- The Hologic WTA Tour returns to Cluj-Napoca for the fifth staging of Transylvania Open
- The field is led by No.1 seed Anastasia Potapova, who recently reached the quarterfinals at Linz. Her best result
 at the Transylvania Open was reaching the semifinals in 2022, where she fell to eventual champion Anna
 Blinkova
- Highlighting the field are six Romanian players, including wildcard and former World No.1 Simona Halep, who is
 playing her first tournament of 2025. Halep is seeking her first main-draw Tour-level win since August 2022; she
 faces Lucia Bronzetti in the first round
- Besides Halep, main draw Romanian players include Irina-Camelia Begu, Ana Bogdan, Sorana Cirstea, Jaqueline Cristian and Elena-Gabriela Ruse
- Anna Blinkova is the only former champion in the draw, lifting the title in 2022 (d. Paolini in F); past Transylvania runner-up players in the draw are the three Romanian wildcards for the event: Bogdan (I. Pliskova in Final in 2024), Ruse (I. Korpatsch in Final in 2023), and Halep (I. Kontaveit in Final in 2021)

- The doubles field is highlighted by No.1 seeds Monica Niculescu and Sabrina Santamaria, as well as the Romanian pairings of Bogdan/Halep and Begu/Cirstea
- One to watch- No.2 seed Olga Danilovic is coming off a fourth-round appearance at the Australian Open, where she defeated World No.6 Jessica Pegula. She finished her 2024 campaign strong with a tournament win at Guangzhou, the second title of her career
