First Meeting

Rakhimova:

- Making main draw debut appearance here, as a qualifier
- Defeated Australia's Astra Sharma in qualifying to advance to the main draw
- Best result by a qualifier at this event was a SF run by Marie Bouzkova in 2019, Kristina Kucova in 2016, Zi Yan in 2007
- Best result of 2025 came during 3r at Wimbledon (I. Noskova)

Cross:

- Making main draw debut appearance at this tournament, as a wildcard
- Best career result on hard court is a main draw appearance at Granby 2022, where she played her first and only Tour-level match
- First time nine players from Canada reached the main draw here
- Best result by a wildcard here were Champion runs by Monica Seles in 1997 and 1995
- Looking to earn first Tour-level match win of the 2025 season

Elena-Gabriela Ruse (ROU #58) vs. Emma Raducanu (GBR #33)

Raducanu leads 1-0

Ruse:

- Making first appearance at this tournament
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is her runner-up showing at 2023 Cluj-Napoca (I. Korpatsch)
- Owns 10 Tour-level wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.44 McCartney Kessler at Roland Garros 2025
- Best results by a Romanian woman at this tournament are Simona Halep's three titles in 2016, 2018 and 2022

Raducanu:

- Making second appearance at this tournament; lost 1r at Toronto in 2022 (I. defending champion Giorgi)
- Opened this year's North American summer hard-court swing by reaching her first SF of the year in Washington (I. Kalinskaya)
- Her one Tour-level singles title has come on hard court: the 2021 US Open (first qualifier to win a Grand Slam title in Open Era)
- Owns 3-0 career tour-level record against players from Romania (1 win each over Ruse, Bogdan and Cirstea in tour-level main draws)
- Career-best performance at a WTA 1000 event was making QF at 2025 Miami (I. eventual finalist Pegula)

[Q] Ariana Arseneault (CAN #515) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #49)**First Meeting****Arseneault:**

- This weekend, as a wild card entry into qualifying, defeated Destanee Aiava to make her Hologic WTA Tour main-draw debut
- •At this tournament, previously lost to Christina McHale in qualifying at the 2019 Toronto edition
- This is her 2nd career match vs. a Top 100 player (l. No.99 Kirsten Flipkens at a 2019 ITF Challenger event in Toronto)
- Is currently ranked No.515; this time last year was ranked No.1246. Posted career-high ranking of No.511 last week

Osaka:

- Making 6th main-draw appearance at this tournament; her career-best tournament showing is QF at Toronto 2019 (l. eventual finalist S. Williams)
- Osaka is 10-1 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (only loss was to then-No.294 Bencic at Australian Open)
- All of her 7 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, including her 4 Grand Slam titles (2018 and 2020 US Open; 2019 and 2021 Australian Open)
- Has won 2 WTA 1000 titles in her career (2018 Indian Wells and 2019 Beijing)
- Reached World No.1 ranking for the first time in 2019, and has spent a total of 25 weeks at the top of the PIF WTA Rankings throughout her career

[WC] Eugenie Bouchard (CAN) vs. Emiliana Arango (COL #82)**First meeting****Bouchard:**

- Announced she plans to retire from professional tennis following this event
- Making 10th main-draw appearance at this tournament; her career-best tournament showing is R16 in 2016
- This is Bouchard's first tour-level singles match of the year; her only other singles match this year was at WTA 125 Newport earlier this month (l. 1r to Anna Rogers)
- Reached career-high ranking of World No.5 in 2014, the same year she reached a Grand Slam final at Wimbledon (l. Kvitova)
- Career-best showing at a WTA 1000 event was finishing runner-up at 2014 Wuhan (l. Kvitova)

Arango:

- Making her tournament debut this week
- Holds 13-10 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is a runner-up finish at 2025 Merida (l. Navarro)
- So far in this year's North American summer hard-court swing, fell in final round of Washington qualifying (l. eventual quarterfinalist Townsend)
- Career-best showing at a WTA 1000 event was reaching QF at 2023 Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Sakkari)

