CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakthrough year in singles in 2024 saw her ranking climb from No.570 at the end of 2023 to a new career high of No.132 by October 2024.
 She made her Grand Slam main draw debut at US Open reaching 2r as a qualifier (l. Swiatek), made 2r at Prague and Guadalajara as well as claiming her first career ITF title at W35 Spring TX.
- In doubles in 2024 won her 11th career title at Osaka with Laura Siegemund
- In 2023 reached Guadalajara main draw as a qualifier in singles (l. Ka.Pliskova). Doubles highlights included reaching the final at Australian Open with Shuko Aoyama
- In 2022 reached a career high doubles ranking of No.4 in March following SF run at Australian Open with Shuko Aoyama and R-Up at Indian Wells with Asia Muhammad
 - In 2021 made first Tour level main draw in singles at Cleveland (as a lucky loser, l. Mattek Sands in 1r)
- In 2019 played first Tour level qualification matches in singles at Lausanne. In doubles achieved first career titles at WTA 250 Tianjin and WTA 500 Moscow (both with Shuko Aoyama), R-Up at WTA 250 Bogota w/Carter and WTA 500 San Jose w/Shuko, as well as WTA 125 title at Newport Beach w/Carter
- Claimed first ITF doubles title in 2018 at Baton Rouge with Hayley Carter
- In 2016 made doubles Grand Slam debut at US Open with Jada Hart (l. in 1r) Made professional ITF debut in 2014

- Highlight of 2024 season was reaching the final at Birmingham and earning WTA 125 title at Hong Kong
- Began the 2023 season in August after undergoing minor knee surgery in January.
 Pulled out of her 2r match at US Open before ending the season on a high note winning Florianopolis WTA 125 (d. Capurro Taborda).
- Best performances of 2022 produced at Wimbledon and US Open with QF. Also reached QF at Istanbul, Rabat, Nottingham and Cincinnati.
- Produced Grand Slam breakthrough at 2021 Wimbledon, advancing to QF (l. eventual champion Barty)
- Other singles highlights last season were runs to R16 at Indian Wells and 3r at both US Open and Charleston
- Equaled best result at home Slam by advancing to 2r at 2020 Australian Open (I. Muguruza)
- Ended 2019 season by representing Australia in Perth final of Billie Jean King Cup vs. France went 1-1 in singles (d. Parmentier, l. Mladenovic) as visitors prevailed 3-2
- Posted career-high ranking of No.39 on April 1, 2019 (following 3r run at Miami 3r)
- Four-time WTA singles finalist, most recently finishing runner-up at 2019 Hua Hin (l. Yastremska). Earlier finals came at 2015 Pattaya City (l. Hantuchova), 2018 Rabat (l. Mertens) and 2018 Seoul (l. Bertens)
- Posted two Top 10 wins in 2019, her first for almost five years, defeating No.10 Sabalenka (Miami) and No.8 Bertens (Zhengzhou). Other Top 10 defeat, and best win of career, came over No.3 A.Radwanska at 2014 Roland Garros
- Reached first Premier-level SF of career at 2019
 Zhengzhou (l. eventual champion Ka.Pliskova)
- Underwent shoulder surgery in February 2016 and was sidelined for rest of season; returned at 2017 Acapulco, more than 12 months later
- Made Top 50 debut in 2015, rising as high as No.47 (week of February 23)
- Best Grand Slam result to date is R16 run at 2014 Roland Garros (d. No.32 seed Vesnina in 2r and No.3 seed A.Radwanska in 3r, l. Suárez Navarro)
- Announced in 2014 she would switch nationalities and start representing Australia (first did so at 2014 US Open)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of four singles titles and three doubles titles
- Made pro debut on ITF Circuit in Croatia in 2007 and WTA main draw debut at 2009 Indian Wells

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024, won two singles titles Toronto (WTA 1000) and Berlin en route to year-end ranking of No.7, her third-straight year-end Top 10 finish; two-time runner-up at Cincinnati and US Open; joined Rosie Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013) as the only women in the Open Era to make the final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in the same season
- Also qualified for the 2024 WTA Finals (withdrew during round-robin play due to left knee injury)
- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun.
 - In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open.
- Achieved career-high No. 3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Fort Worth in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
- Reached QF at three of the four majors in 2022, breaking into Top 10 after doing so at Roland Garros (June 6, 2022)
- One of seven players to win 40 or more matches in 2022, alongside Swiatek, Jabeur, Garcia, Sakkari, Kasatkina and Bencic
- In 2021, reached the QF or better on seven occasions, including at the Australian Open
- Broke into Top 20 on November 1, 2021
- Began 2020 with runner-up finish at Auckland (l. S.Williams), other standout results were a QF at Western & Southern Open (as qualifier, l. Mertens) and a 3r showing at US Open (l. Kvitova)
- On the doubles court in 2020, reached QFs of Roland-Garros (w/Muhammad) and Cincinnati (w/Rogers)
- Won her first WTA title at 2019 Washington DC (d. Giorgi in F)
- Also in 2019, fell 1r on main draw debut at Roland-Garros (l. eventual champion Barty) and Wimbledon (l. Buzarnescu) and Miami (as a qualifier, l. Konta)
- Broke into Top 100 for the first time on February 4, 2019 following back-to-back R-Up finishes at WTA 125K Series event at Newport Beach and W100 ITF Circuit tournament in Midland-MI, USA

- Began 2024 with her strongest Australian Open result with 3r in her seventh appearance at the event. Also reached quarterfinals at San Diego and Bad Homburg, as well as claiming her second career doubles title at Monastir w/ Mayar Sherif
- In 2023 advanced to final in Strasbourg in May (l. Svitolina). Reached back-to-back third rounds at Roland Garros (l. Svitolina) and Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka). Posted a career-high ranking of No.34 in August.
- Returned to Top 100 on October 17, 2022 after lifting maiden WTA title at Cluj Napoca (as qualifier, d. Paolini in F)
