MATCH NOTES – DAY 7 – SATURDAY, AUGUST 2

[28] McCartney Kessler (USA #32) vs. [24] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #28) Kostyuk leads 1-0

Kessler:

- Making main draw debut at this tournament
- Defeated Maya Joint and Mirra Andreeva so far this week to reach her first 4r since her Champion run at Nottingham 2025 (d. Dayana Yastremska in F)
- Has won six consecutive matches against Top 50 opponents, winning the first set in five of the six
- Is currently ranked No.32; this time last year was ranked No.115

Kostyuk:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at this tournament, where she has surpassed her previous best result of reaching 3r in 2024
- Has beaten Marketa Vondrousova and Daria Kasatkina so far this week, both in three sets. Last time she won three consecutive matches that went to a decider was at Stuttgart in 2024
- Looking to advance to her third QF of 2025 (Madrid and Doha)
- Owns one career Tour-level hard court title: Austin in 2023

[9] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #12) vs. [30] Dayana Yastremska (UKR #35) Rybakina leads 1-0

Rybakina:

- Has reached the R16 at the Canadian Open for the second time in her career after having reached SF in 2023 (Montreal)
- One of three players who can reach the QFs at the Canadian Open held in Montréal for consecutive editions (2023 and 2025), along with Iga Swiatek and Coco Gauff
- Has has a 6-3 career record at the Canadian Open, however she is 5-2 in Montréal and 1-1 in Toronto
- Only Aryna Sabalenka, Iga Swiatek (10 each) and Mirra Andreeva (8) have made more WTA level quarterfinals so far in 2025 than Elena Rybakina (7, excluding the United Cup) - she already made two in WTA-1000, in Dubai and Doha
- Owns the most aces served so far in WTA-1000 events this season (102)

Yastremska:

- Seeking her first win against Rybakina: lost only previous career meeting against her at the Australian Open this season in the Third Round
- Has equaled her best career result at the Canadian Open by reaching the Round of 16, after 2019 in Toronto (defeated by Sofia Kenin)
- Searching to equal her best career result in a single WTA-1000 event after having reached the quarter-finals in Wuhan in 2019 (lost to Petra Kvitová)

- After having defeated Emma Navarro in 3r, Dayana Yastremska could make multiple Top 20 wins in a single tournament for the second time in her career after Adelaide 2020 (Angelique Kerber, Donna Vekic and Aryna Sabalenka)

[1] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. [WC] Victoria Mboko (CAN #85)**Gauff leads 1-0****Gauff:**

- Making 5th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was reaching QF in 2023 (l. eventual champion - Jessica Pegula), 2022 (l. eventual champion - Simona Halep) and 2021 (l. eventual champion - Camila Giorgi)
- After 1r bye, has defeated Danielle Collins and Veronika Kudermetova so far this week. Both matches lasted over 2 hours and 30 minutes
- Owns 6-0 career record against players from Canada, with record in 2025 standing at 3-0 (including United Cup)
- Looking to become the first No.1 seed to win this tournament since Simona Halep in 2018

Mboko:

- Making main draw debut at this tournament
- Defeated Kimberly Birrell, Sofia Kenin and Marie Bouzkova so far this week to reach her second Round of 16 in her Tour-level career after also doing so last week at Washington D.C.
- Looking to become the first Canadian to advance to the QF at this tournament since Bianca Andreescu's Champion run in 2019
- Since 1990, she could become the third Canadian teenager to defeat multiple Grand Slam champions at a single WTA-level event after Bianca Andreescu (Auckland, Indian Wells, US Open 2019) and Leylah Fernandez (US Open 2021)

Lin Zhu (CHN #493) vs. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #51)**First Career Meeting****Zhu:**

- First Chinese player to reach the Women's Singles R16 at the Canadian Open since Qinwen Zheng in 2022 (QF) and the first when the tournament was held in Montréal since Na Li in 2012
- Could become the third Chinese player to reach the QFs at the Canadian Open held in Montréal in the Open Era after Jie Zheng (2010) and Na Li (2012)
- Has reached her first career R16 in a WTA-1000 event: she previously lost all her first four Round of 32 in such events (Beijing 2014, Dubai 2019, Guadalajara 2022 and Doha 2024)
- Could become the lowest ranked quarterfinalist in a WTA-1000 event (World No. 493) since Shuai Zhang in Beijing 2024 (#595) and the lowest at the Canadian Open since Sloane Stephens in 2017 (#934)