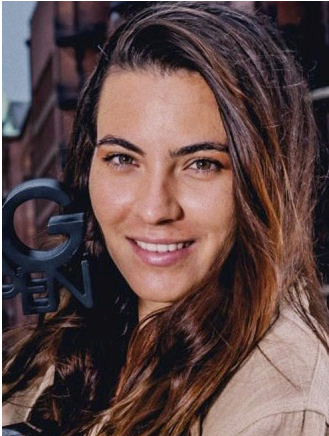

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlight of 2024 season was reaching first career Grand Slam third round at US Open earning second Top 10 win of career by beating No.8 Barbora Krejčíková in the second round; also reached quarterfinals at Rouen and semifinals at WTA 125 Paris and WTA 125 Hamburg
- 2023 highlight was reaching third WTA singles final of career, on home soil at Cluj-Napoca (L. Korpatsch)
- In 2022, reached 2r on nine occasions, including Australian Open (L. Kudermetova) and US Open (L. Gauff)
- During 2021 season, captured maiden WTA title at Hamburg (d. Petkovic in F) and finished R-Up at Palermo (L. Collins) - entered both tournaments as a qualifier
- Made Top 100 debut at No.99 on September 20, 2021
- Ended 2020 with her deepest ITF Circuit run of the season, at \$100k Dubai-UAE. Also reached two QFs at this level and fell in final round of qualifying at both Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Advanced to maiden WTA QF at 2019 Nottingham (as qualifier, L. Garcia)
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Wimbledon (as qualifier, L. A.Radwanska in 3s)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2016 Bucharest and scored first Tour-level win of career at 2017 Bucharest (d. Shinikova, L. Suarez Navarro)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2015 Bucharest
- Owner of six singles and 10 doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Played first professional events of career in Romania on ITF circuit in 2012
- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made fourth round of Indian Wells (L. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023.

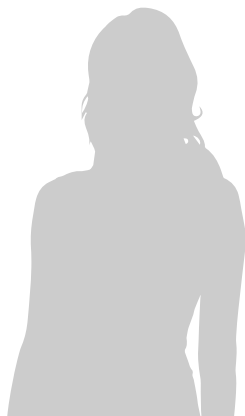

CAREER MILESTONES

- Key result of 2024 was reaching Indian Wells final for the second time, losing to Swiatek who also defeated her in 2022 final. Also reached SF at Charleston (L. Collins). Did not play after US Open
- Won first WTA 1000 title in 2023 at Guadalajara (d. Dolehide in F). Also finished R-Up at Washington (L. Gauff). Contested WTA Finals for third consecutive season (was first alternate and went 0-3 in Group Stage following Muchova withdrawal).
- Finished 2022 ranked No.6 for the second consecutive year; a four-time finalist in 2022 including runs to the final at two WTA 1000 tournaments - Indian Wells and Guadalajara [1000]; returned to the WTA Finals advancing to the semifinals, falling to eventual champion Caroline Garcia.
- Climbed as high as No.3 in the rankings (March 21, 2022), the highest ranking ever achieved by a Greek woman.
- Historic 2021 season was highlighted by her becoming first Greek woman to break into the Top 10 (at No.10, September 27) as well as the first from her country to qualify for the WTA Finals.
- In 2021, also reached third WTA final at Ostrava (L. Kontaveit), while advanced to SF at Roland-Garros, US Open - defeating three Top-20 ranked opponents at both events - and WTA Finals in Guadalajara
- Posted a Tour-leading nine Top-10 wins in 2021, including two over the World No.2 (Osaka at Miami and No.2 Sabalenka at WTA Finals)
- Broke into Top 20 on February 24, 2020 for first time, at No.20
- Scored third and fourth Top-5 wins of her career in 2020, over No.5 Svitolina at Ostrava and No.5 Bencic at St. Petersburg. Previous wins came over No.5 Ka.Pliskova (2018 Rome) and No.5 Kvitova (2019 Rome, via ret.)
- Upset No.10 seed Keys to reach the R16 for the first time at one of the four Slams, at 2020 Australian Open (L. Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2019 for first time in career (fell in RR stage). That season won maiden WTA title at Rabat, recovering from a set and break down to defeat Konta in final
- Highlights of 2018 were reaching her first tour-level final at San Jose (L. Buzarnescu) and scoring maiden Top-5 win over No.5 Ka.Pliskova in 2r at Rome
- In 2025, finished R-Up at Cancun 125 (as qualifier, L. Arango in F)

- Notched first Top-10 victory of career over No.6 Wozniacki en route to first WTA SF of career at 2017 Wuhan
- Broke into Top 50 for first time at No.49 on October 9, 2017
- At 2016 Australian Open, by reaching 2r (d. Y.Wang, l. Suarez Navarro) became the first woman from Greece to win a main draw match at a Slam since Daniilidou d. Ka.Pliskova at 2013 Australian Open
- Reached first career WTA QF at 2016 Istanbul (as qualifier, l. Kovinic)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open (as qualifier, l. Q.Wang)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2012 Palermo
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2010; owns seven ITF Circuit singles titles and five in doubles

- Parents are Konstantinos and Angeliki; brother is Yannis (studies at Boston University) and sister is Amanda. Introduced to tennis by parents at age 6; mother played on WTA; achieved a Top 50 singles ranking
