Magda Linette (POL #33) vs. Rebecca Sramkova (SVK #41)

Sramkova leads 1-0

Linette:

- Best previous Strasbourg result was in 2021 with semifinal (l. Cirstea); this is her 10th main draw appearance here
- Owns one clay court title at Prague 2024
- Is looking for her third quarterfinal of 2025 after Abu Dhabi (l. Noskova) and Miami (l. Paolini)
- Best result by Poland at Strasbourg was R-Up by Marta Domachowska in 2005

Sramkova:

- Making her Strasbourg debut
- Defeated Linette in their only previous career meeting at Hua Hin #2 in 2024
- This is her second meeting with a player from Poland so far this season after falling to Iga Swiatek in 2r at Australian Open
- A win today would equal her best career result on clay with quarterfinal at 2024 Budapest

[3] Paula Badosa (ESP #10) vs. [LL] Marie Bouzkova (CZE #50)

Badosa leads 3-0

Badosa:

- Making Strasbourg tournament debut after her first round bye
- Contesting in her first clay match of the 2025 season
- Two time champion at WTA 500 events: 2022 Sydney and 2024 Washington D.C. (d. Bouzkova in Washington final)
- One of her four career WTA titles has come on clay: 2021 Belgrade
- Best Strasbourg result by a player from Spain is Anabel Medina Garrigues with 3 titles in 2005, 2007 and 2008; Medina Garrigues is tied with Italy's Silvia Farina Elia (2001, 2002, 2003) for the most Strasbourg singles titles

Bouzkova:

- Making 1st main-draw appearance at Strasbourg after losing in qualifying last year
- Also fell in qualifying this year, but entered main draw as a lucky loser and defeated wild card Alizé Cornet in opening round
- Owns 11 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.3 Aryna Sabalenka at 2024 Washington D.C.
- That win over Sabalenka put her into the Washington D.C. final for her career-best WTA 500 performance - she lost that final to Badosa
- One of 3 players from Czech Republic in this week's main draw and the only one to make 2r (Krejčíková and Noskova lost 1r)

Rybakina leads 1-0

Wang:

- Making 3rd appearance at Strasbourg and has equaled her best previous result reaching R16 in 2024 (l. Keys)
- Holds seven career Tour level wins over Top 20 opponents and seeking her first such victory on clay
- Her most recent Top 20 win was against No.3 Jessica Pegula at Wuhan in 2024
- Looking for her second QF of 2025 after Singapore (l. eventual champion Mertens in SF)

Rybakina:

- Making 3rd appearance at Strasbourg, where her best result was runner-up in 2020 (l. Svitolina in F)
- Holds a 1-0 record against Wang, with their lone meeting coming at Nanchang (hard court) in 2019
- Has won 13 of her 15 Tour-level matches against an opponent from China and is 2-0 on clay in such matches
- Owns three clay court titles: Stuttgart 2024 (d. Kostyuk), Rome 2023 (d. Kalinina) and Bucharest 2019 (d. Tig)

Parry:

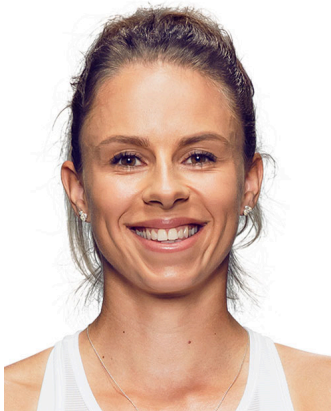
- In her fifth main draw appearance at Strasbourg, has reached R16 for the first time
- Is through to her first R16 since Guangzhou last season (l. eventual champion Danilovic)
- The only player from France to reach 2r after Cornet fell in 1r
- Has won 2 main draw matches so far in 2025 and is looking for her first QF of the season with a win today

Samsonova:

- Making her second Strasbourg appearance after reaching semifinal here last year (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Is 2-1 against players ranked outside the Top 100 so far this year with sole loss against Polina Kudermetova at Brisbane
- Her semifinal performance at Strasbourg last year equaled her best result on clay along with semifinals at Stuttgart in 2022 and Palermo in 2019
- Her first meeting against a player from France and first meeting against a wild card so far this season

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won her third career title in 2024 at Prague; also reached the final at Rouen and made her first career WTA 1000 quarterfinal at Wuhan (l. Gauff)
- Opened 2023 by going 3-1 in singles for Poland in the City Final in Sydney at inaugural United Cup (l. Keys), then achieved best Grand Slam result with SF at Australian Open (l. eventual champion Sabalenka). Broke into Top 20 for first time reaching No. 19 on March 20, 2023.
- Reached final at Guangzhou (l. Wang Xiyu) and ended 2023 by qualifying for Zhuhai Elite Trophy (0-2 in group stage).
- 2022 season highlight was R-Up finish at Chennai (l. Fruhvirtova). Also won two doubles titles, at Charleston (w/Klepac) and Eastbourne (w/Krunic)
- Posted seventh successive Top 100 season in 2021, finishing at No.57 after starting her season at Miami in March, due to a knee injury
- Reached two semifinals in 2021, at Strasbourg (l. Cirstea) and Cleveland (l. Begu)
- Matched previous best results at Grand Slams in 2021 with 3r runs at Roland Garros (d. World No.1 Barty via ret. in 2r; l. Jabeur) and Wimbledon (d. No.5 Svitolina in 2r for best win of career in a completed match, before falling to Badosa)
- Won second WTA singles title at Hua Hin in 2020 (d. Kung in F), rising to new career-high ranking of No.33 (on February 17)
- Posted best result at US Open by advancing to 3r (l. Kontaveit); now has reached this stage at all four Grand Slams
- Winner of 2020 WTA Shot of the Year; became the third Polish woman to win this award (after A.Radwanska and Swiatek)
- Her 2019 campaign was highlighted by lifting maiden WTA title at the Bronx and finished R-Up at Seoul (l. Muchova); broke into Top 50 on September 9, 2019
- Season highlights in 2018 included QF run at Washington DC (l. Vekic); win over No.17 Osaka in 2r was first Top 20 victory - previous career-best win came over No.21 Gavrilova at 2017 Tokyo [PPO]

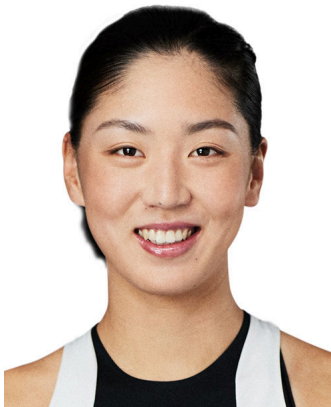
