Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #49) vs. [WC] Marina Stakusic (CAN #142)

First Meeting

Cristian:

- Making tournament main draw debut today
- Best result on on hard courts to date came during a runner-up run at Linz in 2021 (I. Riske-Amritraj)
- Had a successful clay swing this season which saw her reach the Rabat final (I. Joint) and the lasi semifinal (I. eventual champion Begu)
- Currently ranked at No.49, her new career-high

Stakusic:

- Making second appearance at this tournament, where she fell in the second round in 2024 (I. Townsend)
- Seeking second career win over a Top 50 player (defeated Jelena Ostapenko at Guadalajara 2024)
- Best results on hard courts also came at Guadalajara 2024, where she reached the QF (I. eventual champion Frech)
- Aiming for her second win of 2025 at Tour-level today
- Currently the Canadian No.4 behind Fernandez, Mboko and Marino

Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #65) vs. Alexandra Eala (PHI #69)

First Meeting

Vondrousova:

- Making second appearance at this tournament (reached 3r in 2023, where she lost to Coco Gauff)
- Best result by a player representing Czech Republic was Petra Kvitova's title run in 2012; representing Czechoslovakia, Regina Marsikova won in 1977 and 1978, and Helena Sukova was victorious in 1986.
 Additionally, Martina Navratilova won the title three times, representing the United States
- Won one title so far in 2025, on grass at Berlin (d. Wang Xinyu in final)
- Owns one title on hard courts, at Biel in 2017 (as a qualifier; d. Kontaveit in final)

Eala:

- Making main draw debut here
- First player from the Philippines to compete in main draw at this event
- Reached her first Tour-level final this year at Eastbourne (as a qualifier; I. Joint in final)
- Won four out of her last six matches against Grand Slam singles champions (Ostapenko at 2025
 Eastbourne and Swiatek, Keys, and Ostapenko at 2025 Miami; only losses came to Swiatek at 2025 Madrid
 and Krejcikova at 2025 Wimbledon)

Kimberly Birrell (AUS #76) vs. [WC] Victoria Mboko (CAN #88)

First Meeting

Birrell:

- Making second main draw appearance at this tournament; fell in 1r in 2023 to Wozniacki
- Best result on hard courts came during a run to the finals at Osaka 2024 (I. Lamens)
- One of four players from Australia in main draw (w/Kasatkina, Joint, and Tomljanovic); most Australians in this tournament's main draw since 1992
- Owns two quarterfinal appearances on hard courts this year, at Brisbane (I. Kalinina) and Singapore (I. eventual runner-up Li)

Mboko:

- Making tournament main draw debut
- Currently ranked No.88, two spots off her career-high ranking of No.86 (achieved July 14, 2025); is the Canadian No.2, behind Fernandez
- One of nine players from Canada in the main draw (w/Stakusic, Andreescu, Fernandez, Marino, Cross, Branstine, Bouchard, and Arseneault)
- Youngest Canadian in the main draw at 18yrs old

[WC] Bianca Andreescu (CAN #188) vs. Barbora Krejcikova (CZE #78) Krejcikova leads 1-0

Andreescu:

- Making seventh appearance at event, where she is a former champion (2019; d. S.Williams in final)
- One of two Canadian women to win their home title in the Open Era Faye Urban d. Vicki Berner in all-Canadian final in 1969
- All her career titles have come on hard courts, and all in 2019: Indian Wells, Toronto, and US Open
- Best result of 2025 came during a run to the quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Ruse)

Krejcikova:

- Former doubles champion at this tournament (2019, w/Siniakova)
- Has never advanced past first round in singles here (I. Zhang in 2018 and Ka.Pliskova in 2022)
- Won only prior match against Andreescu in qualifying at 2017 Linz
- Playing in just her sixth tournament of 2025

[Q] Elsa Jacquemot (FRA #96) vs. [WC] Rebecca Marino (CAN #118)

First Meeting

Jacquemot:

- Making main draw debut at tournament
- Defeated Canada's Carol Zhao in qualifying to advance to the main draw
- One of three Frenchwomen in main draw (also Gracheva and Jeanjean); all three came through qualifying
- Best results by qualifiers at this event were semifinalist runs by Marie Bouzkova in 2019, Kristina Kucova in 2016, and Yan Zi in 2007

- A strong 2024 season began with semifinal at Cluj-Napoca followed by a further three quarterfinals at Charleston, Palermo and Iasi taking her ranking to a career high of No.57 in July
- In 2023 reached semifinal at Prague (l. Hibino) and also WTA 125 semifinals at Bucharest and Rouen.
- Suffered knee injury in 2r match at Doha 2022 against Kasatkina and took the next six months off
- Ended 2021 campaign in fine form, reaching SF at Nur-Sultan (l. eventual champion Van Uytvanck), QF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Halep) before finishing R-Up at Linz (l. Riske)
- Broke into Top 100 on November 8, 2021
- Advanced to maiden WTA QF at 2021 St. Petersburg (l. Kuznetsova)
- Season highlight in 2020 was 2r run at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Kenin)
- Made debut for Romania in Billie Jean King Cup in 2020, winning singles rubber against Kudermetova during 3-2 qualifying defeat to
- In 2019, posted 2r showing at Bucharest (l. Rybakina), also fell 1r at Nanchang (as qualifier, l. Golubic)
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bucharest (d. Kozlova. l. eventual champion Begu)
- In 2016, compiled a 46-18 win-loss record, lifting five titles on ITF Circuit and rising 400 places in rankings
- Contested maiden WTA qualifying at 2015 Bucharest
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Europe in 2012

