[WC] Sara Errani (ITA #177) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #48)

Osaka leads 2-0

- Errani:
- Making 17th appearance at Rome, where her best result is R-Up run in 2014 (I. Serena Williams); one of two Italians to reach the Final at Rome, along with Raffaella Regi Concato in 1985
- Owns most wins (13) at Rome than any other WTA 1000 event in her career
- Has won 7 singles titles on clay: Rio De Janeiro in 2015; Acapulco in 2013; Palermo, Budapest, Barcelona, Acapulco in 2012; Palermo in 2008

Osaka:

- Making 6th appearance at Rome, where her best result was QF run in 2019 (I. Bertens)
- Has won both their previous tour-level meetings (2024 Indian Wells, 2016 Miami)
- Of her 72 match wins at WTA 1000 events, only 12 have come on clay and 6 of those at Rome

[Q] Antonia Ruzic (CRO #117) vs. [WC] Tyra Caterina Grant (ITA #335) First meeting Ruzic:

- Making debut appearance at Rome, having come through qualifying defeating Yuan and Niemeier
- Did not drop a set in qualifying
- Faces No.335 Tyra Caterina Grant in 1r today, bidding for second main draw win of season, after overcoming Mayar Sherif in Linz

Grant:

- Making debut appearance at Rome, this isjust her second Tour level main draw event, after 2025 Miami
- Elsewhere on Tour has fallen in 2024-25 Madrid qualifying and 2024 US Open qualifying
- Faces No.117 Antonia Ruzic in 1r today, bidding for first Tour level main draw win of career
- Current best win of career came over No.80 Maria in 2025 Madrid qualifying

[WC] Elisabetta Cocciaretto (ITA #82) vs. Elina Avanesyan (ARM #38) Cocciaretto leads 2-1 Cocciaretto:

- Has reached the 2r here twice, in 2023 and 2024

- Best results in 2024 were reaching SF at IP Brisbane (I. Sabalenka), Miami (I. Rybakina) and Berlin (I. Kalins@aya). Made SF at Australiam Open (I. Yastremska). In addition, reached QF another four times at Doha (I. eventual 2r champion Swiatek), Rome (I. Collins), Charleston (I. Pegula) and Washington DC (I. Sabalenka).
- Opgned 2023, with QF at Adelaide 1 (l. Noskova) before reaching semifinal at Australian Open (l. Rylakina). Mader4r at Wimbledon (l. Svitolina) and 2r at US Open before earning a QF finish at Guadalajara (l. Garcia)
- Standout result in 2022 was SF in last tournament of her season, at Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Pegula). Also reached QFs at Washington DC and Adelaide, while made R16 at Australian Open and US Open
- Best result in 2021 came in final event when she finished R-Up at Indian Wells (l. Badosa on third set tie-break). Also made SFs at Doha and Bad Homburg
- One of five players to reach three or more finals in 2020, lifting one trophy at the Western & Southern Open - her first title since 2016.
 Finished year ranked No.13 - her best seasonend ranking since 2013 (No.2)
- Advanced to her fifth career Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, which helped her return to the Top 20 for the first time since March 2017
- Winner of the 2020 WTA Comeback Player of the Year Award, as voted on by members of the international media
- Last tournament of 2019 was the US Open, where she fell to Sabalenka in 1r; also reached the doubles final w/Barty (l. Mertens/Sabalenka)
- Highlight of 2019 was 37th singles final at Monterrey (l. Muguruza in F via ret. w/leg injury).


