This will be the 82nd edition of the Italian Open, and the 56th since the tournament became open to professional players in 1969. The tournament was not held in 1986.

Chris Evert has won the most titles at the Italian Open, winning on five occasions. Conchita Martinez, Gabriela Sabatini and Serena Williams are the next best, winning the event on four occasions respectively.

Serena Williams (44) has the most women's singles match wins at the Italian Open in the Open Era, with Conchita Martinez (43) registering the next most over that span - Victoria Azarenka is the current player with the most (28).

Serena Williams and Conchita Martinez (53 each) are the only two players in the Open Era to appear in 50+ women's singles matches at the Italian Open.

Chris Evert has made the most women's singles finals of any player in the Open Era at the Italian Open, holding a 5-2 record out of seven appearances. Gabriela Sabatini has made the next most over that span, holding a 4-2 record from six finals.

At 16 years and 152 days, Tracy Austin (1979) is the youngest player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at the Italian Open. Austin is one of seven players to win the event before turning 18, along with Temesvari (1983), Maleeva (1984), Graf (1987), Sabatini (1988), Seles (1990) and Hingis (1998).

At 34 years and 231 days, Serena Williams (2016) is the oldest player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at the Italian Open. Williams is the only player in that span to win the event after turning 30, doing so on three occasions (2013, 2014 and 2016).

Martina Navratilova has appeared in the most finals at the Italian Open without winning the event, losing in four respective finals (1974, 1975, 1990 and 1994).

Conchita Martinez is the only player male or female to win the Italian Open on four consecutive occasions in the history of the event, doing so between 1993 and 1996.

Iga Swiatek became last season the third player to win their 10th WTA-1000 title since the format's introduction in 2009 after Serena Williams and Victoria Azarenka.

Only three players have won the Women's Singles titles in Madrid and Rome in the same season after Dinara Safina (2009), Serena Williams (2013) and Iga Swiatek (2024) - all did it as World No. 1.

Iga Swiatek is one of the five players in the Open Era to win multiple titles at the Italian Open without a single set dropped (2022 and 2024) along with Evert, Sabatini, Martinez and Serena Williams.

Among players with multiple appearances at the event in the Open Era, Chris Evert holds the best winning percentage at the Italian Open (92.3%) - Iga Swiatek (90.9%) has the second-best.

Alize Cornet is the only qualifier to reach the women's singles final of the Italian Open in the Open Era, losing to Jelena Jankovic in the 2008 final. A wild card or lucky loser has not achieved this feat.

Mary Pierce (1995) and Serena Williams (2010) are the only wild cards to reach the women's singles semi-final of the Italian Open in the Open Era, though the two were also seeded second and first in respective years.

1	-	Aryna Sabalenka	Has reached six finals already this year – the most finals reached in a season before the French Open since 2013 (Serena Williams, 6); has won 3 titles – Brisbane, Miami, Madrid
2	_	Madison Keys	Australian Open champion; also won title at Adelaide – first season with 2 titles since 2019
3	-	Mirra Andreeva	Became youngest player to win a WTA 1000 title having won a pair of WTA 1000 titles – Dubai, Indian Wells
4	-	Iga Swiatek	Although yet to win a title in 2025 – has been a model of consistency, reaching the QF stage at all 8 events she has played (including United Cup); Swiatek has reached the semifinals at three WTA 1000 events – Doha, Indian Wells and Madrid – in addition to Australian Open
5	-	Jessica Pegula	Has won titles at Austin and Charleston and also reached finals at Adelaide and Miami; only Sabalenka has reached more finals in 2025
6	+6	Coco Gauff	A finalist in Madrid, Gauff has compiled the third most race points on clay since 2022 behind only Swiatek and Sabalenka
7	+9	Elina Svitolina	Entered European clay-court swing at No.17 on Leaderboard. Since has won a clay-court title at WTA 250 Rouen and a semifinal run in Madrid moves into Top 8. Svitolina is a two-time champion at Rome
8	-	Ekaterina Alexandrova	Won a WTA 500 title at Linz and also a three-time semifinalist this year – Doha, Charleston and Stuttgart
9	-2	Emma Navarro	Won a WTA 500 title at Merida; also reached quarterfinal at Australian Open as well as Adelaide and Charleston
10	-4	Amanda Anisimova	Won WTA 1000 title at Doha, also reaching semifinal at Charleston
