MATCH NOTES – DAY 2 – THURSDAY, MARCH 6

Emma Raducanu (GBR #55) vs. Moyuka Uchijima (JPN #52)

Raducanu leads 1-0

Raducanu:

- Making fifth appearance at Indian Wells, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2023 (l. Swiatek); she has won the opening match at Indian Wells in three of her last four appearances
- Won only previous meeting vs. Uchijima at 2022 Seoul (R32)
- Owns one hard court title at 2021 US Open, when she became first qualifier - man or woman - to lift a major title
- Making 15th appearance at a WTA 1000 with best result being three R16 finishes
- Has won 7 of last 9 matches vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 100
- Winner of today's match will face No.3 seed Coco Gauff

Uchijima:

- Making first appearance at Indian Wells
- Best career result on hard court is quarterfinal run at 2022 Monastir (l. eventual champion Mertens)
- Best result by Japanese player at Indian Wells was title run by Naomi Osaka in 2018
- This is her sixth WTA 1000 appearance (3-12 record in WTA 1000 main draw)

Belinda Bencic (SUI #58) vs. Tatjana Maria (GER #87)

First Meeting

Bencic:

- Making her 9th appearance at Indian Wells, with best result reaching semifinal in 2019 (l. Kerber)
- Following maternity leave, made return to the Tour earlier this season at United Cup; on her return she was ranked at No.421 on PIF WTA Rankings and following a successful season start, including the Abu Dhabi title, she is now ranked at No.58
- Is positioned at No.13 on the PIF Race to WTA Finals Leaderboard
- Owns 18-10 career record against players from Germany, two of those wins coming against today's opponent, Tatjana Maria, at Miami in 2015 and Indian Harbour Beach in 2013
- Making 57th WTA 1000 appearance, including title runs at 2015 Toronto and 2019 Dubai
- One of 25 active mothers on Tour, including today's opponent Tatjana Maria

Maria:

- Is making her 9th appearance at Indian Wells, where her best results were 2r runs in 2019 (l. Barty), 2023 (l. Kasatkina) and 2024 (l. Paolini), she has further contested qualifying in 2021-22, 2018, 2015, 2007-11
- Owns 11-13 career record against wildcard players, and a 1-5 record against players from Switzerland
- Is currently ranked at No.87 on the PIF WTA Rankings, this time last year being ranked at No.46 following a small drop from her career-high No.42 (secured Jan 2024)

[WC] Alycia Parks (USA #61) vs. Anna Kalinskaya (#33)

Kalinskaya leads 2-0

Parks:

- Parks is making 12th WTA 1000 appearance overall, her third at Indian Wells
- Winner will face No.13 Diana Shnaider in next round
- Has reached the R32 at WTA 1000 five times
- 1 of 24 Americans in the main draw; only in 1992 (26) and 1990 (26) have there been more Americans in draw

Kalinskaya:

- Has won both previous meetings, including a win in the opening round of 2023 Indian Wells (6-1, 6-1)
- Climbed as high as No.11 in the WTA Rankings (on October 27, 2024)
- Making 24th WTA 1000 appearance, with this being her fifth appearance at Indian Wells; her best result here came in 2021, advancing to R16
- Played 2024 Indian Wells as the No.21 seed prompted by her runner-up finish at 2024 Dubai; returns unseeded this year

[Q] Maddison Inglis (AUS #136) vs. Sofia Kenin (USA #47)

Kenin leads 1-0

Inglis:

- Currently the No.6 ranked Australian woman
- Making Indian Wells debut; fell in qualifying twice – 2021, 2022
- Also marks WTA 1000 main draw debut
- Has won only one of 13 career matches vs. Top 50 ranked opponents, defeating No.24 Leylah Fernandez at 2022 Australian Open; most recent Top 50 meeting came at 2022 Dubai (l. No.45 Siniakova)

Kenin:

- Making 40th WTA 1000 appearance having reached the semifinals three times – 2019 Toronto, 2019 Cincinnati and 2023 Guadalajara
- Making fifth main draw appearance at Indian Wells
- Enters tournament with 8 main draw wins this year; in 2024, won her eighth match in September

Anna Blinkova (#82) vs McCartney Kessler (USA #48)

First meeting

Blinkova:

- Making her 3rd appearance at Indian Wells, where her best result was a 3r run in 2024 (l. Parry), has further attempted qualifying in 2019
- Holds a 9-16 record against players from the USA, with a 1-2 record this season (d. Pera at Hobart; l. Kenin at Hobart and Pegula at Austin)
- Reached a career-high ranking of No.34 in August of 2023, she is currently ranked at No.82

Kessler:

- Making her 2nd Indian Wells main draw, lost in the 1r in her previous appearance (l. Parrizas Diaz)
- Stands at No.19 on the PIF Race to WTA Finals Leaderboard following start to season that has included finals runs at two WTA 250 events – Hobart (Won) and last week at Austin (Runner-Up)
- Reached her career-high ranking of No.47 in January 2025, she is now ranked one spot below at No.48
- 1 of 24 Americans in the main draw; only in 1992 (26) and 1990 (26) have there been more Americans in draw
- Has won 12 matches already in 2025 after winning eight main draw matches in 2024

CAREER MILESTONES

- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made fourth round of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023.
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best win-by-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top-50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- Owns three singles titles on ITF Circuit
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarter finals of Wimbledon and US Open in 2018
- In 2024 won first main draw Grand Slam matches of her career at Roland Garros (as a qualifier l. Sabalenka in 2r) and US Open (l. Niemeier in 2r), breaking into the Top 100 for the first time and reaching a career high of No.55 in October. In doubles claimed first career title at Jiujiang with Guo Hanyu and also reached final at Hua Hin 2 with Eudice Chong
- Best result of 2023 was R16 at Guangzhou (l. Bronzetti). Also entered directly into main draw at Australian Open (l. Pera), Hua Hin (l. Yastremska), Osaka (l. Zhu Lin) and Tokyo (l. Day).
- Enjoyed breakthrough year in 2022, playing first WTA 250 main draw match at Chennai (l. Linette). Entered first Grand Slam's, reaching Q3 at both Roland Garros (l. Niemeier) and US Open (l. Avanesyan).
- Beat first Top 50 player at Monastir (No. 41, Martic) reaching Tour-level QF for first time (l. Mertens). Began 2022 ranked No. 499 and ended at No. 105.
- Won first ITF tournament at Hua Hin W15 in 2019, also winning first ITF doubles title at Kyoto W60 (w/Hozumi).
- Played first professional tournaments in 2017, entering Tokyo (Japan Open, WTA 250) qualifying (l. Sema in Q1) and Tokyo (Toray Pan Pacific Open, WTA 500) qualifying (l. Linette in Q2).

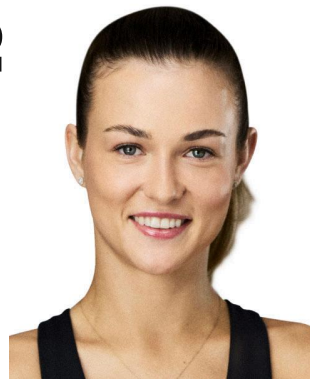
