenia in 2017, also representing her nation in 2018 and 2019, 2021-22
- Owns seven singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Slovenia in 2015, losing in the 2r at \$25K Velenje

CAREER MILESTONES

- Produced a breakthrough performance in 2024 to win WTA 125 Saint Malo and won 18 consecutive ITF series matches to take her ranking to a career high of No.152 in May

Earned first ITF title in 2022 at W15 Dijon

- In 2021 played first Tour level qualifying matches at Lyon and Roland Garros
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2019 at the age of 16

- In 2024 enjoyed fairytale run to first Grand Slam semifinal at Australian Open (as qualifier), including defeat of No.7 Vondrousova and two-time major champion Azarenka. Posted highest ranking for almost four years, rising to No.25 in July.
- In 2023, achieved best results at WTA 125 series events, winning Kozerki (d. Minnen) and SF finishes at Reus (l. Mandlik) and Angers (l. Burel).
- Best result of 2022 was R-Up finish at Lyon (as WC, l. Zhang). Also made QF at Dubai (as qualifier, l. Vondrousova), Bogota (l. Pigossi) and Birmingham (l. Zhang)
- In first tournament of 2021, reached SF at Hamburg (l. eventual champion Ruse). Also made QF at Courmayeur (l. Paolini)
- Highlight of 2020 was finishing R-Up at Adelaide (l. Barty); scored three consecutive Top 20 wins en route to final, over No.18 Kerber, No.20 Vekic and No.12 Sabalenka
- Captured two WTA singles titles in 2019 at Hua Hin (d. Tomljanovic in F after trailing 5-2 in third set) and Strasbourg (d. Garcia after saving 1mp)
- Advanced to QF at 2019 Wuhan, where she recorded maiden Top 5 win against No.2 Ka.Pliskova in R16 (l. Kvitova), and made Grand Slam breakthrough with R16 run at 2019 Wimbledon (l. Zhang)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019, going 1-1 in RR stage (d. No.20 Vekic, l. eventual R-Up Bertens) and reached maiden doubles final, at Beijing (w/Ostapenko, l. Kenin/Mattek-Sands)
