Paolini:

- Making sixth appearance at Rome, where her previous best result was reaching 3r in 2020 (l. eventual champion Halep)
- Career-best result at WTA 1000 events was title run at Dubai 2024 (d. Kalinskaya in Final)
- Won only previous meeting with Shnaider at 2024 Australian Open
- First Italian woman to reach QF since her current doubles partner reached the final (Sara Errani, 2014)
- Since the format's introduction in 2009, Paolini is only the second Italian to reach WTA 1000 QFs on hard and clay court in single season (Sara Errani, 2013-14)
- Holds 17-1 record after taking first set - 15 of those wins have come in straight sets

Shnaider:

- Making second appearance at Rome, where her previous result was reaching 3r in 2024 (l. Badosa)
- Bidding to reach first career SF at WTA 1000 event; has now equaled career-best result by reaching QF (Toronto 2024)
- Owns just one career win over a Top 10 player - No.2 Coco Gauff at Toronto 2024
- Best career result on clay is lifting the title at Budapest in 2024 (d. Sasnovich in Final)
- Is the left-handed player with the most matches won in 2025 (14)
- Will enter the Top 10 for the first time in her career if she wins the title in Rome

Peyton Stearns (USA #42) vs. [16] Elina Svitolina (UKR #14)

First meeting

Stearns:

- Has reached her first quarterfinal of 2025
- First player in the Open Era to win back-to-back matches at Rome via a third-set tie break: vs Madison Keys (2-6 6-2 7-6) and Naomi Osaka (6-4 3-6 7-6)
- Is currently ranked No.42; will reach a new career-high ranking on Monday, May 19
- Looking to reach her third career WTA level semifinal after Bogota in 2023 and Rabat 2024, all on clay courts; could become the first American player in the last 45 years to reach all her first three WTA-level semifinals on clay court
- Equaled her best career result in a single WTA-1000 event by reaching the quarterfinals (also at the Canadian Open 2024, lost to the eventual champion Jessica Pegula)

Svitolina:

- Is a two-time champion here (2017 & 2018); is the only former champion remaining in the draw
- Among current players, only Victoria Azarenka (seven) has made more quarterfinals at Rome than Svitolina (five)
- Has made the quarterfinals in three consecutive tournament appearances (Rouen, Madrid and Rome) for the first time since August-September 2021 (Chicago 1, US Open and Chicago 2)
- Equaled Iga Swiatek (23) for quarterfinals reached in WTA 1000 events; amongst players currently ranked in the Top 100 only Victoria Azarenka (38) and Aryna Sabalenka (28) have more
- Owns the most clay court wins of any player this season (12)
- Will reenter the Top 10 rankings if she wins the title in Rome; the last time she was ranked in the Top 10 was the week of October 25, 2021

CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakout 2024 season saw her win the biggest title of her career at WTA 1000 Dubai and also reach her first Grand Slam finals, finishing R-Up at Roland-Garros and Wimbledon. Qualified for her first WTA Finals in singles and doubles, broke into the Top 10 for the first time in her career and finished the season as the World No.4
- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (L. Mertens). Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (L. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (L. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (L. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (L. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (L. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (L. eventual champion Garcia)
- Also reached QF at Lyon (L. Yastremska), Portoroz (L. eventual champion Siniakova) and Parma (L. Kovinic)
- Broke into Top 50 on January 31, 2021
- Posted near-Top 50 season finish in 2021 after capturing first WTA singles title of career at Portoroz (d. Riske in F)
- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur (L. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (L. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (L. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (L. Golubic) Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg(w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and US Open, equalling best previous Slam result
- In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (L. Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (L. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15
- Won first four titles of career in 2024 across all three surfaces; WTA 500 Bad Homburg and WTA 250s Hua Hin, Budapest and Hong Kong. Reached her first Grand Slam 3r at 2024 Wimbledon and advanced to R16 at 2024 US Open
- Cracked into the Top 20 on August 12, 2024, where she stayed for the rest of the year finishing the season at World No.13
- Also in 2024, won the Paris Olympic silver medal in women's doubles with Mirra Andreeva
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2023 Australian Open (as qualifier, L. Sakkari in 3s) and Roland Garros 2023 (L. Haddad Maia)
- Won WTA 125K Series title in Montevideo, Uruguay last November to end 2022 just outside Top 100
- Overall win-loss record in 2022 was 56-17; reached four ITF Circuit finals, highlighted by a 15-match, three tournament winning streak, culminating with a W60 title in Istanbul
- Last season only Tour-level outing was qualifying exit at St. Petersburg
- Won first ITF Circuit tournament at W15 event in Antalya in late 2021
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Moscow
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior matches on ITF Circuit towards end of 2020
- As junior, made SF at Roland Garros in 2021 and US Open in 2022. Also won girls' doubles at three of the four majors and reached No.2 in the ITF rankings

- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three times
- Part of Italy's Billie Jean King Cup team 2017-19

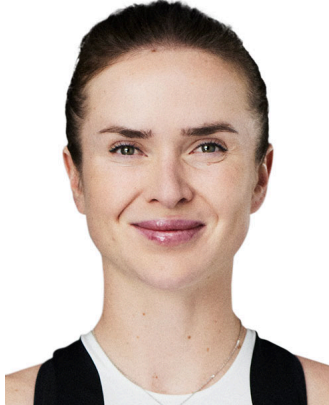

CAREER MILESTONES

- Posted first Top 50 season finish in 2024 (No.48), having won maiden title at Rabat (d. Sherif in F). Advanced to QF at Toronto (l. eventual champion Pegula) and Cleveland (l. Siniakova); reached 3r at Roland Garros (l. M.Andreeva) and US Open (l. Vekic).
- In 2023 advanced to first WTA career singles final at Bogota (l. Maria). Reached R16 at home Slam (US Open) □ l. Vondrousova. Also reached 3r at Roland Garros (d. former champion Ostapenko in 2r, l. Kasatkina). Broke into Top 50 for first time in September following the US Open.
- Finished 2022 season with 33-15 win-loss record (across all levels), reaching three ITF Circuit finals, including W25 titles at Austin and Florence

- Achieved runner-up in her opening tournament of 2024 at Auckland (l. Gauff in F) before finishing R16 at Australian Open (l. Noskova, retired due to low back injury). Reached QF at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina), 4r at Roland Garros (l. Rybakina) and 3r at US Open (l. Gauff). Ended season after US Open
- Returned to the Tour in April 2023, following birth of daughter Skai. Won Strasbourg (d. Blinkova) for a second time (also in 2020) before achieving Grand Slam results of QF at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka) and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- 2022 season reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Azarenka) and QF at Monterrey (l. Osorio), before going on maternity leave in spring
- Highlight of 2021 was lifting 16th career title at Chicago [250]. Also made SF at Miami, Stuttgart and the Olympics (won bronze medal)
- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F)
