CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 won main draw matches at Hua Hin, Nottingham and Jiujiang
- In June 2023, with a ranking of No.49, entered the Top 50 for the first time in her career
- In her 2023 debut Australian Open appearance she reached the 4r (L. Vekic); fell in 1r at all the other Grand Slams of the season
- WTA Tour 2023 highlights include a SF run at Ningbo (L. Shnaider) and a QF run at Birmingham (L. Krejčíková) and Hong Kong (L. Fernandez)
- Highlight of 2022 was maiden WTA title run at Chennai (d. Linette in F), helping her rise from No.305 to No.77 in the rankings
- First title win of the 2022 season came early at W25 Cancun followed by R16 run at Miami Open (L. Badosa)
- In 2022 had early exits on clay and grass swing, notably 2r at Charleston (L. Bencic), 1r at Madrid (L. Kanepi), and qualifying rounds at Roland Garros and Wimbledon; Came back strongly with a 2r run at US Open (as qualifier, L. Muguruza) followed by first singles title at Chennai (d. Linette)
- In 2021, reached QF at Charleston [250] (as WC, L. eventual champion Sharma) and made 2r at Cleveland (as LL, L. Linette); also lifted first ITF Circuit titles of her career at W15 events in Monastir, Tunisia
- Fell 1r on WTA debut at 2020 Prague (as WC, L. Kr. Pliskova)
- Before the tour stopped in March 2020, she competed in her first ITF \$100K event, beating a former WTA top-100 player in the first round
- Best junior Slam singles result was SF run at 2021 Wimbledon
- In May 2019, she was directly accepted in the main draw for Roland Garros girls' singles - the youngest player in the draw and first 2005 born player to play in a junior Grand Slam
- In February 2019, as a 13-year-old, she won the prestigious Les Petits As title in France, losing only 15 games the entire tournament - something that had never been done in the history of the event
- In the past, she has won the Junior Orange Bowl (2017) and a long list of Tennis Europe and ITF Junior events as well

- Enjoyed best season of career in 2024, reaching her first Grand Slam R16 at Roland Garros (as a qualifier) and winning her second career Hologic WTA Tour title (first on hard court) at Guangzhou. Achieved a new career-high ranking of No.51 in December
- In 2023 posted best Grand Slam result with 3r at Roland Garros as a qualifier (L. Jabeur); her ranking climbed back into Top 100 for the first time since 2018 with a title run at WTA 125 Bastad (d. Navarro) and SF finish at WTA 125 Gaiba (L. Maria); ended 2023 after US Open.

2022 highlighted by run through qualifying to final at Lausanne (L. Martić); also won doubles title (w/Mladenovic)

- Best results in 2021 were QF showings at Budapest (as qualifier, L. Galfi) and Palermo (L. Zhang). Also made 2r at Australian Open and US Open
- Standout singles result in 2020 was QF run at WTA 125K Series event at Indian Wells. Also fell 1r at Istanbul and in qualifying at Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Won fifth ITF Circuit title at \$60k ITF/Montreux-SUI in September 2019
- Fell in final round of qualifying at Wimbledon in 2019
- Made Top-100 debut on October 1, 2018, and climbed to a career-high ranking of No.96 the following week (October 8, 2018)
- Fourth-youngest player in the 2018 year-end Top 150 (behind Kostyuk, Anisimova and Potapova)
- As a lucky loser at 2018 Moscow [River Cup], became the first player born in 2000s to win a WTA singles title when she overcame fellow teenager Potapova in three-set final
- Won WTA doubles title at 2018 Tashkent (w/Zidensek, d. Begu/Olaru in F)
- Made her Billie Jean King Cup debut in February 2018, winning all three singles matches - including 6-2 6-4 upset of No.15 Sevastova - in Group I of the Euro/Africa Zone
- Her performances representing Serbia in the Billie Jean King Cup earned her the Heart Award and a cheque of USD\$1,000, which she donated to University Children's Hospital in Belgrade
- In just her second tournament in the senior ranks won title at \$10k ITF/Antalya-TUR. Overall, owns five singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Serbia in 2015

- Won girls' doubles titles at 2016 Roland Garros (w/Arias Manjón), 2017 Wimbledon (w/Juvan) and 2017 US Open (w/Kostyuk)
