MATCH NOTES – DAY 5 – THURSDAY, JULY 31

[24] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #28) vs. [15] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #18) **Kasatkina leads 4-3**

Kostyuk:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at this tournament, where she has equaled her best result after also reaching the 3r in 2024 (l. Emma Navarro)
- After a 1r bye, has beaten Marketa Vondrousova so far this week, snapping her six-match winless streak
- Owns 12 wins in her career over Top 20 players, with her most recent such victory coming against then-No.15 Daria Kasatkina at Rome this year
- Looking to win consecutive matches for first time since winning three straight to advance to the QF at Rome in 2025

Kasatkina:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was reaching QF in 2023 (l. Elena Rybakina) and 2016 (l. Angelique Kerber)
- After a 1r bye, has beaten Anna Blinkova so far this week, representing her 11th main draw victory at this tournament. Rome (17) and Indian Wells (15) are the only other WTA 1000-level events where she has more wins
- Holds a 2-1 record on hard court against Kostyuk, winning their most recent such match at Brisbane in 2024
- Owns six career titles on hard court, most recently Ningbo in 2024

[1] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. Veronika Kudermetova (#42) **Gauff leads 2-1**

Gauff:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was reaching QF in 2023 (l. eventual champion - Jessica Pegula), 2022 (l. eventual champion - Simona Halep) and 2021 (l. eventual champion - Camila Giorgi)
- After a 1r bye, has beaten Danielle Collins so far this week, her first win since her Champion run at Roland Garros
- Is the No. 1 seed this week; has been top seed at five tournaments in her career, including this tournament last year
- Looking to become the first No.1 seed to win this tournament since Simona Halep in 2018

Kudermetova:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at this tournament, where she has equaled her best result after also reaching Round of 32 in 2021
- Has beaten Cristina Bucsa and Olga Danilovic so far this week, representing the first time she has won consecutive matches on hard court since winning three straight in her run to the 4r at Australian Open in 2025

- Owns 16 wins in her career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Jessica Pegula in the Final at Tokyo in 2023 (her lone career hard court title)
- Seeking her first main draw win against a No.1 seed in a Tour-level event since she defeated Iga Swiatek at Tokyo in 2023

[WC] Victoria Mboko (CAN #85) vs. Marie Bouzkova (CZE #39)

First meeting

Mboko:

- Making main-draw debut at this tournament
- 1 of 9 Canadians to have contested this week's main draw, and the only one to reach the 3rd round
- Owns 5 total wins in career over Top 50 players (4 of those at tour-level), most recently No.27 Sofia Kenin in the previous round
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.85; this time last year was ranked No.358
- Hit 15 aces in her 1r match and 12 aces in her 2r match

Bouzkova:

- Making 6th appearance at this tournament; in her 2019 tournament debut, she made the SF as a qualifier ranked World No.91 (l. S. Williams)
- Currently on a 7-match winning streak; last week, she won her 2nd career WTA singles title in her birthplace of Prague (d. Noskova in final)
- Contesting her 34th career WTA 1000 main draw; she is a 2-time WTA 1000 semifinalist (2019 Toronto and 2022 Guadalajara)
- Holds 12-2 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 75

[9] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #12) vs. Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #52)

Tied 1-1

Rybakina:

- Making her 4th appearance at this tournament; her career-best and most recent tournament showing is the 2023 SF (l. Samsonova)
- Contesting her 38th career WTA 1000 main draw; she is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion (2023 Indian Wells and 2023 Rome)
- 4 of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2020 Hobart, 2023 Indian Wells, 2024 Brisbane and 2024 Abu Dhabi)
- This year, holds an 18-3 record vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- So far, is 3-1 during the 2025 North American summer hard-court season (made Washington SF last week, l. eventual champion Fernandez)

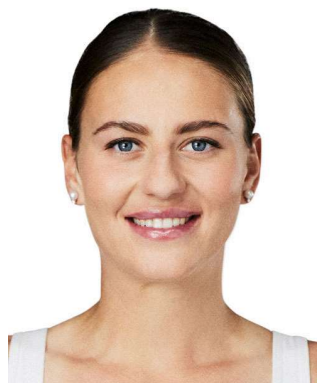
Cristian:

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached two WTA 500 finals in 2024 at San Diego and Stuttgart finishing runner-up at both. Also made first Grand Slam quarterfinal at Australian Open and first WTA 1000 semifinal at Indian Wells.
- Earned five Top 10 wins in 2024, entered the year with only three in career and made Top 20 debut on May 6, 2024 finishing the year at No.18
- In 2023, won maiden singles title at Austin (d. Gracheva) and doubles title at Birmingham (w/Krejčíková).

Reached QF at two WTA 500 events; Adelaide 1 (l. Jabeur) and Washington (l. Samsonova). Achieved a peak singles ranking of No. 32 on August 7, 2023 and No. 27 in doubles on May 8, 2023

