• Four time Grand Slam champion Naomi Osaka enters the Japan Open as No.1 seed. She has made two finals this season at Auckland and Montreal as well as semifinal at US Open taking her ranking back into the Top 20 for the first time since 2022. She won the WTA 500 Toray Pan Pacific Open title in 2019 played at the same venue.

- Linda Noskova enters as No.2 seed and recently made her Top 20 debut after reaching the final at Beijing earlier this month (I. Anisimova in final)
- No.3 seed Elise Mertens has claimed two titles this season at 's-Hertogenbosch and Singapore and a further final at Hobart
- No.4 seed is 2021 US Open finalist Leylah Fernandez who posted her best result of the season at Washington DC by winning her fourth career title (d. Kalinskaya in final)
- Defending champion Suzan Lamens returns this year; her 2024 Osaka win remains her sole career title, with her best result of the season a run to the semifinal at Rouen on clay
- Ashlyn Krueger is also a former champion at the Japan Open claiming the title in 2023 (d. Zhu Lin in final). The 21year- old American made the final at WTA 500 Abu Dhabi this season
- Wild cards include Japan's Moyuka Uchijima who achieved the best result of her career this year by making quarterfinal at WTA 1000 Madrid (I. Svitolina) and 17 year old Wakana Sonobe who played her first Tour main draw this season reaching R16 as a qualifier at WTA 500 Abu Dhabi (I. Jabeur)
- Other notable names in the draw include former Top 5 player Maria Sakkari, 2019 US Open champion Bianca Andreescu and Miami 2025 semifinalist Alexandra Eala