- In 2024 won first WTA 125K title at Tampico and reached first career WTA quarterfinal at Guadalajara. Also made Grand Slam main draw debut at Wimbledon coming through qualifying; played first Grand Slam qualifying at 2024 Roland Garros
- Broke into Top 200 on May 20, 2024 and Top 150 on August 12, 2024
- Ended 2023 season with breakthrough performance as part of the Canada team who won the Billie Jean King Cup Finals. Went 3-1 in singles notching up wins against No.64 Masarova, No.63 Frech and No.42 Trevisan.
- In 2023 also lifted three ITF singles titles and improved her ranking to a peak of No.258
- Played first full season in 2022 which included two WTA level tournaments; entered Toronto (WTA 1000) qualifying as a wild card and reached 2r main draw at WTA 250 Granby (as qualifier, l. Kostyuk)

Began professional career at ITF \$25K Denver in 2019 at the age of 14

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 reached QF at Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek); further highlights included semifinal at Stuttgart and quarterfinals at Strasbourg and Dubai. Ended her season after Wimbledon through shoulder injury
- Following injury issues in second half of 2022, bounced back in 2023 for best-ever season, winning debut Slam title at Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F - becoming the first unseeded player in the open era to claim the Wimbledon title), making Top 10 debut and qualifying for first WTA Finals.
- Best result of 2022 season was SF run at Dubai (withdrew prior to match vs. w/right adductor injury). Missed most of second half of the season due to left wrist injury, returning in October to play a few ITF Circuit events and Billie Jean King Cup Finals
- Finished 2021 with SF runs at Luxembourg, Chicago [500] and Moscow
- Won silver medal in singles at Olympics in Tokyo (l. Bencic)
- Opened 2021 campaign with SF at Yarra Valley Classic before R16 showing at Australian Open
- Highlights of 2020 include defeating No.6
 Svitolina to reach SFs at Rome (l. Ka.Pliskova) as well as a QF run to kick off the season at Adelaide (l. No.1 Barty)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2019, reaching three finals across the year and posting careerhigh ranking of No.14 on July 1, 2019
- Finished R-Up at Budapest (l. Van Uytvanck) and Istanbul (l. Martic) before reaching championship match at Roland Garros (l. Barty); did not drop a set en route to final in Paris
- Ranked No.38, was joint-third lowest-ranked woman to reach Roland Garros final, and aged 19, was first teenager to reach title match there since Ivanovic in 2007

- Following a nine-month absence through back injury, she returned in May 2024 at Roland Garros reaching third round (l. Paolini). She then achieved runner-up at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Samsonova) and went on to make QF at Tokyo (l. Boulter) and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Paolini)
- Her 2023 season highlight was a SF run at Hua Hin (l. Tsurenko)
- In 2022 reached the final at Bad Homburg (l. Garcia) and QF at Rome (l. Swiatek); finished in the Top 50 for the fourth consecutive season

- Lifted maiden Grand Slam title at 2019 US Open (d. S.Williams in F), becoming the first Canadian woman to win a major singles title in the Open Era and breaking into the Top 5 for the first time after the tournament on Sept. 9 - had not advanced past 2r at a Slam before then
- Was the first home representative to lift the women's singles title at 2019 Rogers Cup since 1969 when Urban d. Berner in all-Canadian final (d. S.Williams in F; ret. w/ upper back injury)
- Shoulder injury forced her to miss entire 2019 grass swing
- Won maiden career title at 2019 Indian Wells (d. No.6 Svitolina in SF and No.8 Kerber in F) - was fourth unseeded woman and first wildcard to lift the title at Indian Wells
- Made first WTA final at 2019 at Auckland finishing R-Up as a qualifier (d. Wozniacki and V.Williams, l. Goerges)
- Produced first WTA QF run at 2017 Washington DC (l. Petkovic). As wildcard, defeated Giorgi and world No.13 Mladenovic in 2r to become first player born in 21st century to register a Top 20 win
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Wimbledon coming through qualifying (l. Kucova in 1r) - later that year, earned first WTA win in 1r of Quebec City (d. Brady, l. Hradecka)

- Finished the 2024 season at No.10 in the year-end rankings, her second consecutive year-end Top 10 finish; lone singles title in 2024 came at Wimbledon; over the first six months of the season, won just 7 matches, including 4 at the Australian Open; qualified for the WTA Finals as a Grand Slam champion, securing the final qualifying spot where she advanced to SF (l. - Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Québec City (w/Mestach)
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2014 Luxembourg (w/Hradecka, l. Bacsinszky/Barrois)