- Best result of 2022 was SF showing at Granby (l. Saville). Also made 3r at Australian Open and Eastbourne
- Highlights of second half of 2021 were QF at Chicago [250] (l. Gracheva) and SF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Halep); broke into Top 50 on November 1, 2021, after Cluj-Napoca
- On clay, enjoyed career-best R16 run at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) and advanced to SF at Istanbul (l. eventual champion Cirstea)
- Opened 2021 by reaching first career WTA SF, at Abu Dhabi (l. Kudermetova)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.97 on November 2, 2020, after reaching back-to-back finals on ITF Circuit in US
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s)
- In February 2020, picked up third ITF singles title of career, at a \$60k event in Cairo
- Season highlight in 2019 was reaching first WTA QF, at Strasbourg (l. Garcia)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Australian Open and reached 3r, having received a WC into the qualifying event by virtue of winning the junior title there in 2017 (d. Masarova in F). Was first player born in 2002 to play in a Grand Slam main draw. Was also youngest player to reach the 3r at a major since 1997 US Open when Mirjana Lucic-Baroni (15 years, 182 days) reached this stage
- Scored two Top 50 wins in 2018, over No.27 Peng (Australian Open), No.26 Gavrilova (Fed Cup)
- Won first ITF Circuit title of career at \$25k ITF/Dunakeszi-HUN in 2017 (d. Pera in F)
- Played first WTA qualifying at 2017 Mallorca (l. Kalinskaya in 1r)

- Finished the 2024 season ranked No.9 (2nd career Top 10 finish) in a season highlighted by winning titles at Ningbo and Eastbourne, while also finishing as runner-up at Seoul, Adelaide, Abu Dhabi and Charleston; won a Tour-best 26 matches at the WTA 500 level (next most was 15 (Rybalkina); as an alternate at WTA Finals, lost one match in group play (l. Swiatek)
- Finished R-Up at two tournaments in 2023 at Adelaide 2 (l. Bencic) and Eastbourne (l. Keys); reached SFs at Charleston, Zhengzhou, and WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam SF at Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and won titles at San Jose (d. Rogers in F) and Granby (d. Saville in F); returned to Top 10 on August 8, after San Jose run
- Qualified for WTA Finals for the first time at Fort Worth in 2022 going 1-2 in group play
- Broke back into Top 50 in early 2021, after lifting first titles since 2018, at the Phillip Island Trophy in Melbourne (d. Bouzkova in F) and then St. Petersburg (d. Gasparyan in F)
- Reached two additional finals in 2021, at Birmingham (l. Jabeur) and San Jose (l. Collins)
- Highlight of truncated 2020 season was SF showing at Lyon (l. Friedsam) - her first run to the last four at a WTA event since lifting title at 2018 Moscow [500]
- Won consecutive matches only twice in difficult 2019 campaign, with best result a QF run at Beijing (l. Wozniacki) and St. Petersburg (l. Zvonareva)
- Ended 2018 season by lifting her second WTA singles title at Moscow [500] (d. Jabeur in F); broke into Top 10 following the tournament, on October 22, 2018
- Also finished R-Up at 2018 Dubai (l. Svitolina) and 2018 Indian Wells (l. Osaka); Indian Wells was biggest final of career having upset No.2 Caroline Wozniacki, No.10 Angelique Kerber and No.8 Venus Williams en route
- Made Top 20 debut on February 26, 2018, following R-Up finish at Dubai (d. No.3 Muguruza, l. Svitolina)
- Made first Grand Slam QFs at 2018 Roland Garros (l. Stephens) and 2018 Wimbledon (l. Kerber) and qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- Upset No.1 Caroline Wozniacki during SF run at 2018 St. Petersburg
- Captured maiden WTA singles title in debut final at 2017 Charleston, defeating fellow teenager

- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team 2018-20
- Won 2017 Australian Open girls' singles title (d. Masarova in F) and ITF Junior Masters event in Chengdu, China in October 2017; rose as high as No.3 in junior rankings in June 2017
- Played first professional event at \$10k ITF/Kharkhiv-UKR in August 2016 (fell in 1r)

- Jelena Ostapenko in the final - the first all-teenage final on tour since 2009 Linz (Wickmayer d. Kvitova)
- Also in 2017 reached final at Moscow (L. Goerges) and QF at Sydney, Doha and Beijing
- Ended 2016 as the highest-ranked teenager on tour, at No.27, after a campaign in which she reached SF, at St. Petersburg and QF at Indian Wells, Charleston, Montreal, Rio Olympics and Moscow. Made Top 50 debut on February 15, 2016 following St. Petersburg run
- Upset No.7 Venus Williams in opening match of 2016 season at Auckland to register first Top 10 win of career
- Reached first WTA SF at 2015 Moscow (as qualifier, L. Pavlyuchenkova) recorded first Top-20 win over No.14 Suarez Navarro in QF; following the tournament made Top-100 debut at No.73 (October 26, 2015)
- Reached 3r at 2015 US Open (as LL, L. Mladenovic) on Grand Slam debut (main draw and qualifying). reached QF at Bad Gastein (as qualifier, L. Errani)
- Also in 2015, won maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Moscow (w/Vesnina), lifted five singles titles on ITF Circuit and was nominated for WTA Newcomer of the Year in 2015
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2014 Moscow (as WC, L. Riske)
- Made professional debut at in qualifying debut at 2013 Moscow
- Owns seven titles on ITF circuit

OTHER INFORMATION

- Currently coached by Sandra Zaniewska. Previously coached by Andrea Volpini. Consistently works with her mother Talina (a former professional)
- Currently trains in both Monaco and Kiev
- Father is Oleg; has two sisters, Zoryana and Mariya. Began playing tennis at age five
- One of first coaches was her uncle Taras Beyko, a respected player for the USSR and Ukraine in the late 1980s and early 1990s
- Currently managed by former ATP player Ivan Ljubicic
- Favorite shot is her serve

- Coached by Flavio Cipolla
- Parents are Sergey and Tatiana; brother is Alexsandr, who also serves as her fitness trainer; introduced to tennis by brother at age 6
- Baseline player whose favorite surface is clay; favorite shot is forehand
- Loves soccer (favorite team is FC Barcelona)
- Best tennis memory is winning Roland Garros juniors and 2015 US Open run
