# MAIN DRAW QUICK-HITS

Youngest singles player: Iva Jovic (17) Oldest singles player: Tatiana Maria (37)

- Indian Wells is the 139th WTA 1000 since the level was introduced in 2009 with 47 different champions. Overall this will be the 36th edition of women's singles at Indian Wells, with the tournament's inaugural edition in 1989. No player has won the title at Indian Wells more than twice (10 different players).
- The last six champions at Indian Wells have been 23 years old or younger Naomi Osaka (2018), Bianca Andreescu (2019), Paula Badosa (2021), Iga Swiatek (2022, 2024) and Elena Rybakina (2023). Prior to this current stretch, the previous five champions average ages was 27.5 years old
- It has been 24 years since an American woman won the title at Indian Wells (2001, Serena Williams at 19 years old). Currently there are four Americans in the Top 8 of the PIF WTA Rankings No.3 Coco Gauff, No.4 Jessica Pegula, No.5 Madison Keys and No.8 Emma Navarro. It is the first time in 22 years (week of Nov 3, 2003) that

there are 4 Americans are in the Top 8 and already have seen another American win a WTA 1000 tile this year (Amanda Anisimova, Doha)

- Since April 4, 2022 the PIF WTA World No.1 Ranking has belonged to either Iga Swiatek or current No.1 Aryna Sabalenka, who has held the top ranking since October 21, 2024.
- Swiatek returns as the defending champion posting a 16-1 record in the last three years. Swiatek is also the
  most recent woman to complete the Sunshine Double, winning Indian Wells and Miami back-to-back in 2022,
  an accomplishment achieved by only three other players Stefanie Graf (1994 and 1996), Kim Clijsters
  (2005) and Victoria Azarenka (2016).
- Sabalenka is aiming for her first Indian Wells singles title -- she was the runner-up to Rybakina in 2023.
   Sabalenka is a former Indian Wells doubles champion winning the Sunshine Double in doubles in 2019.
- Currently there are four Americans in the Top 10 of the PIF Race to WTA Finals leaderboard Madison Keys, Amanda Anisimova, Jessice Pegula and Emma Navarro. (Coco Gauff also sits at No.12). In addition to the Americans, early results from the first 2 months of the season, also positions familiar faces among the Top 8 with Sabalenka, Swiatek and Rybakina among the Top 8. Also some new players atop the Race Leaderboard with 17 year old Mirra Andreeva sitting at No.4 and Clara Tauson, the WTA aces leader, at No.5.
- Iga Swiatek (2022 & 2024) could become the first player since the inception of the Women's Singles tournament at Indian Wells in 1989 to win the title on three occasions, there have been 10 players who have won the title on multiple occasions; only Victoria Azarenka (2012 & 2016) and Swiatek are active among them.
- Svetlana Kuznetsova is the player to have appeared in the most finals in the Women's Singles at Indian Wells and to have failed to win the tournament (0-3); the women's player with the most finals at the tournament is Lindsay Davenport (6, 2-4).
- Since the inception of the women's singles event in 1989, Lindsay Davenport holds the most match wins of any player at Indian Wells with 47 victories, finishing her career with a record of 47-12 at the event.
- Victoria Azarenka (46) or Caroline Wozniacki (49) would become only the third player with 50 matches played at the Indian Wells Open after Lindsay Davenport (59) and Maria Sharapova (50) since 1989.
- Among those with a minimum of 15 matches at the event since 1989, Iga Swiatek has the best winning percentage at 90% (18-2).
- No player has more wins against top-10 in the Women's Singles at Indian Wells than Lindsay Davenport (7), among active players Victoria Azarenka (5) has the most.
- Since the event's inauguration in 1989, Monica Seles has conceded the fewest games en route to the women's singles title at the Indian Wells Open, dropping just 12 games in 1992. Elena Vesnina conceded the most, with 63 games dropped in 2017.
- Bianca Andreescu is the only wildcard to win the women's singles title at the Indian Wells Open, since the first
  edition in 1989. Andreescu is one of only two wildcards to win a WTA-1000 event along with Maria Sharapova
  (Cincinnati 2011), since the format was introduced in 2009.

