- 2025 clay season arrives at Strasbourg for its 39th edition, the last week before Roland Garros, along with Rabat
- This year's field features three Top 10 players and in total seven Top 20 players, led by No.1 seed, world No.4
 Jessica Pegula. Pegula is making her 3rd appearance at Strasbourg with a wildcard and looking for her first win
 here. Pegula's best result on clay was title run at Charleston 2025, also a SF run at Madrid 2022
- World No.9 Emma Navarro is No. 2 seed. Navarro's best result at Strasbourg was QF run in 2023, which is her career-best result on clay, along with QF runs at Charleston 2025 and Palermo 2023

- No.3 seed is Paula Badosa, who is making tournament debut at Strasbourg and is playing her first tournament on clay of 2025 season. World No. 10 owns one singles title on clay at Belgrade 2021
- No.4 seed Elena Rybakina is a former Runner-Up (2020). She owns three singles title on clay at Stuttgart 2024, Rome 2023 and Bucharest 2019
- There is one former champion in this year's field: Barbora Krejcikova, who won the tournament in 2021, also owns a second title on clay at Roland Garros 2021
- The 2021 US Open champion Emma Raducanu entered the tournament with a wildcard. Her best result on clay was QF run at Stuttgart 2024 and 2022 (I. Swiatek on both occasions)
- The other two wild cards are granted to the home country's Alize Cornet and Diane Parry
- In doubles, Gabriela Dabrowski and Erin Routliffe are leading the field as No.1 seeds; sitting on No.7 at PIF Race to WTA Finals, the pair will face China's Xinyu Wang and Saisai Zheng in their opening match
