Rybakina leads 2-1

Kostyuk:

- Making 3rd appearance at this tournament and is into QF for 1st time; her previous tournament-best result was making R16 last year (I. Navarro)
- This is her 3rd tour-level QF of the year; all of her QFs in 2025 have been at WTA 1000 events (also posted QF finishes at Doha and Madrid)
- Contesting 36th career WTA 1000 main draw; aiming to reach her 2nd career WTA 1000 SF after 2024 Indian Wells
- Owns 13 tour-level wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.18 Daria Kasatkina earlier in this event
- Owns the most forehand winners made in WTA 1000 events this season (339)
- Entered this week having lost 6-straight matches

Rybakina:

- Making 4th appearance at this tournament; her previous and career-best tournament showing is the 2023 SF
- So far, Rybakina is 5-1 during this year's North American summer hard-court swing (also made Washington SF, I. eventual champion Fernandez in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Contesting her 38th career WTA 1000 main draw; she has won 2 WTA 1000 titles (2023 Indian Wells and 2023 Rome)
- 4 of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2020 Hobart, 2023 Indian Wells, 2024 Brisbane and 2024 Abu Dhabi)
- Leads the Tour in Aces served (295) this year, including 19 aces this week

First meeting

Mboko:

- Making main-draw debut at this tournament
- Has reached the first tour-level QF of her career, in just her 3rd career WTA 1000 main-draw appearance
- Her fourth-round victory over World No.2 Coco Gauff was her first career Top 10 win in 3 attempts
- 18-year-old Mboko is the youngest women's quarterfinalist at this tournament since Gauff in 2022, and the youngest Canadian women's quarterfinalist at this tournament since Helen Kelesi in 1987
- She is the first Canadian woman to make QF at this tournament since Bianca Andreescu's 2019 run to the title
- Looking to become youngest woman to reach this tournament's SF since Belinda Bencic's title-winning run in 2015

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 1st appearance at this tournament
- Is into her first career WTA 1000 QF and 4th tour-level QF overall; she is seeking her first Hologic WTA Tour SF at any tournament tier (0-3 in previous tour-level QFs)
- In tour-level main-draw matches this year, Bouzas Maneiro is 10-3 vs. players ranked outside the Top 75
- She is the first Spanish woman to reach the QF at this tournament since Sara Sorribes Tormo in 2021
- Trying to become the first Spanish woman to reach the SF at this tournament in 25 years, since both Arantxa Sanchez Vicario and Conchita Martinez made the 2000 semifinals

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached two WTA 500 finals in 2024 at San Diego and Stuttgart finishing runner-up at both. Also made first Grand Slam quarterfinal at Australian Open and first WTA 1000 semifinal at Indian Wells.
- Earned five Top 10 wins in 2024, entered the year with only three in career and made Top 20 debut on May 6, 2024 finishing the year at No.18
- In 2023, won maiden singles title at Austin (d. Gracheva) and doubles title at Birmingham (w/Krejcikova).

Reached QF at two WTA 500 events; Adelaide 1 (l. Jabeur) and Washington (l. Samsonova). Achieved a peak singles ranking of No. 32 on August 7, 2023 and No. 27 in doubles on May 8, 2023

- Best result of 2022 was SF showing at Granby (l. Saville). Also made 3r at Australian Open and Eastbourne
- Highlights of second half of 2021 were QF at Chicago [250] (l. Gracheva) and SF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Halep); broke into Top 50 on November 1, 2021, after Cluj-Napoca
- On clay, enjoyed career-best R16 run at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) and advanced to SF at Istanbul (l. eventual champion Cirstea)
- Opened 2021 by reaching first career WTA SF, at Abu Dhabi (l. Kudermetova)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.97 on November 2, 2020, after reaching back-to-back finals on ITF Circuit in US
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s)
- In February 2020, picked up third ITF singles title of career, at a \$60k event in Cairo
- Season highlight in 2019 was reaching first WTA QF, at Strasbourg (l. Garcia)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018
 Australian Open and reached 3r, having received
 a WC into the qualifying event by virtue of
 winning the junior title there in 2017 (d.
 Masarova in F). Was first player born in 2002 to
 play in a Grand Slam main draw. Was also
 youngest player to reach the 3r at a major since
 1997 US Open when Mirjana Lucic-Baroni (15
 years, 182 days) reached this stage
- Scored two Top 50 wins in 2018, over No.27 Peng (Australian Open), No.26 Gavrilova (Fed Cup)
- Won first ITF Circuit title of career at \$25k ITF/Dunakeszi-HUN in 2017 (d. Pera in F)
- Played first WTA qualifying at 2017 Mallorca (l. Kalinskaya in 1r)

- Won three titles from five finals in 2024, tasting success at Brisbane, Abu Dhabi and Stuttgart and finishing R-Up at Doha and Miami. Qualified for her second WTA Finals and defeated WTA World No.1 Sabalenka in the group stage
- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023
 Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top 10 debut following tournament (January 30,
 2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 title
 at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at
 Miami. Qualified for first WTA Finals, going 1-2 in
 group stage.
- Lifted maiden major at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F)
- In 2022 also finished R-Up at Adelaide (l. Barty) and Portoroz (l. Siniakova)
- Best result of 2021 were SFs at Eastbourne, Olympics and Chicago [500], and QFs at Abu Dhabi, Roland Garros, San Jose and Ostrava
- Opened 2020 season by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F)
- Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
- First win over a Top-5 ranked opponent came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
- Won back-to-back Slam matches for the first time during 3r showing at 2020 Australian Open (l. Barty)
- Won maiden WTA singles title at 2019 Bucharest (d. Tig in F), breaking into Top 100 for the first time in the following week's rankings at No.65 (July 22, 2019)
- Also in 2019, went on to make Top 50 debut on September 16, 2019, after reaching second career final at Nanchang (l. Peterson), produced SF appearances at Luxembourg and 's-Hertogenbosch, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros, falling 1r (as qualifier, l. Siniakova)
- Finished 2019 campaign with 57-21 win-loss record (across all levels) to end season at No.37, up from 2018's final ranking of No.191. On the ITF Circuit in 2019, lifted silverware on three occasions: back-to-back at \$25k Moscow-RUS and \$25k Kazan-RUS, and at \$60k ITF/Launceston-AUS
- Highlights of 2018 included reaching maiden WTA QF at St. Petersburg (l. Goerges) and

- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team 2018-20
- Won 2017 Australian Open girls' singles title (d. Masarova in F) and ITF Junior Masters event in Chengdu, China in October 2017; rose as high as No.3 in junior rankings in June 2017
- Played first professional event at \$10k ITF/Kharkhiv-UKR in August 2016 (fell in 1r)
- clinching title at \$15k ITF/Kazan-RUS
- First Top 10 win came over No.7 Garcia at 2018 St. Petersburg
- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2017 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Begu in 1r)
- Professional debut came at \$10k ITF/Antalya-TUR in 2014

 Consistently works with her mother Talina (a former professional)
- Currently trains in both Monaco and Kiev

- One of first coaches was her uncle Taras Beyko, a respected player for the USSR and Ukraine in the late 1980s and early 1990s
- Currently managed by former ATP player Ivan Ljubicic
- · Favorite shot is her serve

- Trained at Spartak Club in Moscow as a junior; previous coaches included Andrei Cheshnokov (Elena Vesnina's former coach) and Evgenia Kulikovskaya
- Nominated for 2019 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Started playing tennis aged five and favorite surface is hard