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making her first career appearance at Montreal
- Has made her first career R16 in a WTA-1000 event
- Looking to equal her best career result in a single WTA level event by reaching the quarter-finals (also in Guangzhou 2024, Rouen and Rabat this season)

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2024 saw a breakthrough year, making her Tour-level main draw debut at Auckland (as a qualifier, l. Lulu Sun), winning her first Tour-level main draw match at the Australian Open and claiming her maiden title at Cleveland. She also claimed her first WTA 125 title at Puerto Vallarta and entered the Top 100 for the first time, peaking at No.63 on August 26, 2024.
- Reached WTA 125 series QF at Angers in 2023 (l. Yastremska)
- Lifted first ITF title in 2023 at Rome \$60K
- Played first Tour level matches as a wild card at 2023 US Open, where she won two qualifying matches before falling in the third and failed to make the main draw
- Reached first ITF final in 2021 at Lubbock \$15K
- Made ITF debut in 2016 at Charleston \$10K at the age of 17

- Reached two WTA 500 finals in 2024 at San Diego and Stuttgart finishing runner-up at both. Also made first Grand Slam quarterfinal at Australian Open and first WTA 1000 semifinal at Indian Wells.
- Earned five Top 10 wins in 2024, entered the year with only three in career and made Top 20 debut on May 6, 2024 finishing the year at No.18
- In 2023, won maiden singles title at Austin (d. Gracheva) and doubles title at Birmingham (w/Krejciikova).

Reached QF at two WTA 500 events; Adelaide 1 (l. Jabeur) and Washington (l. Samsonova). Achieved a peak singles ranking of No. 32 on August 7, 2023 and No. 27 in doubles on May 8, 2023

- Best result of 2022 was SF showing at Granby (l. Saville). Also made 3r at Australian Open and Eastbourne
- Highlights of second half of 2021 were QF at Chicago [250] (l. Gracheva) and SF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Halep); broke into Top 50 on November 1, 2021, after Cluj-Napoca
- On clay, enjoyed career-best R16 run at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) and advanced to SF at Istanbul (l. eventual champion Cirstea)
- Opened 2021 by reaching first career WTA SF, at Abu Dhabi (l. Kudermetova)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.97 on November 2, 2020, after reaching back-to-back finals on ITF Circuit in US
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s)
- In February 2020, picked up third ITF singles title of career, at a \$60k event in Cairo
- Season highlight in 2019 was reaching first WTA QF, at Strasbourg (l. Garcia)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Australian Open and reached 3r, having received a WC into the qualifying event by virtue of winning the junior title there in 2017 (d. Masarova in F). Was first player born in 2002 to play in a Grand Slam main draw. Was also youngest player to reach the 3r at a major since 1997 US Open when Mirjana Lucic-Baroni (15 years, 182 days) reached this stage
- Scored two Top 50 wins in 2018, over No.27 Peng (Australian Open), No.26 Gavrilova (Fed Cup)
- Won first ITF Circuit title of career at \$25k ITF/Dunakeszi-HUN in 2017 (d. Pera in F)
- Played first WTA qualifying at 2017 Mallorca (l. Kalinskaya in 1r)

- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team 2018-20
- Won 2017 Australian Open girls' singles title (d. Masarova in F) and ITF Junior Masters event in Chengdu, China in October 2017; rose as high as No.3 in junior rankings in June 2017
- Played first professional event at \$10k ITF/Kharkhiv-UKR in August 2016 (fell in 1r)

- Coached by McClain Kessler

- Currently coached by Sandra Zaniewska. Previously coached by Andrea Volpini. Consistently works with her mother Talina (a former professional)
- Currently trains in both Monaco and Kiev
- Father is Oleg; has two sisters, Zoryana and Mariya. Began playing tennis at age five
- One of first coaches was her uncle Taras Beyko, a respected player for the USSR and Ukraine in the late 1980s and early 1990s
- Currently managed by former ATP player Ivan Ljubicic
- Favorite shot is her serve