- Maria Sharapova is the only player to win multiple women's singles titles at the Indian Wells Open without dropping a set, doing so in 2006 when she won her first title and then in 2013.
- Jenny Byrne is the only qualifier or lucky loser to reach the final at the Indian Wells Open, eventually losing to Manuela Maleeva in the event's inaugural edition in 1989, a lucky loser has never made it past the R16 at the Indian Wells Open.
- At 34y 148d, Martina Navratilova (1991) is the oldest player to claim the women's singles title at the Indian Wells Open, since the event's inauguration in 1989.
- Kim Clijsters between 2003-2010 has won the most consecutive matches in the Women's Singles main
- At 17y 165d, Martina Hingis (1998) is the youngest winner of the women's singles at the Indian Wells Open. Since 1989, Hingis is one of two players under the age of 18 to win the event, along with Serena Williams in 1999 (17y 168d).
- Victoria Azarenka will be making her 16th main draw appearance in the women's singles at the Indian Wells
  Open; since its inception in 1989, only Jelena Jankovic (16) has made as many women's singles main draw
  appearances at the event.
- The last time the first three WTA-1000 tournaments of the season was not won a top-10 player was in 2019 when Belinda Bencic won Dubai ranked 45, Bianca Andreescu won Indian Wells ranked 60 and Ashleigh Barty won Miami ranked 11.
- Kim Clijsters ranked 133 in 2005 remains the lowest ranked player to win the title at the Indian Wells since the inaugural of the Women's Singles edition in 1989.
- Clara Tauson with 15 wins is the player with the most wins during 2025 in WTA events, Iga Swatek and Madison Keys are the next best with 14 wins.
- Upon her return to active status, Petra Kvitova (currently on 274) can become only the second player to appear in 275+ WTA-1000 matches, after Victoria Azarenka since the format's introduction in 2009. Kvitova is the player with fourth most wins in WTA-1000 events since the format introduction in 2009 (180) after Victoria Azarenka (206), Simona Halep (186) and Caroline Wozniacki (183).
- Linda Noskova along with Elena Rybakina is the player with the most winners at the WTA-1000 events during 2025 (219 each).
- Since 2024, Aryna Sabalenka (29) could become the second player to register 30+ wins in WTA-1000 events along with Iga Swiatek (35).
- Mirra Andreeva at the Dubai Tennis Championships 2025 became the youngest player to win a WTA-1000 title, she also holds the record for the most wins in WTA-1000 before turning 18 (23).
- The defending champion has never lost her opening main draw match in the subsequent year at the Indian Wells Women's Singles event since it's inauguration in 1989.

### **ABOUT WTA 1000 LEVEL**

The WTA 1000 level was introduced in 2009 – originally as Premier Mandatory and Premier 5. Indian Wells is the 139th staging of a WTA 1000 overall. There are 10 WTA 1000 tournaments in 2025 – Doha, Dubai, Indian Wells, Miami, Madrid, Rome, Montreal, Cincinnati, Beijing and Wuhan.

Since the level was introduced, 47 different players have won a WTA 1000 titles led by Serena Williams (13), Victoria Azarenka (10), Iga Swiatek (10), Simona Halep (9) and Petra Kvitova (9).

This year, the two WTA 1000 titles – Doha (No.41 Amanda Anisimova) and Dubai (No.14 Mirra Andreeva) – have been won by players ranked outside the Top 10.

Since 2009, a Top 4 seed has won the title 64 times - 32 times by the No.1 seed, 9 by the No.2 seed, 11 times by the No.3 seed and 12 times by the No.4 seed. An unseeded player has won the title 21 times.

### BEST RESULTS BY QUALIFIERS

Twelve qualifiers will book their place in the main draw on Tuesday. The best result by a qualifier at Indian Wells was achieved by **Jenny Byrne** in 1989 – the Australian fell to **Manuela Maleeva** in the final of the event's inaugural staging. Notable runs by qualifiers\* here:

### **NO.1 SEEDS**

Aryna Sabalenka is the top seed at Indian Wells. The No.1 seed has won the title here 12 times, including last year (Swiatek). The top seed has lost in her opening match four times (w/1r bye) – 1989 (Evert, I. Mandlikova), 2002 (Clijsters, I. Dechy), 2010 (Kuznetsova, I. Suárez Navarro) and 2022 (Sabalenka, I. Paolini).

#### **DEFENDING RANKINGS POINTS DURING SUNSHINE DOUBLE**

During the Sunshine Double, Iga Swiatek is defending 1120 ranking points, the most during the swing, followed by Danielle Collins (1035 points), Marai Sakkari (865 points) and Elena Rybakina (650 points). - Twenty-four different players, from 16 countries, have won the singles title at Indian Wells
- Martina Navratilova (1990-91) is the only player to successfully defend the title
- The title has been won 22 times by a player who has held the WTA No.1 ranking at some point in her career.
   Of the former champions at Indian Wells, just eight have not held the No.1 ranking: Mary Joe Fernandez (1993/1995), Daniela Hantuchova (2002/2007), Manuela Maleeva-Fragniere (1989), Vera Zvonareva (2009), Flavia Pennetta (2014), Elena Vesnina (2017), Bianca Andreescu (2019) and Paula Badosa (2021)
- Serena Williams (1999), Kim Clijsters (2005), Naomi Osaka (2018) and Bianca Andreescu (2019) are the only players to win the title unseeded
- In 1998 Martina Hingis (17 years, 166 days) became the youngest champion; 1991 winner Martina Navratilova (34 years, 136 days) is the oldest
- The final has featured the Top 2 seeds six times (1991, 1996, 1998, 2000, 2008, 2012)
- The final has been decided in three sets 11 times (1990, 1993, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2005, 2011, 2015, 2017, 2019 and 2021)
- An American has won the singles title eight times, with the last American title at Indian Wells coming in 2001: home champions are Martina Navratilova (1990, 1991), Mary Joe Fernandez (1993, 1995), Lindsay Davenport (1997, 2000) and Serena Williams (1999, 2001)
- California-born **Davenport** is the most successful player in the tournament's history, winning more matches (47) and reaching more finals (6) than any other player
