[13] Liudmila Samsonova (#16) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #49)

Series tied 2-2

Samsonova:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was a R-Up finish in 2023 (l. Jessica Pegula)
- Third head-to-head meeting against Osaka in 2025 (1-1 in previous two), winning their most recent match at Berlin
- Seeking 70th career win against a Top 50 player, her most recent such victory came against No.18 Daria Kasatkina at Wimbledon 2025
- Owns three hard court titles (all coming in 2022): Cleveland, Tokyo and Washington D.C.

Osaka:

- Making 6th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was reaching QF in 2019 (l. Serena Williams)
- Has beaten Ariana Arseneault so far this week, improving to 11-5 on hard court in 2025. She is 6-2 in her last eight such matches
- Is 2-0 in hard court matches against Samsonova (Miami 2025 and Indian Wells 2024)
- Owns 40 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.20 Karolina Muchova at Australian Open 2025
- Is currently ranked No.49; this time last year was ranked No.100

[Q] Hanyu Guo (CHN #259) vs. [2] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

First meeting

Guo:

- Making main draw debut at this tournament; appearing at a WTA-1000 main draw for the first time in her career
- Has beaten Yulia Putintseva so far this week; first career win in a Tour-level main draw
- Fourth time in her career playing a Top 50 opponent (1-2 in previous three)
- Third career Tour-level match against a seeded opponent (l. Saisai Zheng at Guangzhou in 2018, l. Shuai Peng at Tianjin in 2017)

Swiatek:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was reaching SF in 2023 (l. eventual champion - Jessica Pegula)
- Including unranked players, has a 20-1 career record at WTA level main draws against opponents ranked outside the top-200 of the WTA Rankings - only losing to Ana Konjuh in Miami 2021

- Her 17 WTA 1000 main draw wins in 2025 are third-most on Tour, trailing only Aryna Sabalenka (21) and Mirra Andrejeva (21)
- Since 2019, when she made her debut in WTA-1000 events, she has claimed the most wins in such events (114, two more than the second-best Aryna Sabalenka)

Maria Sakkari (GRE #72) vs. [3] Jessica Pegula (USA #4)

Pegula leads 6-5

Sakkari:

- Making 6th main draw appearance at this tournament, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2022 and 2021
- Has beaten Carson Branstine so far this week, her third win in her last four hard court matches
- Owns 28 wins in her career over Top 10 players, winning her most recent match against a Top 10 opponent at Madrid against No.6 Jasmine Paolini
- Should she defeat Pegula, it would mark the first time she has won consecutive matches versus Top 10 players since winning three straight at WTA Finals 2022 in Fort Worth

Pegula:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at this tournament, where she is the two-time defending champion
- Seeking to become the second player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open in three consecutive seasons, after Monica Seles (four in a row 1995 and 1998)
- Sakkari becomes the opponent Pegula has faced the most in WTA level main draws in her career (12, surpassing Iga Swiatek with 11)
- Her six WTA level main draw wins against Sakkari are the second-most she has against a single opponent in her career, trailing only Camila Giorgi (seven)

[17] Belinda Bencic (SUI #20) v. [WC] Eugenie Bouchard (CAN)

Bencic leads 3-0

Bencic:

- Making 5th appearance at Rogers Cup (2nd appearance in Montreal) , where she won Toronto in 2025 (d. Halep in F)
- Owns two singles titles at WTA 1000 events (Toronto 2015 and Dubai 2019)
- Owns 7-2 career record against players from Canada (0-0 in 2025), having played and defeated today's opponent Bouchard in all their previous three meetings, including Rogers Cup 2015 in Toronto
- Including Toronto 2015, owns 7 singles titles on total on hard court, most recently Abu Dhabi 2025

Bouchard:

- Announced she plans to retire from professional tennis following this event
- Has beaten Emiliana Arango in 1r, first tour-level win since Guadalajara 2023 (d. Zaraza in 1r)
- Owns 18 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.2 Angelique Kerber at Madrid 2017
- Looking to end her 3-match losing streak against today's opponent Bencic a 5-time WTA singles finalist on hard court (2013 Osaka, 2014 Wuhan, 2016 Hobart, 2016 Kuala Lumpur and 2021 Guadalajara)

First meeting

Rakhimova:

- Making main draw debut appearance here, as a qualifier
- Defeated Australia's Astra Sharma in qualifying to advance to the main draw; has beaten Kayla Cross to score her first main-draw win at Rogers Cup
- Owns 2 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.5 Jasmine Paolini at Wimbledon 2025
- Is currently ranked No.66, six spots shy of her career-high; this time last year was ranked No.105

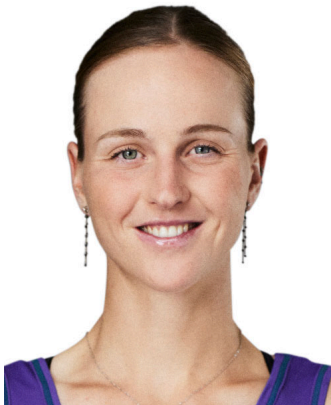
Svitolina:

- Making 9th appearance at Rogers Cup, where her previous best result was champion run in 2017 (d. Wozanicki in F), which is also Ukraine's best result
- In addition, made SF in 2018 (at Montreal, l. Stephens)
- After 1r bye, faces No.62 Kamilla Rakhimova in 2r today; record against opponents outside No.50 stands at 19-1 in 2025, with the sole loss to No. 83 Blinkova at Linz
- Owns 11 singles titles on hard court, most recently Chicago 2021
- Has won 30 matches so far in 2025

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024, won one title at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Andreescu in final); also reached SF at Abu Dhabi (l. eventual champion Rybakina); notably reached the QF at Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and 4r at US Open (l. Swiatek)
- Won one doubles title in 2024 at Seoul (w/ partner Melichar-Martinez)

Ended 2023 ranked No.16; reached three finals at Abu Dhabi (l. Bencic in F), Montreal (l. Pegula in F) and Beijing (l. Swiatek)

- Also in 2023, reached SF at Washington DC and qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- In doubles in 2023, won title at Dubai w/Veronika Kudermetova
- Lifted three titles in 2022, at Washington DC (d. Kanepi in F), Cleveland (d. Sasnovich in F) and Tokyo (d. Q.Zheng in F) ending year at No.20, her first Top 20 year-end ranking
- Also made SF at Stuttgart, QF at Adelaide 250, R16 at US Open and made Top-20 debut on October 24
- Earned first Top 10 win of career over No.7 Karolina Pliskova at Stuttgart
- Highlight of 2021 was coming through qualifying to lift maiden WTA title at Berlin (d. Bencic in F) and breaking into Top 50 on September 13 finishing the year at No.39, her first year-end Top 100 ranking
- Reached two further SFs in 2021, at Luxembourg and Courmayeur and reached R16 at Wimbledon
- Earned first Top 20 win of career over No.11 Kiki Bertens at 2021 Miami
- In 2020 reached 2r at Brisbane (as qualifier, d.No.24 Stephens, l. No.7 Kvitova) and Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic), and fell 1r four times (including Australian Open, US Open and Roland Garros)
- Appeared in the first WTA main draws of her career in 2019, highlighted by SF run at Palermo (as LL, l. eventual champion Teichmann), 2r showing at Lausanne (l. Han) and falling 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Vekic)
- Contested qualifying at a WTA event for the first time at 2019 Australian Open
- Made professional debut on ITF circuit in 2013; owns four singles titles on the ITF Circuit

- Returned to play in 2024 following maternity leave and reached the QF at Doha and 's-Hertogenbosch, as well as R16 at Rome and Beijing
- Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023

In 2022 had success at Miami, where she fell to Swiatek in the final, her first final since the 2021 Australian Open. Also reached the semifinals at Melbourne 250 #1 (withdrew before semifinal with Kudermetova w/abdominal injury)

- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era
- At 2020 US Open, came from a set and a break down to Azarenka and win third Grand Slam title of career
- Also last season was R-Up at Western & Southern Open - withdrew w/left hamstring injury before final against Azarenka
- Won second Grand Slam at Australian Open (d. Kvitova in F); became first Japanese player to reach World No.1 ranking following the tournament
- In addition, won back-to-back titles for first time in her career at Osaka (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and Beijing (d. Barty in F); defeated No.1 Barty in Beijing final for second career victory over world No.1 (also beat Halep at 2018 Indian Wells)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2018, posting a 40-20 record resulting in a No.5 (first Top 10 season), up from No.68 in 2017
- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated five-time major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16
- Reached one further final in 2018, at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (19y, 122d)

- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 5 win of career when she defeated No.5 V.Williams at 2017 Hong Kong. Upset win over defending champion and No.6-ranked Kerber at 2017 US Open marked first career Top 10 win
- Voted 2016 WTA Newcomer of the Year; highlight was career-first WTA final at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Wozniacki). Also reached QF on three occasions and 3r at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open
- Ranked No.406, made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Stanford. As an alternate, won through qualifying (achieving first WTA qualifying wins), and came from match point down to shock No.19 Stosur in 1r of main draw, before losing to No.18 Petkovic in 2r
- Made WTA qualifying debut at Quebec City in 2013 (l. Dabrowski)

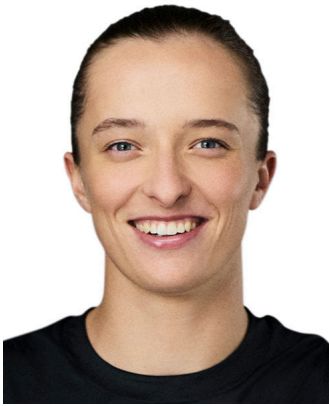

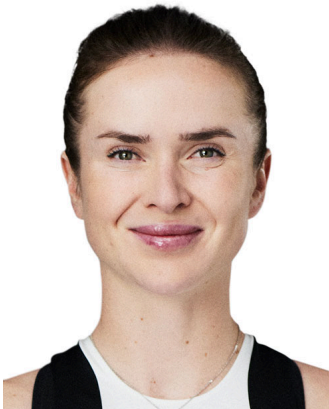
